

## AN ACT

Amending the act December 12, 1994 (P.L.1023, No.139), entitled "An act establishing the Statewide Independent Living 2 Council; providing for the powers and duties of the council; 3 providing for a State plan for the provision of services to 4 people with disabilities; providing for grants and funding 5 for establishment of centers for independent living; and requiring centers for independent living to maintain certain 7 standards and give certain assurances in order to qualify for 8 assistance," further providing for definitions and for grants 9 and funding. 10

- 11 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 12 hereby enacts as follows:
- Section 1. Section 3 of the act of December 12, 1994
- 14 (P.L.1023, No.139), known as the Independent Living Services
- 15 Act, is amended by adding definitions to read:
- 16 Section 3. Definitions.
- 17 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 18 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 19 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 20 \* \* \*
- 21 "Individual who is deafblind." An individual:

Т	(1) Who has a central visual acuity of 20/200 or less in
2	the better eye with corrective lenses or a field defect such
3	that the peripheral diameter of visual field subtends an
4	angular distance no greater than 20 degrees or a progressive
5	visual loss having a prognosis leading to one or both
6	conditions.
7	(2) Who has a chronic hearing impairment so severe that
8	most speech cannot be understood with optimum amplification
9	or a progressive hearing loss having a prognosis leading to
10	this condition.
11	(3) For whom the combination of impairments described
12	under paragraphs (1) and (2) causes extreme difficulty in
13	attaining independence in daily life activities, achieving
14	psychosocial adjustment or obtaining a vocation.
15	(4) Who despite the inability to be measured accurately
16	for hearing and vision loss due to cognitive or behavioral
17	constraints, or both, can be determined through functional
18	and performance assessment to have severe hearing and visual
19	disabilities that cause extreme difficulty in attaining
20	independence in daily life activities, achieving psychosocial
21	adjustment or obtaining vocation objectives.

23	"Support service provider." An individual trained by a
24	center for independent living to link an individual who is
25	deafblind to their environment by:
26	(1) Guiding an individual who is deafblind.
27	(2) Facilitating communication between an individual who
28	is deafblind and other individuals.
29	(3) Providing information to an individual who is
30	deafblind about their surroundings.

5	(f) Existing centers for independent living
6	(1) The Department of Labor and Industry shall provide
7	<pre>grants to:</pre>
8	(i) Centers for independent living that provide
9	services to individuals who are deafblind. Grants shall
10	be used to provide assistance to an individual who is
11	deafblind who is working toward establishing and
12	maintaining independence.
13	(ii) Centers for independent living that train
14	support service providers. Grants shall be used to
15	provide the necessary training to become a support
16	service provider in this Commonwealth.
17	(2) A grant under this subsection shall be in the amount
18	of at least \$250,000. Beginning on the effective date of this
19	subsection and annually thereafter, the minimum grant amount
20	listed in this paragraph shall increase at the rate of
21	inflation as outlined in the Consumer Price Index for All
22	Urban Consumers in the Northeast Region for the most recent
23	12-month period for which the figures have been reported by
24	the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor
25	Statistics. If the rate of inflation does not increase, the
26	minimum grant amount shall remain the same as it was for the
27	previous year.

28 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
