SUMMARY: Amends the Osteopathic Medical Practice Act to allow a supervising physician and physician assistant to utilize a designee for processing the written agreement with the licensing board. This legislation would take effect in 30 days.

ANALYSIS: This legislation amends the act of October 5, 1978 (P.L. 1109, No. 261), known as the Osteopathic Medical Practice Act to address how the written agreement between a physician assistant and physician is processed by the licensing board. The legislation adds a definition of "Primary supervising physician."

The legislation allows a delegate to be utilized to prepare and submit the required written agreement. Utilizing a delegate does not alter the obligations of those signing the written agreement.

FISCAL IMPACT: This legislation would have no adverse fiscal impact on Commonwealth funds.
