DESCRIPTION AND PURPOSE OF BILL

House Bill 108 amends Act 284 of 1921, known as the Insurance Company Law of 1921, to extend the life of the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) through December 31, 2015.

Amendment A03392 eliminates the required waiting period of six months without insurance before the child could enroll in CHIP.

This act shall take effect immediately.

SENATE APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE FISCAL NOTE

FISCAL IMPACT:

House Bill 108 will have no adverse fiscal impact to the Commonwealth. The bill continues the current CHIP program through December 31, 2015.

Amendment A03392 would not have an adverse fiscal impact on Fiscal Year 2013-2014. There would not be any additional children served just eliminates the time that they would wait to become eligible for enrollment.
