## A RESOLUTION

Directing the Joint State Government Commission to conduct a 1 study on pesticide exposure and poisoning, testing and 2 reporting and to issue a report. 3 4 WHEREAS, The Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide 5 Act is the Federal statute governing the registration, distribution, sale and use of pesticides throughout the United 6 7 States; and 8 WHEREAS, A pesticide is defined in the Pennsylvania Pesticide Control Act of 1973 as "any substance or mixture of substances 9 10 intended for preventing, destroying, repelling, or mitigating 11 any pest, and any substance or mixture of substances intended 12 for use as a plant regulator, defoliant, or desiccant"; and 13 WHEREAS, Pesticides are widely used to control pests such as 14 insects, rodents, weeds, mold, fungi and bacteria; and WHEREAS, Although utilized in and around buildings, homes, 15 16 forests, parks and schools, pesticides are also consistently 17 applied to crops by the agricultural industry; and 18 WHEREAS, Eighty percent of the 16,000 pesticide products that

1 are registered with the United States Environmental Protection
2 Agency are used by the agricultural industry; and
3 WHEREAS, Agriculture has a long ingrained history within this
4 Commonwealth and continues to be one of the top economic
5 industries; and

6 WHEREAS, Given the greater use of pesticides in cultivating 7 crops, the groups employed in the agricultural industry are most 8 exposed and at elevated risk of illness or injury; and 9 WHEREAS, Recognizing worker risk, the Federal Insecticide, 10 Fungicide and Rodenticide Act includes a specific section 11 addressing worker protection standards; and

12 WHEREAS, The worker protection standards were revised by the 13 Environmental Protection Agency in November 2015 for the first 14 time since 1992; and

15 WHEREAS, Most provisions of the revised worker protection 16 standards were implemented in January 2017; and

WHEREAS, The remaining sections slated be to implemented have been delayed by the Environmental Protection Agency until May 2018; and

20 WHEREAS, Every organ system in the body is susceptible to 21 pesticide toxicity, with recent studies showing that not only 22 workers, but pregnant women and their developing babies and 23 children are particularly vulnerable; and

WHEREAS, The National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health's Strategic Surveillance Plan recommends that every state conduct surveillance for acute pesticide-related illness and injury to identify pesticide problems, estimate the magnitude of pesticide poisoning and evaluate intervention and prevention efforts; and

30 WHEREAS, Thirty states, including Ohio, Maryland, New Jersey

and New York, require health professionals to report suspected
 pesticide poisoning; and

3 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania is one of 23 states and jurisdictions 4 that do not require reporting of suspected pesticide poisoning 5 by health professionals; therefore be it

6 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives direct the Joint 7 State Government Commission to conduct a study on pesticide 8 exposure and poisoning, testing and reporting and to issue a 9 report to the General Assembly; and be it further

10 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission seek 11 input and information, as appropriate, from the following:

12 (1) The Department of Health.

13 (2) The Department of Labor and Industry.

14 (3) The Department of Agriculture.

15 (4) The Department of Environmental Protection.

16 (5) The Insurance Department.

17 (6) Federal agencies that oversee regulation of18 pesticides.

(7) Individuals specializing in toxicology,
 epidemiology, medicine, data management, occupational and
 environmental health and industrial hygiene.

(8) Other agencies, organizations or persons that thecommission deems appropriate;

24 and be it further

25 RESOLVED, That the report of the Joint State Government 26 Commission contain findings and recommendations and include any 27 proposed legislation regarding the following:

(1) The threat pesticide exposure poses to publichealth.

30 (2) A cost-benefit analysis for employers providing

adequate information, safety gear and training and in taking
 all necessary precautions to prevent pesticide exposure and
 pesticide-related illness and injury.

4 (3) The feasibility of this Commonwealth developing and
5 implementing a Statewide pesticide-related illness and injury
6 related surveillance program.

7 (4) Identification of available money, including Federal
8 and State money, to develop and implement a Statewide
9 pesticide-related illness and injury related surveillance
10 program, if feasible;

11 and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission issue a report of its findings and recommendations to the General Assembly within 18 months of the adoption of this resolution.
