AN ACT

- Amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), entitled "An act to consolidate, editorially revise, and codify the public
- welfare laws of the Commonwealth," in public assistance,
- 4 providing for work requirements.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. The act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known
- 8 as the Human Services Code, is amended by adding a section to
- 9 read:
- 10 Section 441.10. Work Requirements. -- (a) No later than March
- 11 1 of each year, the secretary shall apply to the Centers for
- 12 Medicare and Medicaid Services of the United States Department
- 13 of Health and Human Services for a demonstration program under
- 14 section 1115 of the Social Security Act (49 Stat. 620, 42 U.S.C.
- 15 § 1315) for the following purposes:
- 16 (1) Instituting a work requirement for a medical assistance
- 17 enrollee who is not exempt under paragraph (4). The work
- 18 requirement shall require a medical assistance enrollee to
- 19 become employed, actively seek employment as verified by the

- 1 department or attend a job training program in accordance with
- 2 the following:
- 3 (i) In the case of a medical assistance enrollee who is
- 4 employed or attending job training programs in order to maintain
- 5 enrollment in the medical assistance program, the medical
- 6 <u>assistance enrollee shall work twenty hours a week or complete</u>
- 7 twelve job training program-related activities a month.
- 8 (ii) A medical assistance enrollee who has failed to comply
- 9 with the work requirement under subparagraph (i) shall
- 10 relinquish medical assistance program eligibility for the
- 11 <u>following time periods:</u>
- 12 (A) Three months beginning in year two of employment.
- 13 (B) Six months beginning after the time period under clause
- 14 (A) expires.
- 15 (C) Nine months beginning after the time period under clause
- 16 <u>(B) expires.</u>
- 17 (2) Requiring an able-bodied medical assistance enrollee who
- 18 is nineteen years of age or older to verify on a biannual basis
- 19 or by request of the department the medical assistance
- 20 enrollee's family income or the medical assistance enrollee's
- 21 compliance with the provisions under paragraph (1) for the
- 22 purpose of determining the medical assistance enrollee's
- 23 <u>eligibility.</u>
- 24 (3) Delaying an individual from enrolling in a medical
- 25 <u>assistance program if the individual has failed to comply with</u>
- 26 paragraphs (1) and (2).
- 27 (4) Exempting a medical assistance enrollee from the
- 28 requirements under paragraphs (1) and (2) under any of the
- 29 <u>following conditions:</u>
- 30 (i) The medical assistance enrollee is attending high school

- 1 as a full-time student.
- 2 (ii) The medical assistance enrollee is currently receiving
- 3 temporary or permanent long-term disability benefits.
- 4 (iii) The medical assistance enrollee is an individual
- 5 nineteen years of age or younger or sixty-five years of age or
- 6 older.
- 7 (iv) The medical assistance enrollee is a pregnant woman.
- 8 (v) The medical assistance enrollee receives Supplemental
- 9 Security Income (SSI) benefits.
- 10 (vi) The medical assistance enrollee resides in a mental
- 11 health institution or correctional institution.
- 12 (vii) The medical assistance enrollee is experiencing a
- 13 crisis, serious medical condition or temporary condition that
- 14 prevents the Medicaid enrollee from actively seeking employment,
- 15 <u>such as domestic violence or substance use disorder.</u>
- 16 (viii) The medical assistance enrollee is the primary
- 17 caregiver to a dependent who is under six years of age or is
- 18 permanently disabled.
- 19 (b) The secretary's application for the demonstration
- 20 program under subsection (a) shall also align with other
- 21 assistance programs that have work requirements in order to
- 22 reduce the cost of monitoring the work requirements.
- 23 (c) The demonstration program under subsection (a) may also
- 24 include a medical assistance buy-in component to allow workers
- 25 with disabilities to have higher wage earnings and maintain
- 26 their medical assistance coverage.
- 27 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
