SUMMARY:

House Bill 2125 amends the Crimes Code concerning prostitution and related offenses, and obscene and other sexual materials and performances. It would take effect in 60 days.

ANALYSIS:

House Bill 2125 amends the Crimes Code concerning prostitution and related offenses, and obscene and other sexual materials and performances.

Concerning prostitution and related offenses, HB 2125 removes the phrase, "homosexual and other deviate sexual relations" from the definition of sexual activity.

Concerning obscene and other sexual materials and performances, HB 2125 removes "homosexuality" from the definition of sexual conduct. It also removes other language from this definition and incorporates a reference to other sexual acts defined elsewhere in the Crimes Code.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Enactment of this legislation will have no adverse impact on Commonwealth funds.
