A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing the year 2013 as "The Year of Religious Diversity" 2 in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, William Penn, a devout Quaker, offered Pennsylvania
- 4 as a "Holy Experiment," where all would be free to practice
- 5 their religion in whatever manner they saw fit; and
- 6 WHEREAS, William Penn's Declaration of Rights in 1677 assured
- 7 that "no man can of right be compelled to attend, erect, or
- 8 support any place of worship, or to maintain any ministry
- 9 against his consent"; and
- 10 WHEREAS, In order to assure that government would abstain
- 11 from favoring one religion over another, William Penn also
- 12 declared that "no preference shall ever be given by law to any
- 13 religious establishment or modes of worship"; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania's Benjamin Franklin welcomed all
- 15 religions, donated funds to the construction of their churches,
- 16 meeting houses and synagogues and further promoted the

- 1 construction of an auditorium where all would be welcome to
- 2 preach, including Muslims; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania is now home to Christians, including
- 4 many Catholic, Orthodox and Protestant denominations; Quakers;
- 5 Jews of Orthodox, Conservative, Reconstructionist and Reformed
- 6 congregations; Mormons; Muslims of Shia, Sunni, Sufi and others;
- 7 Unitarians; Buddhists; Hindus; Sikhs; Taoists; and other
- 8 religious traditions, as well as many who claim no religious
- 9 affiliation and nonbelievers; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Among the religious traditions practiced in
- 11 Pennsylvania, there are many sacred or holy texts, such as the
- 12 books of the Bible, Talmud, Koran, Book of Mormon, Veda,
- 13 Upanishads, Bhagavad Gita, The Four Books and Five Classics of
- 14 Confucius, Tao-te-ching (The Way and Its Power), Tipitaka and
- 15 others; and
- 16 WHEREAS, These revered books impart great wisdom and beauty
- 17 to believers and are appreciated and respected by nonbelievers
- 18 as well; therefore be it
- 19 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize and
- 20 celebrate the religious diversity encompassed by Pennsylvania as
- 21 a fulfillment of the vision of William Penn; and be it further
- 22 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
- 23 year 2013 as "The Year of Religious Diversity" throughout this
- 24 Commonwealth and continue to welcome all to Pennsylvania in the
- 25 spirit of our founder.
