## A RESOLUTION

Commemorating the 270 th anniversary of the Augustus Lutheran Church building.

WHEREAS, In 1717, the predominantly German settlement of
Providence developed in Montgomery County along the trail of the Perkiomen Creek; and

WHEREAS, Lutherans in early Providence worshiped under the care of itinerant preachers until the 1730's; and

WHEREAS, In 1743, led by the permanent Pastor Reverend Henry Melchior Muhlenberg, the congregation of the Augustus Lutheran Church began building the Old Trappe Church using native stone and materials gathered by hand; and

WHEREAS, In September 1743, the first services were held in the Old Trappe Church which is now known as the Augustus Lutheran Church building; and

WHEREAS, In October 1746, the Old Trappe Church was
dedicated; and
WHEREAS, The Augustus Lutheran Church building stands today as a testament to the hard work and dedication of its original congregation; and

WHEREAS, The Augustus Lutheran Church building is the oldest unchanged Lutheran Church building in continuous use in the United States, still holding services through the summer and on Christmas Eve; and WHEREAS, The National Park Service placed the Augustus Lutheran Church building on the National Register of Historic Places on December 24, 1967; therefore be it RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives commemorate the Augustus Lutheran Church building upon its 270 th anniversary.
