

- 6 (d) Definitions. -- As used in this section, the following
- 7 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 8 subsection:
- 9 "Electric or electronic incapacitation device." A portable
- 10 device which is designed or intended by the manufacturer to be
- 11 used, offensively or defensively, to temporarily immobilize or
- 12 incapacitate persons by means of electric pulse or current,
- 13 including devices operated by means of carbon dioxide
- 14 propellant. The term does not include cattle prods, electric
- 15 fences or other electric devices when used in agricultural,
- 16 animal husbandry or food production activities.
- "Emergency medical services personnel." The term includes,
- 18 but is not limited to, doctors, residents, interns, registered
- 19 nurses, licensed practical nurses, nurse aides, ambulance
- 20 attendants and operators, paramedics, emergency medical
- 21 technicians and members of a hospital security force while
- 22 working within the scope of their employment.
- 23 "Municipality." A city, borough, incorporated town, township
- 24 or home rule municipality.
- 25 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
