- "Abuse." The occurrence of one or more of the following 1 2
- The infliction of injury, unreasonable confinement, 3
- intimidation or punishment with resulting physical harm, pain 4
- or mental anguish. 5
- The willful deprivation by a caretaker of goods or 6 (2)
- 7 services which are necessary to maintain physical or mental

- 9 (3) Sexual harassment, rape or abuse, as defined in the
- 10 act of October 7, 1976 (P.L.1090, No.218), known as the
- Protection From Abuse Act. 11
- 12 (4) Financial abuse.
- 13 No older adult shall be found to be abused solely on the grounds
- of environmental factors which are beyond the control of the 14
- older adult or the caretaker, such as inadequate housing, 15
- 16 furnishings, income, clothing or medical care.

- "Financial abuse." The intentional taking or retaining of, 18
- or assisting in the taking or retaining of, real or personal 19
- property of an older adult by undue influence, or any other 20
- 21 means, for a wrongful purpose or with intent to defraud the
- 22 older adult. Financial abuse may result in the inability of the
- older adult to fund basic necessities, including, but not 23
- limited to, food, shelter, utilities, medication, health care 24
- 25 and long-term care services and support.

- 27 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- Section 706.1. Financial abuse. 28
- 29 (a) General rule. -- A person who commits financial abuse
- 30 shall be liable for:

- 1 (1) treble the value of the property recovered by an
- 2 <u>action taken under this section; and</u>
- 3 (2) reasonable attorney fees and costs associated with
- 4 <u>legal action undertaken to recover the property.</u>
- 5 (b) Venue. -- An action for financial abuse of an older person
- 6 may be brought in any county in which any part of the financial
- 7 abuse took place, regardless of whether the defendant was
- 8 present in that county.
- 9 (c) Statute of limitations. -- An action for financial abuse
- 10 shall be commenced within seven years after the commission of
- 11 the offense.
- 12 (d) Defense.--It shall not be a defense to financial abuse
- 13 that the defendant reasonably believed that the victim was not
- 14 an older person.
- 15 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
