A RESOLUTION

- Recognizing pornography as a public health hazard leading to a broad spectrum of individual and public health impacts and
- 3 societal harms.
- 4 WHEREAS, Pornography is creating a public health crisis and
- 5 its harms are beyond the capability of the individual to address
- 6 alone; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Efforts to prevent pornography exposure and
- 8 addiction, educate individuals and families concerning its harms
- 9 and develop recovery programs must be addressed systemically in
- 10 ways that hold broader influences accountable in order to
- 11 counter the sexually toxic environment it perpetuates; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Pornography is contributing to the
- 13 hypersexualization of teenagers and prepubescent children in our
- 14 society; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Due to the advances in technology and the universal
- 16 availability of the Internet, young children are exposed to what
- 17 used to be referred to as hardcore pornography at an alarming
- 18 rate, with 27% of older millennials reporting that they first

- 1 viewed pornography before puberty; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Viewing pornography at a young age leads to low
- 3 self-esteem, eating disorders, an increase in problematic sexual
- 4 activity at younger ages and an increased desire to engage in
- 5 risky sexual behavior as young adolescents; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Children and youths are exposed to pornography that
- 7 often serves as sex education and shapes sexual templates; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Pornography treats women as objects and commodities
- 9 for the viewer's use, teaching girls that they are objects to be
- 10 used and teaching boys that this is acceptable behavior; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Pornography normalizes violence and abuse of women
- 12 and children, treats women and children as objects and often
- 13 depicts rape and abuse as harmless; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Pornography equates torment and violence against
- 15 women and children with pleasure, increasing the demand for sex
- 16 trafficking, prostitution, child sexual abuse images and child
- 17 pornography; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Pornography has potential detrimental effects on the
- 19 user, including emotional, mental and medical illnesses, shaping
- 20 deviant sexual arousal, difficulty forming or maintaining
- 21 intimate relationships, brain development and functioning,
- 22 problematic or harmful sexual behaviors and addiction; and
- 23 WHEREAS, Recent research indicates that pornography is
- 24 potentially biologically addictive, meaning the user requires
- 25 more novelty, which is often more shocking material, in order to
- 26 be satisfied, leading to increasing themes of risky sexual
- 27 behaviors, extreme degradation, violence, child sexual abuse
- 28 images and child pornography; and
- 29 WHEREAS, Pornography use has a detrimental effect on the
- 30 family as it is linked to lessening desire in young men to

- 1 marry, dissatisfaction in marriage and infidelity; therefore be
- 2 it
- 3 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize that
- 4 pornography is a public health hazard leading to a broad
- 5 spectrum of individual and public health impacts and societal
- 6 harms; and be it further
- 7 RESOLVED, That, in recognizing the public health crisis
- 8 created by pornography, the House of Representatives acknowledge
- 9 the need for education, prevention, research and policy change
- 10 at the community and societal level in order to address the
- 11 epidemic that is harming the people of our State and our country
- 12 as a whole.
