#### **SUMMARY**:

House Bill 470 amends the Judicial Code concerning the supervisory relationship between probation officers and offenders. It would take effect in 60 days.

#### **ANALYSIS**:

House Bill 470 amends the Judicial Code to permit a court to order searches of offenders on probation without suspicion as a condition of the offender's probation. Defendants must be advised of this condition at sentencing. Such an order by the court would then allow a probation officer to search the person or property of someone under the officer's supervision for possession of contraband or to ensure compliance with the terms and conditions of probation.

### FISCAL IMPACT:

Enactment of this legislation will have no adverse impact on Commonwealth funds.
