AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in reimbursements by Commonwealth and between school districts, further providing for advanced 5 6 placement and international baccalaureate exam fees and 7 providing for advanced course fee assistance. 9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 10 hereby enacts as follows: 11 Section 1. Section 2599.8(a) of the act of March 10, 1949 12 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is 13 amended to read: 14 Section 2599.8. Advanced Placement and International 15 [Commencing with] For the 2019-Baccalaureate Exam Fees. -- (a) 16 2020 school year through the 2023-2024 school year, the 17 Department of Education shall provide advanced placement and 18 International Baccalaureate exam fee assistance to students with 19 financial need.

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- 1 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 2 Section 2599.9. Advanced Course Fee Assistance.--(a)
- 3 Commencing with the 2024-2025 school year, the department shall
- 4 provide advanced course exam fee assistance to each student.
- 5 (b) The exam fee assistance provided by the department shall
- 6 cover eighty percent (80%) of the exam fee for each student.
- 7 (c) The school entity shall cover the remaining twenty
- 8 percent (20%) of the exam fee for each student with financial
- 9 <u>need and may cover some or all of the remaining twenty percent</u>
- 10 (20%) of the exam fee for each student without financial need.
- 11 The school entity may use Federal funds to cover the school
- 12 <u>entity's portion of the exam fee.</u>
- 13 (c.1) The per-exam cost charged to students for an exam
- 14 shall not exceed the rate paid by students with financial need
- 15 for advanced course exams during the 2018-2019 school year.
- 16 (d) The exam fee assistance shall only be provided to
- 17 students who complete an advanced course and choose to take an
- 18 exam for that course.
- 19 (e) As used in this section, the following words and phrases
- 20 <u>shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection unless</u>
- 21 the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 22 <u>"Advanced course." An academically rigorous college-level</u>
- 23 course delivered to high school students by an educator that
- 24 <u>includes an end-of-course examination that qualifies students to</u>
- 25 earn college credit for prior learning.
- 26 "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 27 Commonwealth.
- 28 "Exam fee." The amount required to take an exam to receive
- 29 credit for an advanced course.
- 30 "School entity." Any of the following which operate within

- 1 <u>this Commonwealth:</u>
- 2 <u>(1) A public school.</u>
- 3 (2) An intermediate unit.
- 4 (3) An area career and technical school.
- 5 <u>"Student with financial need." A student who:</u>
- 6 (1) has an annual household income no greater than one
- 7 <u>hundred eighty-five percent (185%) of the Federal poverty level;</u>
- 8 (2) is in foster care, homeless or a migrant; or
- 9 (3) lives in a household that received benefits under the
- 10 <u>Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program or Temporary</u>
- 11 <u>Assistance for Needy Families Program.</u>
- 12 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
