SUMMARY: SB 1138 PN 1725, amends the Administrative Code to reauthorize the State Geospatial Coordinating Board and make administrative changes to the board. This legislation will take effect immediately and expire on July 31, 2028.

ANALYSIS: This legislation amends Act 175 of 1929, also known as the Administrative Code, to reauthorize the State Geospatial Coordinating Board until July 31, 2028. Additionally, this legislation articulates changes to the organization of departmental administrative/advisory boards and commissions.

The Board would add to its existing membership:

- Secretary of Dept. of Community and Economic Development (DCED) or a designee;
- Secretary of the Commonwealth or designee; and
- One member of the Keystone GIS.

The Board would remove from its existing membership:

- One member of the Pennsylvania Mapping and Geographic Information Consortium;
- One member designated by the Pennsylvania Chapter of the Management Association for Private Photogrammetric Surveyors; and
- The non-voting ex officio member of the PA Municipal Authorities Association.

Other provisions:

- Members representing State agencies would serve on the board until their successors are appointed;
- Eleven members of the board would constitute a quorum; and
- Board's authority to appoint and fix the compensation of an executive director is removed.

The board is currently set to sunset on June 30, 2024, and this bill would reauthorize the board through July 31, 2028.

FISCAL IMPACT: The enactment of this legislation would have a *de minimis* fiscal impact on commonwealth funds, specifically the General Fund. Furthermore, the costs related to compensation would be split between the agencies involved and absorbed within existing resources.
