Co-sponsorship of Legislation – Re-introduction of HB 1113 of 2009 - Training of School

Employees in Diabetes Care and Treatment

In the near future, I will be reintroducing legislation that will amend the Public School Code to require the training of school employees in diabetes care and treatment as well as allowing for the possession and self-administration of diabetes medication by students. This legislation is fundamentally identical to HB 1113 introduced last session.

As many of you are painfully aware, diabetes is a chronic disease marked by high levels of sugar in the blood. Individuals suffering from the disease are at greater risk to develop heart disease, high blood pressure, blindness, kidney disease, and neuropathy. More than 20 million men, women, and children, or approximately 7.8% of the population, suffer from diabetes in this country alone. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), nearly 200,000 people under the age of twenty have diabetes, with roughly 15,000 children diagnosed with Type 1 diabetes and about 3,700 children diagnosed with Type II diabetes annually in the United States.

My legislation would call for the training of at least three school employees per building regarding the recognition of hypoglycemia and hyperglycemia, the administration of glucagon and insulin, and recognizing complications that require immediate emergency assistance. Additionally, school boards would be required to develop a written policy allowing diabetic students to possess on their person at all times all necessary supplies, equipment, and prescribed medication to perform self-monitoring and treatment pursuant to the child's diabetes medical management plan as submitted by the student's parents and physician.

When a child goes into diabetic shock, every second is crucial. My legislation would equip school personnel with the necessary knowledge to respond to this type of medical emergency. It is my sincere hope that you will join me in this important effort.
