## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Memorializing the President and the Congress of the United
- States to fully fund all special education mandates imposed by Federal laws or regulations upon State, county, municipal
- or local providers of educational services to students in
- 5 this Commonwealth.
- 6 WHEREAS, Section 14 of Article III of the Constitution of
- 7 Pennsylvania requires the General Assembly to provide for the
- 8 maintenance and support of a thorough and efficient system of
- 9 public education in this Commonwealth; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The right to an education is not among the rights
- 11 explicitly or implicitly guaranteed by the Constitution of the
- 12 United States; and
- WHEREAS, Federal laws, beginning with a March 2, 1867,
- 14 appropriation to create a Department of Education, began a
- 15 pattern of imposing educational terms and conditions upon the
- 16 public school systems of the individual states; and
- WHEREAS, In 1965, the passage of the Elementary and Secondary
- 18 Education Act was considered to be landmark legislation; and
- 19 WHEREAS, The Elementary and Secondary Education Act remains

- 1 the nucleus of Federal kindergarten through 12th grade education
- 2 policy; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The 1975 passage of the Education for All
- 4 Handicapped Children Act, revised and renamed the Individuals
- 5 with Disabilities Education Act in 1990 and further revised and
- 6 reauthorized by the Individuals with Disabilities Education
- 7 Improvement Act of 2004, required the states to provide free
- 8 public education to all disabled students and specified the
- 9 evaluations that must be performed and the services that must be
- 10 provided; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Special education enrollment and aggregate costs for
- 12 children with disabilities have increased markedly since 1990
- 13 and there have not been proportionate increases in Federal
- 14 special educational appropriations; and
- 15 WHEREAS, The disabilities of children enrolled with special
- 16 education needs include autism, deaf-blindness, deafness,
- 17 emotional disturbance, hearing impairment, intellectual
- 18 disability, multiple disabilities, orthopedic impairment, other
- 19 health impairment, specific learning disability, speech or
- 20 language impairment, traumatic brain injury and visual
- 21 impairment, including blindness; and
- 22 WHEREAS, Special education-mandated spending by local school
- 23 districts is consuming a larger percentage of increased
- 24 educational costs; and
- WHEREAS, Pennsylvania's school system is comprised of 500
- 26 school districts; and
- 27 WHEREAS, The school districts in this Commonwealth educate
- 28 1,677,515 students and have an average expenditure per student
- 29 of \$12,299; and
- 30 WHEREAS, The Federal revenue contribution per student is

- 1 \$1,052; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania educates approximately 219,377 children
- 3 with disabilities and 57,605 of these children have been found
- 4 to be severely disabled; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The cost to educate a child with a disability is
- 6 approximately \$16,407, 40% higher than for a non-disabled child;
- 7 and
- 8 WHEREAS, Appropriations under the Individuals with
- 9 Disabilities Education Improvement Act would require a 130%
- 10 increase before the mandates of the act are fully funded; and
- 11 WHEREAS, State and local budgets have been forced to absorb
- 12 the unfunded costs of this mandate; therefore be it
- RESOLVED, That the Senate memorialize the President and the
- 14 Congress of the United States to fully fund all special
- 15 education mandates imposed by Federal laws or regulations upon
- 16 State, county, municipal or local providers of educational
- 17 services to students in this Commonwealth; and be it further
- 18 RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to
- 19 the President of the United States, the presiding officers of
- 20 each house of Congress and each member of Congress from
- 21 Pennsylvania.
