A RESOLUTION

- 1 Commemorating the 50th anniversary of the Apollo 11 lunar
- landing mission on July 20, 2019.
- 3 WHEREAS, Following the Soviet Union's successful launch of
- 4 Sputnik in 1957, the great Space Race between the United States
- 5 and the Soviet Union effectively began, fueling the rivalry
- 6 throughout the Cold War; and
- 7 WHEREAS, During a special joint session of Congress in 1961,
- 8 President John F. Kennedy boldly announced that "this nation
- 9 should commit itself to achieving the goal, before this decade
- 10 is out, of landing a man on the moon and returning him safely to
- 11 Earth"; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Five years following President John F. Kennedy's
- 13 declaration, the first unmanned Apollo mission was conducted by
- 14 the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) with
- 15 the expertise and knowledge of an international team of
- 16 scientists and engineers; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Consequently, after the first successful unmanned

- 1 Apollo mission, the first manned launch pad test was conducted
- 2 at the Kennedy Space Center in Cape Canaveral, Florida. Tragedy
- 3 struck on that day as a fire broke out as a result of the
- 4 launch, and three astronauts' lives were lost on January 27,
- 5 1967; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Despite the loss, NASA forged ahead, successfully
- 7 orbiting Earth and traveling around the dark side of the moon in
- 8 two different manned missions in 1968; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Just months prior to the Apollo 11 mission, Apollo 9
- 10 and Apollo 10 successfully tested the lunar module of the
- 11 spacecraft in Earth's orbit and completed a full lunar orbit
- 12 with three astronauts on board; and
- WHEREAS, On July 16, 1969, the world watched the Apollo 11
- 14 spacecraft make history, traveling 240,000 miles in 76 hours,
- 15 entering lunar orbit three days after its initial launch; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Upon landing on the lunar surface on July 20, 1969,
- 17 Neil Armstrong, a former military pilot, became the first human
- 18 to walk the lunar surface, famously speaking the words, "that's
- 19 one small step for man, one giant leap for mankind"; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Shortly after Neil Armstrong's trailblazing steps,
- 21 Buzz Aldrin, a former fighter pilot in the Korean War, joined
- 22 Armstrong on the moon's surface where an American flag was
- 23 planted while the two men corresponded with President Richard
- 24 Nixon; and
- 25 WHEREAS, The two astronauts began the journey back to Earth
- 26 on July 22, 1969, safely landing in the Pacific Ocean about 900
- 27 miles from Hawaii on July 24, 1969; therefore be it
- 28 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives commemorate the
- 29 50th anniversary of the Apollo 11 lunar landing mission on July
- 30 , 20, 1969; and be it further

- 1 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize those
- 2 who contributed to the successful operation.
