AN ACT

Amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), entitled, as reenacted, "An act relating to alcoholic liquors, alcohol and 2 malt and brewed beverages; amending, revising, consolidating 3 and changing the laws relating thereto; regulating and restricting the manufacture, purchase, sale, possession, 5 consumption, importation, transportation, furnishing, holding 6 in bond, holding in storage, traffic in and use of alcoholic liquors, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages and the 7 8 persons engaged or employed therein; defining the powers and 9 duties of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board; providing 10 for the establishment and operation of State liquor stores, 11 for the payment of certain license fees to the respective 12 municipalities and townships, for the abatement of certain 13 nuisances and, in certain cases, for search and seizure 14 without warrant; prescribing penalties and forfeitures; 15 providing for local option, and repealing existing laws," 16 further providing for limited wineries. 17 18 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 19 hereby enacts as follows: 20 Section 1. Section 505.2(a) of the act of April 12, 1951 21 (P.L.90, No.21), known as the Liquor Code, reenacted and amended 22 June 29, 1987 (P.L.32, No.14), is amended by adding a paragraph 23 to read: Section 505.2. Limited Wineries. -- (a) In the interest of 24

promoting tourism and recreational development in Pennsylvania,

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- 1 holders of a limited winery license may:
- 2 * * *
- 3 (7) Sell malt and brewed beverages produced and manufactured
- 4 by an entity licensed in this Commonwealth under section 431(a)
- 5 on the licensed premises and at all satellite locations under
- 6 such conditions and regulations as the board may enforce to
- 7 <u>individuals for consumption off the licensed premises where sold</u>
- 8 in quantities of not more than one hundred ninety-two fluid
- 9 <u>ounces in a single sale to one person. The malt and brewed</u>
- 10 <u>beverages must be purchased from a licensed Pennsylvania</u>
- 11 manufacturer. For purposes of this section, holders of a limited
- 12 winery license will not be required to also hold a hotel,
- 13 restaurant or malt and brewed beverage retail license.

- 15 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
