[Teacher] Educator Support in the Structured Literacy Program.--(a) (1) It is the intent of the General 11 12 Assembly that [teachers] educators be equipped to facilitate 13 high-quality reading instruction grounded in structured literacy 14 and intervention services to address student reading needs. The program provided in this section will assist 15 (2)[participating] school entities in providing professional 16 17 development for [teachers] educators in foundational skills and 18 instructional interventions based on structured literacy and 19 providing opportunities for school personnel to serve as reading coaches to support [teachers] educators in delivering high-20 21 quality reading instruction. Beginning with the 2022-2023 school year, the 22 (b) (1) 23 department shall establish a program of professional development 24 and applied practice in structured literacy for school personnel 25 that includes in-class demonstration, modeling and coaching 26 support to improve reading and literacy outcomes. 27 (2) School personnel selected by the [participating] school 28 entity to serve as professional coaches for this program must 29 have at least five years of experience in teaching of reading 30 and be able to demonstrate their skills in the instruction of and intervention with students, including those with dyslexia 31 32 and other language-related disabilities. 33 The department may contract with multiple service (3) 34 providers, including school entities and institutions of higher 35 education with demonstrated experience in structured literacy, 36 to develop and implement the program so that experienced support 37 is available locally.

(4) A service provider, including a school entity or 1 2 approved educator preparation program that demonstrates successful implementation of literacy outcomes, is eligible to 3 provide professional development and onsite demonstration and 4 coaching support in the program. 5 A [participating] school entity shall adopt high-quality 6 (5) 7 instructional materials grounded in [scientific-based reading research] evidence-based reading instruction in accordance with 8 9 the State academic standards approved by the State Board of 10 Education. 11 (c) (1) The continuing professional education plan of each school entity shall satisfy the continuing education 12 requirements of 22 Pa. Code § 49.17 (relating to continuing 13 professional education), including training in structured 14 15 literacy for professional employes who hold instructional 16 certificates in early childhood, elementary-middle level, Special Education-PK-12, English as a second language and 17 reading specialist. To ensure that school personnel have the 18 knowledge and skill to teach all students to read, including 19 20 students with dyslexia and other language-based learning 21 disabilities, training shall address, but shall not be limited 22 to: 23 (i) Evidence-based intervention practices on structured 24 literacy. 25 (ii) Explicit and systematic instruction in phonological and 26 phonemic awareness. 27 (iii) The alphabetic principle, decoding and encoding, 28 fluency and vocabulary. 29 (iv) Reading comprehension and building content knowledge. 30 School employes required to undergo continuing (2) 31 professional education under section <u>1205.1</u>, 1205.2 or 1205.5 shall receive credit toward the school employe's continuing 32 33 professional education requirements [if the training program has 34 been approved by the department]. * * * 35 36 (g) As used in this section, the following words and phrases 37 shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection unless 38 the context clearly indicates otherwise: 39 "Approved educator preparation program." A sequence of courses and experiences offered by a preparing institution or 40 alternative provider that is reviewed and approved by the 41 42 department. 43 "Chief school administrator." The superintendent of a school 44 district, executive director of an intermediate unit, administrative director of an area career and technical school 45 or chief executive officer of a charter school, cyber charter 46 47 school or regional charter school. "Department." The Department of Education of the 48 49 Commonwealth. "Educator." As defined in section 1501-N. 50 "Evidence-based reading instruction." As defined in section 51

1501-N. 1 ["Participating school entity." A school entity that elects 2 to take part in the Structured Literacy Program.] 3 4 "School entity." A school district, intermediate unit, area career and technical school, charter school, cyber charter 5 school or regional charter school. 6 "Structured literacy." Systemic, explicit instruction that: 7 (1) provides a strong core of foundational skills in the 8 language systems of English; 9 (2) integrates listening, speaking, reading, spelling and 10 11 writing; and 12 (3) emphasizes the structure of language across the speech sound system, the writing system, the structure of sentences, 13 the meaningful parts of words, the relationship among words and 14 15 the organization of spoken and written discourse. 16 Section 2.
