## AN ACT

- Amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), entitled "An 1
- act to consolidate, editorially revise, and codify the public 2
- welfare laws of the Commonwealth," in public assistance, 3
- providing for payments for burial expenses; and abrogating 55
- Pa. Code § 283.21. 5
- 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 7 hereby enacts as follows:
- 8 Section 1. Article IV of the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31,
- No.21), known as the Human Services Code, is amended by adding a
- 10 subarticle to read:
- 11 (n) Burial Services Allowance
- 12 Section 494. Payments for Burial Services. -- (a)
- department shall pay a burial or cremation allowance in the 13
- 14 amount of \$900 for the following:
- 15 (1) Individuals who received Supplemental Security Income.
- 16 (2) Individuals who received cash benefits from the
- 17 department prior to death.
- 18 (3) Individuals found eligible for cash assistance prior to
- 19 death.

- 1 (4) Residents of nursing homes who received Supplemental
- 2 Security Income or nursing home care payments prior to and
- 3 continuously since January 1, 1973.
- 4 (b) This amount may be supplemented by the decedent's estate
- 5 or another party in an amount not to exceed \$900, in accordance
- 6 with the eliqibility requirements of 55 Pa. Code § 283.3
- 7 (relating to requirements for payment). Individuals who die but
- 8 did not apply for assistance shall be reviewed for eligibility
- 9 to qualify for a grant allowance. If eligible, an allowance
- 10 shall be paid by the department.
- 11 (c) Separate payments totaling an amount not to exceed the
- 12 amounts authorized in subsections (a) and (b) may be made for
- 13 <u>funeral</u>, <u>cemetery</u> and <u>crematorium</u> <u>expenses</u>.
- 14 (d) The amounts specified in subsections (a) and (b) shall
- 15 increase by \$50 each year for five consecutive years after the
- 16 effective date of this section.
- 17 Section 2. The provisions of 55 Pa. Code § 283.21 are
- 18 abrogated. All other provisions of 55 Pa. Code are abrogated
- 19 insofar as they are inconsistent with this act.
- 20 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
