

AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An 1

act relating to the public school system, including certain

provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3

schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the 4

laws relating thereto," in pupils and attendance, providing for school building closure requirements. 5

- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known 9 Section 1.
- as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a 10
- section to read: 11

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- Section 1311.1. School Building Closure Requirements. -- (a) 12
- A school entity may close a school voluntarily, through 13
- nonrenewal or through revocation as provided under section 1729-14
- A. Notice of a school entity's closure of a school for any 15
- reason must be provided by the authorizing entity to the 16
- Department of Education. After receiving notification of 17
- closure, the department shall notify the school entity and the 18
- authorizing entity if it is aware of any liabilities the school 19

- 1 entity owes the Commonwealth or any other entity. Liabilities
- 2 may include overpayment of tuition, unpaid revolving fund loans
- 3 or grants or other liabilities. The department may ask the
- 4 Auditor General or city controller of a city of the first class
- 5 to conduct an audit of the school entity if it has reason to
- 6 believe that the school entity received State funding for which
- 7 it was not eligible. The notice of the school entity shall
- 8 <u>include an accounting of the following:</u>
- 9 (1) All financial assets, including, but not limited to,
- 10 cash and accounts receivable and an inventory of property,
- 11 equipment and other items of material value.
- 12 (2) All liabilities, including, but not limited to, accounts
- 13 payable, unpaid staff compensation, audit findings or other
- 14 <u>investigations</u>.
- 15 (3) An assessment of the disposition of any restricted funds
- 16 received by or due to the school entity.
- 17 (b) If the school entity is supported by a nonprofit
- 18 foundation and the foundation does not have any other functions
- 19 than operation of the school entity, the foundation should be
- 20 dissolved according to its bylaws. The foundation's bylaws
- 21 should address how assets are to be distributed at the closure
- 22 of the foundation. All remaining assets of the foundation shall
- 23 be distributed on a proportional basis to school districts with
- 24 students enrolled in the school for the last full or partial
- 25 <u>school year of the school.</u>
- 26 (c) (1) The school entity shall send notice of its closure
- 27 of a school to parents or quardians of students, the authorizing
- 28 entity and the department. Notice must be received by the
- 29 <u>department within fifteen (15) calendar days of any official</u>
- 30 action taken by the authorizing entity. Notification of all the

- 1 required parties shall include at least the following:
- 2 (i) The effective date of the closure.
- 3 (ii) The name and contact information for the person
- 4 handling inquiries regarding the closure.
- 5 (iii) The students' school districts of residence.
- 6 (iv) How parents or quardians may obtain copies of student
- 7 records, including specific information on completed courses and
- 8 credits that meet graduation requirements.
- 9 (2) The notification to the department shall also include a
- 10 description of the circumstances of the closure and the location
- 11 of student and personnel records. Notification to parents,
- 12 quardians and students shall also include information on how to
- 13 transfer the student to an appropriate school and a certified
- 14 packet of student information that may include grade reports,
- 15 discipline records, immunization records and any other
- 16 appropriate information.
- 17 (d) The school entity or authorizing entity shall announce
- 18 the closure of a school to school districts that may be
- 19 responsible for providing education services to the former
- 20 students of the closing school. These districts can then assist
- 21 in facilitating student transfers.
- (e) School closures shall occur at the end of an academic
- 23 year if it is feasible to maintain a legally compliant program
- 24 until then. If a conversion charter school is reverting to
- 25 noncharter status, notification of this change shall be made to
- 26 all parties required under this section.
- 27 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
