### DESCRIPTION AND PURPOSE OF BILL

House Bill 1731 provides for the Commonwealth's nonpreferred appropriation to the Pennsylvania State University for fiscal year 2011-2012.

The bill specifies \$214,110,000 shall be provided for General Support and \$13,584,000 for Penn College of Technology and payments to the university are to be made on a monthly basis.

The bill also authorizes the appropriation of moneys contained within the Agricultural College Land Scrip Fund restricted receipt account for Agricultural Research and Extension Services. It is estimated that \$44,737,000 will be available in this account.

The Governor's budget proposed to reduce the appropriation to the Pennsylvania State University by 50.6 percent when considering State and ARRA State Fiscal Stabilization funds. This legislation reduces the funding level by just 18.4 percent, providing an additional \$107,337,000 over the amount proposed by the Governor.

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The legislation is scheduled to take effect immediately.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT:**

House Bill 1731 will cost the Commonwealth \$272,431,000 in fiscal year 2011-2012.
