## AN ACT

- Establishing the Pennsylvania Long-term Care Council; providing 1 2
- for its powers and duties; and repealing related provisions
- 4
- The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- hereby enacts as follows: 5
- Section 1. Short title. 6
- 7 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Pennsylvania
- Long-term Care Council Act. 8
- Section 2. Definitions. 9
- 10 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall 11
- have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 12
- context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 13 "Council." The Pennsylvania Long-term Care Council.
- 14 "Department." The Department of Aging of the Commonwealth. 15
- Section 3. Pennsylvania Long-term Care Council. 16
- Establishment. -- The Pennsylvania Long-term Care Council 17
- is established within the department.
- 18 (b) Membership. -- The council shall be composed of and

- 1 appointed in accordance with the following:
- 2 (1) The Secretary of Aging.
- 3 (2) The Secretary of Community and Economic Development.
- 4 (3) The Secretary of Health.
- 5 (4) The Secretary of Public Welfare.
- 6 (5) The Insurance Commissioner.
- 7 (6) The Executive Director of the Pennsylvania Housing
- Finance Agency.
- 9 (7) Two members of the House of Representatives, one 10 appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and 11 one appointed by the Minority Leader.
- 12 (8) Two members of the Senate, one appointed by the
  13 President pro tempore and one appointed by the Minority
  14 Leader.
- 15 (9) The following members to be recommended by the 16 Secretary of Aging for appointment by the Governor as 17 follows:
- 18 (i) One representative from the Pennsylvania Council 19 on Aging.
- 20 (ii) Five members who represent consumer advocacy
  21 groups.
- 22 (iii) One member who represents the elder law 23 section of the Pennsylvania Bar Association.
- 24 (iv) A licensed insurance producer with at least ten 25 years' experience in the long-term care insurance market 26 who is a member of an association through which members 27 sell, solicit and negotiate contracts of health 28 insurance.
- (v) Five members who represent providers throughout the long-term care continuum.

- 1 (vi) Four members of the public who represent
- business, labor, housing and the medical community, as
- 3 the Governor shall appoint.
- 4 (c) Designee.--With the exception of the chairperson,
- 5 governmental members may appoint a designee to attend and vote
- 6 at meetings of the council. Each governmental member who
- 7 appoints a designee shall do so by sending a letter to the
- 8 chairperson stating the name of that designee.
- 9 (d) Chairperson. -- The Secretary of Aging shall serve as
- 10 chairperson.
- 11 (e) Executive director. -- The Secretary of Aging shall
- 12 appoint an executive director of the council.
- 13 (f) Terms of members.--
- 14 (1) The terms of those members who serve by virtue of
- the public office they hold shall be concurrent with their
- service in the office from which they derive their
- membership.
- 18 (2) The remaining members shall serve until their
- 19 successors are appointed, provided that they represent the
- interest of the membership class for which they were
- 21 appointed.
- 22 (g) Expenses.--Members shall not receive compensation or
- 23 remuneration, but shall be entitled to reimbursement for all
- 24 reasonable and necessary actual expenses accrued in the
- 25 performance of their duties as members.
- 26 Section 4. Powers and duties of council.
- 27 (a) General rule. -- The council shall have the following
- 28 powers and duties:
- 29 (1) To consult with various departments and agencies and
- 30 to make recommendations on regulations, licensure, financing

- or any other responsibilities of those departments or agencies relating to long-term care.
- 3 (2) To perform such other duties as the Governor may 4 assign relating to long-term care.
  - (3) To approve reports produced by any committee established under section 5 before release to the public or the General Assembly.
- 8 (4) To develop and adopt rules for conducting council
  9 meetings, including, but not limited to, the procedure for
  10 formally adopting the approval of committee reports before
  11 release to the public.
- 12 (5) To develop and adopt rules for conducting committee
  13 meetings. This power includes, but is not limited to,
  14 determining the scope of responsibilities for each committee,
  15 the number of members for each committee and the procedure
  16 for formally adopting the approval of committee reports
  17 before release to the council.
- 18 (6) To assign topics for research and study to each
  19 committee. Nothing in this paragraph shall be construed to
  20 prohibit a committee from proposing topics for consideration
  21 to the council.
- (b) Scope.--All the powers and duties enumerated in this
  section shall be performed in a manner that addresses all areas
  of long-term care, including institutional care and home-based
  and community-based services.
- 26 Section 5. Council committees.
- 27 (a) Establishment.--The council shall establish committees 28 to address the following areas:
- 29 (1) Regulatory review and access to care.
- 30 (2) Community access and public education.

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- 1 (3) Long-term care services models and delivery.
- 2 (4) Work force.
- 3 (b) Composition.--The council chairperson, with concurrence
- 4 by the council, shall appoint committee members to serve in the
- 5 same manner as section 3(f). The members shall represent:
- 6 (1) Advocacy groups.
- 7 (2) Consumers.
- 8 (3) Long-term care providers.
- 9 (4) Direct caregivers.
- 10 (5) The general public.
- 11 (6) Governmental entities.
- 12 (c) Chairpersons and vice chairpersons. -- The chairperson of
- 13 the council shall appoint a chairperson and vice chairperson for
- 14 each committee.
- 15 (d) Duties.--The council committees shall have the following
- 16 powers and duties:
- 17 (1) To study and report on the topics assigned by the
- 18 council.
- 19 (2) To retain individuals, with the permission of the
- 20 council, to assist in researching, studying and drafting
- 21 reports for the council.
- 22 (3) To approve reports and recommendations for
- submission to the council. Only members appointed to the
- 24 committee may participate in approving reports and
- 25 recommendations.
- 26 Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit the
- 27 chairperson, with concurrence by the council, from establishing
- 28 additional committees or ad hoc work groups to assist the
- 29 council of committees.
- 30 Section 6. Existing council members.

- 1 (a) General rule. -- Nongovernmental members of the Intra-
- 2 Governmental Council on Long-Term Care currently serving on the
- 3 council shall continue to serve until successors are appointed.
- 4 (b) Construction. -- Nothing in this section shall be
- 5 construed to prohibit the reappointment of existing members.
- 6 Section 7. Repeal.
- 7 Repeals are as follows:
- 8 (1) The General Assembly declares that the repeal under
- 9 paragraph (2) is necessary to effectuate this act.
- 10 (2) Section 212 of the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31,
- 11 No.21), known as the Public Welfare Code, is repealed.
- 12 Section 8. Effective date.
- 13 This act shall take effect in six months.
