DESCRIPTION AND PURPOSE OF BILL

Senate Bill 1396 appropriates the total sum of \$71,639,000 for fiscal year 2014-15 from the State Gaming Fund for the operations of the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board ("board") and the operations of the Department of Revenue, the Pennsylvania State Police and the Attorney General, with respect to their responsibility and authority under Part II of 4 Pa.C.S., known as the Pennsylvania Race Horse Development and Gaming Act ("gaming act"). The appropriation is categorized as follows:

- Attorney General - \$1,141,000
- Department of Revenue - \$9,513,000
- Pennsylvania State Police - \$22,995,000
- Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board - \$37,990,000

The fiscal year 2014-15 appropriation total represents an increase in funding of \$1,616,000, or 2.3%, from fiscal year 2013-14. Senate Bill 1396 reflects the Governor's recommended fiscal year 2014-15 total appropriation of \$71,639,000 for the included agencies.

The amount of \$37,990,000 is appropriated for the operations of the board. Of this amount, \$7,000,000 is appropriated from the restricted revenue account established in the State Gaming Fund for fees and other revenues collected by the board. Examples of these fees include investigative fees, license renewal fees and gaming lab chargeback fees.

Section 501 of Senate Bill 1396 prohibits the transfer of any moneys within or between the appropriations made to the agencies or board.

The act shall take effect July 1, 2014, or immediately, whichever is later.
