SUMMARY:

House Bill 2585 amends the Insurance Company Law of 1921 concerning comprehensive health care for uninsured children. It would take effect immediately.

ANALYSIS:

House Bill 2585 amends the Insurance Company Law of 1921 concerning contracts and coverage packages for comprehensive health care for uninsured children. It prohibits the Department of Human Services (DHS) from developing or utilizing bidding or service zones that limit a health service corporation or hospital plan corporation contractor from submitting a bid for contracts for the Children's Health Insurance Program. It also requires DHS to accept a solicitation or bid from any health service corporation or hospital plan corporation for counties in which it is permitted to offer its products.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Enactment of this legislation will have no adverse impact on Commonwealth funds.
