SUBJECT: Proposed legislation - Contractor's Proof of Financial Security (HB 2042 of 2009)

I will be re-introducing legislation in the near future to protect consumers from unscrupulous home contractors, and the legislation will be an excellent complement to the Act 132 of 2008, i.e. Home Improvement Consumer Protection Act, by requiring the most up to date information on the financial condition of a contractor.

Currently, when an application for a building permit is filed and all legal requirements have been met, the administrator has no choice but to issue the permit. There is no requirement that the contractor provide proof of financial responsibility and so contractors with outstanding liens or judgments are currently able to acquire the permit even if they are experiencing financial difficulties.

My legislation will require contractors seeking building permits to provide proof of financial security. This proof could be in the form of an affidavit from the county administrator stating that there are no outstanding liens or judgments against the contractor.

Unfortunately, one of my constituents encountered this situation and since they were not aware of any outstanding judgments, the contractor absconded with money without having done any of the promised work. Only after this occurred did the constituent learn of the outstanding judgments.

While we may not be able to provide help to my constituent, the legislation should be of value to other Pennsylvanians in preventing contractors from being defrauded by unscrupulous contractors.
