## AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled, as amended, "An act providing for and reorganizing the 2 conduct of the executive and administrative work of the 3 Commonwealth by the Executive Department thereof and the 4 administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers 5 thereof, including the boards of trustees of State Normal 6 Schools, or Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, 7 reorganizing or authorizing the reorganization of certain 8 administrative departments, boards, and commissions; defining 9 the powers and duties of the Governor and other executive and 10 administrative officers, and of the several administrative 11 departments, boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the 12 salaries of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain 13 other executive and administrative officers; providing for 14 the appointment of certain administrative officers, and of 15 all deputies and other assistants and employes in certain 16 departments, boards, and commissions; providing for judicial 17 administration; and prescribing the manner in which the 18 number and compensation of the deputies and all other 19 assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and 20 commissions shall be determined," in Commonwealth budget 21 procedures, further providing for fiscal notes, providing for 22 adoption of expenditure limitations and for form of 23 appropriation acts and further providing for revenue 24 estimates. 25

- The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 27 hereby enacts as follows:
- Section 1. Section 612(7) of the act of April 9, 1929
- 29 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929, is

- 2 Section 612. Fiscal Notes. -- The Office of the Budget shall
- 3 prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative
- 4 procedures of the administrative departments, boards,
- 5 commissions, or authorities, receiving money from the State
- 6 Treasury. The fiscal note shall state whether the proposed
- 7 action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in
- 8 the cost of programs to the Commonwealth or its political
- 9 subdivisions. Any such regulatory action or administrative
- 10 procedure which requires a fiscal note shall be published in the
- 11 Pennsylvania Bulletin. The fiscal note shall be published in the
- 12 Pennsylvania Bulletin at the same time the proposed change is
- 13 advertised. The fiscal note shall provide the following
- 14 information:

- 16 (7) The line item, if any, of [the General Appropriation Act
- 17 or other] an appropriation act out of which expenditures or
- 18 losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the
- 19 action or procedures.

- 21 Section 2. The act is amended by adding sections to read:
- 22 <u>Section 613.1. Adoption of Expenditure Limitations.--(a) No</u>
- 23 later than June 1 of each year, the General Assembly shall adopt
- 24 expenditure limitations for the ensuing fiscal year by
- 25 concurrent resolution.
- 26 (b) The expenditure limitations shall contain the following:
- 27 (1) The total amount of State revenues which will be
- 28 available for each appropriation for the ensuing fiscal year.
- 29 (2) A description of measures which may be necessary to
- 30 generate State revenue for the ensuing fiscal year and the

- 1 estimated amount of State revenue which will be generated by
- 2 <u>each measure.</u>
- 3 (3) The available Federal funds for the ensuing fiscal year.
- 4 (4) The available funds from other sources for the ensuing
- 5 fiscal year.
- 6 (5) The amount of State revenues, Federal funds and funds
- 7 from other sources which are available to be appropriated for
- 8 each agency or department for the ensuing fiscal year.
- 9 (c) The General Assembly may not enact an appropriations act
- 10 in a fiscal year if the General Assembly fails to adopt
- 11 expenditure limitations as specified under this section.
- 12 <u>Section 613.2. Form of Appropriations Acts.--(a) An</u>
- 13 appropriations act may not appropriate funds for more than one
- 14 agency or department.
- 15 (b) An appropriations act may not appropriate funds for an
- 16 agency or department which exceed the amount specified for the
- 17 agency or department in the expenditure limitations under
- 18 <u>section 613.1.</u>
- 19 Section 3. Section 618(a) and (b) of the act are amended to
- 20 read:
- 21 Section 618. Revenue Estimates. -- (a) [The Department of
- 22 Revenue in conjunction with the Secretary of the Budget shall
- 23 make revenue estimates for the use of the Governor in preparing
- 24 the budget with periodic revisions until the final estimate is
- 25 signed by the Governor not later than the time he signs the
- 26 general appropriation bill. The revenue estimates used to sign
- 27 any appropriation bill shall show separately State revenues,
- 28 Federal funds, and, if specifically appropriated, funds from
- 29 other sources.] Prior to signing an appropriations bill, the
- 30 Governor shall sign the concurrent resolution adopting

- 1 expenditure limitations under section 613.1. The Governor shall
- 2 item veto any part of any appropriation bill that causes total
- 3 appropriations to exceed the [official estimate plus any
- 4 unappropriated surplus. No changes in the revenue estimates
- 5 shall be made thereafter unless changes in statutes affecting
- 6 revenues and receipts are enacted.
- 7 (b) The revenue estimates shall be prepared in a way that
- 8 they are subject to complete and thorough oversight by the
- 9 Appropriations Committees of the Senate and the House of
- 10 Representatives with full knowledge of all data, assumptions,
- 11 and econometric models which were used to develop the
- 12 projections and any subsequent revisions of these projections.]
- 13 expenditure limitations under section 613.1. No changes in the
- 14 expenditure limitations under section 613.1 shall be made
- 15 thereafter unless changes in statutes affecting revenues and
- 16 receipts are enacted and a revision of the expenditure
- 17 limitations under section 613.1 is adopted.

- 19 Section 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
