AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), entitled "An
- act to consolidate, editorially revise, and codify the public
- welfare laws of the Commonwealth, " providing for food allergy
- 4 guidelines.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Section 1001 of the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31,
- 8 No.21), known as the Public Welfare Code, is amended by adding a
- 9 definition to read:
- 10 Section 1001. Definitions.--As used in this article--
- 11 * * *
- 12 "Anaphylaxis." A life-threatening allergic reaction that is
- 13 rapid in onset.
- 14 * * *
- 15 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 16 <u>Section 1021.1.</u> Food Allergy Guidelines.--(a) No later than
- 17 January 1, 2013, the department, in conjunction with the
- 18 Department of Health, shall develop and provide guidelines to a
- 19 child day care center for managing a child with a

- 1 <u>life-threatening food allergy</u>. The <u>quidelines shall contain all</u>
- 2 of the following:
- 3 (1) Training on administering medication with a cartridge
- 4 injector.
- 5 (2) Procedures to ensure that a child's self-injectable
- 6 epinephrine is available to the child day care center personnel.
- 7 (3) Reasonable accommodations to reduce the risk of a
- 8 child's being exposed to anaphylaxis-causing agents located in
- 9 areas of school activity.
- 10 (4) Protocols on responding to life-threatening allergic
- 11 reactions.
- 12 (5) Procedures for implementing an individualized health
- 13 care and food allergy plan.
- 14 (b) No later than September 30 of each year, a child day
- 15 <u>care center shall establish a food allergy policy in accordance</u>
- 16 with the quidelines under subsection (a) and shall provide
- 17 <u>notice of the policy to the parent or legal quardian of each</u>
- 18 enrolled child.
- 19 (c) A parent or legal guardian of a child enrolled in a
- 20 child day care center who has a known food allergy shall submit
- 21 to the child day care center all of the following:
- 22 (1) A list of foods that may cause the child to have an
- 23 allergic reaction.
- 24 (2) Medication prescribed for the child to treat the food
- 25 <u>allergy or anaphylaxis</u>.
- 26 (3) Symptoms that may indicate the child is having an
- 27 <u>allergic reaction to food</u>.
- 28 (4) Emergency treatment procedures to use if the child has
- 29 <u>an allergic reaction</u> to food.
- 30 (5) Contact information of the individual to contact if the

- 1 child has an allergic reaction to food.
- 2 (6) Contact information of the child's primary health care
- 3 provider.
- 4 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
