A RESOLUTION

- Urging the licensing boards and commissions under the Department 1
- of State to review how military education and training may partially or completely fulfill licensure requirements and to 2

- WHEREAS, The Department of State, Bureau of Professional and 6
- 7 Occupational Affairs, oversees 29 licensing boards and
- commissions that together license more than 1 million 8
- 9 Pennsylvanians; and
- 10 WHEREAS, There are more than 800,000 veterans living in
- Pennsylvania; and 11
- WHEREAS, About 57% of veterans across the United States have 12
- 13 difficulty adjusting to civilian life and 80% do not have a job
- when they leave the military; and 14
- WHEREAS, Organizations, including the National Conference of 15
- State Legislatures and the United States Department of Labor, 16
- 17 report that veterans who have training and experience in areas
- related to civilian licensure often find that institutions of 18
- higher education and licensing boards may not recognize official 19

- 1 documentation of military training and experience; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Over the past few years, several states, including
- 3 Oklahoma, New York, Maine, Rhode Island and Vermont, have
- 4 considered and enacted legislation to require licensing boards,
- 5 under appropriate circumstances, to accept and recognize
- 6 military training and experience toward licensure requirements
- 7 in related occupations; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania should be a national leader in the
- 9 effort to ease the transition between military and civilian
- 10 life; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The House of Representatives recognizes its role in
- 12 promoting family-sustaining employment for our brave veterans
- 13 who have put their lives on the line to serve our Commonwealth
- 14 and our country; therefore be it
- 15 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives urge each of the
- 16 licensing boards and commissions under the Department of State,
