DESCRIPTION AND PURPOSE OF BILL

House Bill 1840 amends the Steel Products Procurement Act (Act 3 of 1978) to allow the Department of General Services to exempt machinery and equipment steel products from the requirements of the act when they have not been produced in the United States in sufficient quantities in the previous calendar year.

It requires the Department to publish a list of the exempt products on its publically accessible Internet website and to update the list annually so that it can be relied upon by contractors, suppliers and public agencies when preparing bids and contracts. The Department is prohibited from making changes to the list during the year following publication.

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The bill also requires that prior to the annual publication of the list of exempt products on the Internet, the Department must publish the list in the Pennsylvania Bulletin and provide for a 30-day comment period and process to resolve disputes with respect to items on the list raised during the comment period.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The Department of General Services has indicated that its administrative responsibilities related to publication of the list of exempt products can be accomplished within its existing operating appropriation and will have no adverse fiscal impact on Commonwealth funds.
