## AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in preliminary provisions, further providing for special provisions applicable to limited school 6 years; and, in certification of teachers, further providing for substitute teaching permit for prospective teachers, for locally issued temporary certification for substitute 9 teachers and for permit for classroom monitors. 10 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 11 12 hereby enacts as follows: 13 Section 1. Section 129 of the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended to 15 read: Section 129. Special Provisions Applicable to Limited School 16 17 Years. -- Notwithstanding any provision of law or regulation to 18 the contrary, [for the 2021-2022 and 2022-2023 school years,] 19 if, in the judgment of a school employer, an emergency or shortage of day-to-day substitute teachers exists under 24 20

Pa.C.S. § 8346(b) (relating to termination of annuities), the

- 1 school employer may hire an annuitant, as defined in 24 Pa.C.S.
- 2 § 8102 (relating to definitions), regardless of whether the
- 3 school employer first attempts to secure nonretired personnel,
- 4 except that the school employer shall comply with section
- 5 1125.1(d)(2) by first offering the work to any certified
- 6 professional employe on a recall list. The provisions of 24
- 7 Pa.C.S. § 8346(b) regarding the continuation of annuity or
- 8 distributions to an annuitant who returns to school service
- 9 during an emergency shall apply to annuitants hired under this
- 10 section. Nothing under this section shall supersede or preempt a
- 11 provision of an existing collective bargaining agreement between
- 12 a school employer and an exclusive representative of the
- 13 employes under the act of July 23, 1970 (P.L.563, No.195), known
- 14 as the "Public Employe Relations Act."
- 15 Section 2. Section 1201.1(3) of the act is amended and the
- 16 section is amended by adding a paragraph to read:
- 17 Section 1201.1. Substitute Teaching Permit for Prospective
- 18 Teachers. -- An individual who does not hold a certificate under
- 19 section 1201 shall be eligible to teach as a substitute in a
- 20 school district, an area career and technical school or an
- 21 intermediate unit provided that:
- 22 \* \* \*
- 23 (3) An individual receiving a Substitute Teaching Permit for
- 24 Prospective Teachers may serve as a substitute teacher for no
- 25 more than ten (10) days per school year for a single
- 26 professional employe or temporary professional employe, provided
- 27 that the individual may serve as a substitute for multiple
- 28 professional employes or temporary professional employes for no
- 29 more than twenty (20) days per school year. [For the 2021-2022]
- 30 and 2022-2023] Subject to paragraph (3.1), for the 2023-2024,

- 1 2024-2025 and 2025-2026 school years, the number of days or
- 2 hours per school year for which an individual receiving a permit
- 3 under this section may serve as a substitute teacher shall not
- 4 be limited, except for an individual who is undertaking a
- 5 student teacher program as required under 22 Pa. Code §
- 6 354.25(f) (relating to preparation program curriculum) for
- 7 educator preparation programs.
- 8 (3.1) During an individual's student teacher program
- 9 required under 22 Pa. Code § 354.25(f) (relating to preparation
- 10 program curriculum) for educator preparation programs, the
- 11 individual may serve as a substitute teacher for no more than
- 12 ten (10) days in the individual's assigned classroom or
- 13 classrooms or for other teachers within the building or
- 14 buildings in which the individual has been placed as a student
- 15 <u>teacher</u>.

- 17 Section 3. Sections 1215 and 1218(e), (f) and (g) of the act <--
- 18 are amended to read:
- 19 SECTION 3. SECTION 1215 OF THE ACT IS AMENDED TO READ: <--
- 20 Section 1215. Locally Issued Temporary Certification for
- 21 Substitute Teachers. -- A temporary substitute teacher certificate
- 22 may be issued by a public school entity to an individual who
- 23 presents a letter from a college or university verifying that
- 24 the individual has completed an approved teacher preparation
- 25 program, has successfully completed the certification testing
- 26 requirements or is in the process of scheduling the required
- 27 certification testing and has completed all requirements for the
- 28 awarding of a bachelor's degree on a date certain. The temporary
- 29 substitute teacher certificate shall only be used for day-to-day
- 30 assignments and shall expire upon the termination of any summer

- 1 school conducted in the summer which follows the date of
- 2 issuance or upon the receipt of Instructional I certification by
- 3 the individual. [For the 2021-2022 and 2022-2023 school years,
- 4 the] <u>The</u> temporary substitute teacher certificate issued under
- 5 this section may be used for assignments of more than twenty
- 6 (20) consecutive days to fill a position due to the absence of
- 7 professional certified personnel.
- 8 Section 1218. Permit for Classroom Monitors. \* \* \*
- 9 (e) Each school entity shall report to the department the

- 10 following by March 31, [2023] 2026:
- 11 (1) The number of individuals who served as classroom
- 12 monitors under this section and the number of days on which the-
- 13 school entity used the services of classroom monitors.
- 14 (2) The school entity's day to day substitute teacher
- 15 compensation rates in each of the school years from 2020-2021[7-
- 17 school entity that uses a third-party entity to provide-
- 18 substitute teachers, the rate reported by the school entity
- 19 shall be the take-home amount received by an individual,
- 20 excluding the portion paid to the third party entity. The
- 21 department shall issue rules necessary to effectuate this
- 22 subsection.
- 23 (f) By April 15, [2023] <u>2026</u>, the department shall issue a
- 24 report on the effectiveness of the classroom monitor permit and
- 25 recommendations for improvement or continuation of the permit.

- 28 evaluation of the permit and its effectiveness by an independent-

- 16 SCHOOL YEARS. FOR A SCHOOL ENTITY THAT USES A THIRD-PARTY ENTITY

- 18 ENTITY SHALL BE THE TAKE-HOME AMOUNT RECEIVED BY AN INDIVIDUAL,
- 19 EXCLUDING THE PORTION PAID TO THE THIRD-PARTY ENTITY. THE
- 20 DEPARTMENT SHALL ISSUE RULES NECESSARY TO EFFECTUATE THIS
- 21 SUBSECTION.
- (F) BY APRIL 15, 2023, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ISSUE A REPORT
- 23 ON THE EFFECTIVENESS OF THE CLASSROOM MONITOR PERMIT AND
- 24 RECOMMENDATIONS FOR IMPROVEMENT OR CONTINUATION OF THE PERMIT.
- 25 THE REPORT SHALL INCLUDE, BUT NOT BE LIMITED TO, THE INFORMATION
- 26 REPORTED TO THE DEPARTMENT UNDER SUBSECTION (E) AND A FORMAL
- 27 EVALUATION OF THE PERMIT AND ITS EFFECTIVENESS BY AN INDEPENDENT
- 28 RESEARCH ORGANIZATION WHICH MAY INCLUDE A COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY
- 29 ACCREDITED BY A REGIONAL ACCREDITING AGENCY. THE REPORT SHALL BE
- 30 SUBMITTED TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY AND THE STATE BOARD AND SHALL

- 1 (G) THIS SECTION SHALL EXPIRE ON JUNE 30, 2026.
- 2 Section 4 6. This act shall take effect immediately. <--
