

## AN ACT

1 Amending the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), entitled  
2 "An act concerning elections, including general, municipal,  
3 special and primary elections, the nomination of candidates,  
4 primary and election expenses and election contests; creating  
5 and defining membership of county boards of elections;  
6 imposing duties upon the Secretary of the Commonwealth,  
7 courts, county boards of elections, county commissioners;  
8 imposing penalties for violation of the act, and codifying,  
9 revising and consolidating the laws relating thereto; and  
10 repealing certain acts and parts of acts relating to  
11 elections," in electronic voting systems, further providing  
12 for authorization of electronic voting systems for use at  
13 polling places.

14 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania  
15 hereby enacts as follows:

16 Section 1. Section 1102-A of the act of June 3, 1937  
17 (P.L.1333, No.320), known as the Pennsylvania Election Code,  
18 added July 11, 1980 (P.L.600, No.128), is amended to read:

19 Section 1102-A. Authorization of Electronic Voting Systems  
20 for Use at Polling Places.--(a) Any county or municipality may,  
21 by a majority vote of its qualified registered electors voting  
22 thereon cast at any primary or election, authorize and direct  
23 the use of an electronic voting system for registering or

1 recording and computing the vote at all elections and primaries  
2 held at polling places in such county or municipality.

3 (b) No county or municipality may enter into a contract with  
4 an entity for the purchase of goods or services relating to the  
5 operation of any function of an electronic voting system,  
6 including, but not limited to, the recording and tabulating of  
7 votes during an election, if the entity is not domiciled in the  
8 United States.

9 (c) The Secretary of the Commonwealth may not approve, as  
10 provided in this article, an electronic voting system if any  
11 function of the electronic voting system, including, but not  
12 limited to, the recording and tabulation of votes during an  
13 election, is operated by an entity not domiciled in the United  
14 States.

15 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
