AN ACT

Amending Titles 18 (Crimes and Offenses) and 75 (Vehicles) of 1 the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in nuisances, further 2 providing for the offense of scattering rubbish; in 3 registration of vehicles, further providing for acknowledgment of littering provisions; in licensing of drivers, further providing for acknowledgment of littering 5 provisions; and, in miscellaneous provisions, further 7 providing for the offense of depositing waste and other 8 material on highway, property or waters. The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 10 11 hereby enacts as follows: 12 Section 1. Section 6501(b)(1), (2), (3) and (4) of Title 18 13 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended and the subsection is amended by adding a paragraph to read: 14 15 § 6501. Scattering rubbish. * * * 16 17 (b) Penalty.--18 [A] Except as provided for in paragraph (1.1), a 19 person who violates subsection (a)(1) or (2) is quilty of a 20 [summary offense] misdemeanor of the third degree for the 21 first offense and upon conviction thereof shall be sentenced

to pay a fine of not less than [\$50] \$300 nor more than

[\$300] \$2,000 and be required to pick up litter or illegally

dumped trash for not less than five nor more than 30 hours to

be completed within six months, or to imprisonment for not

more than [90 days] one year, or both.

(1.1) A person who violates subsection (a) (1) or (2), in which the collective total weight of the discarded material is less than one pound, is guilty of a summary offense for the first offense and upon conviction thereof shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than \$50 nor more than \$300 or to imprisonment for not more than 90 days, or both.

- (2) A person who violates subsection (a) (1) or (2) is guilty of a misdemeanor of the [third] second degree for the second and subsequent offense and upon conviction thereof shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than [\$300] \$2,000 nor more than [\$1,000] \$5,000. The person also may be sentenced to imprisonment for not more than one year or be required to pick up litter or illegally dumped trash for not less than 30 nor more than 100 hours to be completed within [one year] two years.
- (3) A person who violates subsection (a)(3) is guilty of a misdemeanor of the second degree for the first offense and upon conviction thereof shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than \$500 nor more than [\$5,000] \$10,000. The person also may be sentenced to imprisonment or to performing a community service for a period not to exceed two years.
- (4) A person who violates subsection (a)(3) is guilty of a misdemeanor of the first degree for the second or subsequent offense and upon conviction thereof shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than \$1,000 nor more than

- 1 [\$10,000] \$20,000. The person also may be sentenced to
- 2 imprisonment or to performing a community service for a
- 3 period not to exceed five years.

- 8 On every vehicle registration card, the following statement
- 9 shall be printed immediately above or below the signature of the
- 10 applicant:
- I hereby acknowledge this day that I have received notice
- of the provisions of section 3709 of the Vehicle Code.
- 13 Also printed on the registration card shall be the following:
- 14 Section 3709 provides for a fine of up to [\$300] \$2,000
- for dropping, throwing or depositing, upon any highway,
- or upon any other public or private property without the
- 17 consent of the owner thereof or into or on the waters of
- this Commonwealth from a vehicle, any waste paper,
- sweepings, ashes, household waste, glass, metal, refuse
- or rubbish or any dangerous or detrimental substance, or
- 21 permitting any of the preceding without immediately
- removing such items or causing their removal.
- 23 For any violation of section 3709, I may be subject to a
- 24 fine of up to [\$300] \$2,000 upon conviction, including
- any violation resulting from the conduct of any other
- 26 persons operating, in possession of or present within
- 27 this vehicle with my permission, if I do not with
- reasonable certainty identify the driver of the vehicle
- at the time the violation occurred.

- On every application for a learner's permit or driver's
- 2 license, the following statement shall be printed immediately
- 3 above or below the signature of the applicant:
- I hereby acknowledge this day that I have received notice

- 7 Section 3709 provides for a fine of up to [\$300] \$2,000
- for dropping, throwing or depositing, upon any highway,
- 9 or upon any other public or private property without the
- 10 consent of the owner thereof or into or on the waters of
- this Commonwealth from a vehicle, any waste paper,
- sweepings, ashes, household waste, glass, metal, refuse
- or rubbish or any dangerous or detrimental substance, or
- 14 permitting any of the preceding without immediately
- 15 removing such items or causing their removal.
- 16 For any violation of section 3709, I may be subject to a
- fine of up to [\$300] \$2,000 upon conviction, including
- any violation resulting from the conduct of any other
- 19 persons present within any vehicle of which I am the
- 20 driver.
- 21 § 3709. Depositing waste and other material on highway,
- 22 property or waters.

- 24 (d) Penalty. -- Any person violating any of the provisions of
- 25 subsection (a) or (b) commits a summary offense and shall, upon
- 26 conviction, be sentenced to either or both of the following:
- 27 (1) To pay a fine of not more than:
- (i) [\$900] \$5,000 for a violation which occurs in an
- 29 easement purchased under the program established by
- 30 section 14.1 of the act of June 30, 1981 (P.L.128,

2	(ii) $[\$600]$ $\$3,000$ for a violation which occurs in
3	an agricultural security area as defined in section 3 of
4	the Agricultural Area Security Law; or
5	(iii) $[\$300]$ $\$2,000$ for a violation which occurs
6	anywhere else.

8	Section 3 This act shall take effect in six months
