Amending the act of June 24, 1931 (P.L.1206, No.331), known as The First Class Township Code, in township engineer, further providing for election of township engineer, term and filling of vacancies, providing for waiver and further providing for bond, for control of engineering matters, for duties and preparation of plans, for certificate of commencement and of completion of municipal improvements, for surveys and for preparation of books, plans and maps; in sidewalks, further providing for paving and curbing sidewalks; and, in parks, recreation centers, shade trees and forests, further providing for removal of diseased trees.

AN ACT

Amending the act of June 24, 1931 (P.L.1206, No.331), entitled "An act concerning townships of the first class; amending, 2 revising, consolidating, and changing the law relating thereto," in township engineer, further providing for 3 4 election of township engineer, term and filling of vacancies, 5 providing for waiver and further providing for bond, for 6 control of engineering matters, for duties and preparation of 7 plans, for certificate of commencement and of completion of 8 municipal improvements, for surveys and for preparation of books, plans and maps; in sidewalks, further providing for 9 10 paving and curbing sidewalks; and, in parks, recreation 11 centers, shade trees and forests, further providing for 12 removal of diseased trees. 13

- 14 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 15 hereby enacts as follows:
- 16 Section 1. Section 1301 of the act of June 24, 1931
- 17 (P.L.1206, No.331), known as The First Class Township Code, is
- 18 amended to read:
- 19 Section 1301. Election of Township Engineer; Term; Filling
- 20 of Vacancies. -- [The] Subject to section 1301.1, the board of
- 21 commissioners at the commencement of the fiscal year in any
- 22 even-numbered year, or as soon thereafter as may be practicable,
- 23 [may elect, by a vote of a majority of the members, one person

- 1 as township engineer, who shall be a registered civil engineer.
- 2 He] shall appoint, through a competitive bid process, and
- 3 determine the compensation of at least two township engineers,
- 4 who shall be registered civil engineers. A township engineer
- 5 shall serve for a term of two years, and until [his] a successor
- 6 qualifies. [The board of commissioners shall fix the
- 7 compensation of the engineer.] Vacancies in the office of
- 8 township engineer shall be filled by the board of commissioners
- 9 for the unexpired term.
- 10 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 11 Section 1301.1. Waiver. -- (a) If the board of commissioners
- 12 cannot obtain offers from qualified registered civil engineers
- 13 to fulfill the requirement under section 1301 to appoint at
- 14 least two township engineers, the board of commissioners may be
- 15 relieved from the requirement by completing a certification
- 16 form, subject to the following:
- 17 (1) The board of commissioners must complete the
- 18 certification form before the contract with the selected
- 19 township engineer is executed and must maintain the form
- 20 throughout the life of the contract with the township engineer.
- 21 (2) The certification form must be completed annually.
- 22 (3) A copy of the certification form must be filed with the
- 23 <u>department.</u>
- 24 (4) The department shall furnish the certification form,
- 25 which must:
- 26 (i) Require the board of commissioners to disclose the
- 27 methods and dates of the public solicitation. For purposes of
- 28 meeting this requirement, the board of commissioners shall
- 29 advertise requests for proposals and announce the solicitation
- 30 at a public meeting.

- 1 (ii) Require the board of commissioners to disclose the
- 2 number of qualified bids received to the public solicitation.
- 3 (iii) Contain a statement that the information provided by
- 4 the board of commissioners is in compliance with 18 Pa.C.S. §
- 5 4904 (relating to unsworn falsification to authorities).
- 6 (iv) Contain a statement that the department does not have
- 7 the discretion to deny waiver requests.
- 8 (b) As used in this section, the following words and phrases
- 9 shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection unless
- 10 the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 11 <u>"Department." The Department of Labor and Industry of the</u>
- 12 <u>Commonwealth</u>.
- 13 Section 3. Sections 1302, 1303, 1304, 1305, 1306, 1311, 2303
- 14 and 3027.1 of the act are amended to read:
- 15 Section 1302. Bond. -- [The] A township engineer shall, if the
- 16 board of commissioners so requires, give a bond to the township,
- 17 with a surety company or other company authorized by law to act
- 18 as surety, to be approved by the board of commissioners, in
- 19 [such] a sum as [it] the board of commissioners shall by
- 20 ordinance or resolution direct, conditioned for the faithful
- 21 performance of [his] the township engineer's duty.
- 22 Section 1303. Control of Engineering Matters.--[The] A
- 23 township engineer shall have the superintendence, direction and
- 24 control of the engineering matters of the township. No
- 25 department or officer of the township shall employ or retain any
- 26 additional engineer, except with the consent and ratification of
- 27 the board of commissioners.
- 28 Section 1304. Duties; Preparation of Plans.--[The] A
- 29 township engineer shall perform [such] the duties as the board
- 30 of commissioners shall prescribe as to the construction,

- 1 reconstruction, maintenance[,] and repair of all streets,
- 2 bridges, culverts[,] and other engineering work. [He] A township
- 3 engineer shall prepare plans, specifications[,] and estimates of
- 4 all [such] work undertaken by [such] the township, and shall,
- 5 whenever required, furnish the board of commissioners, and the
- 6 committees thereof, with reports, information[,] or estimates on
- 7 [any] township engineering work or on questions submitted by any
- 8 of them in their official capacity.
- 9 Section 1305. Certificate of Commencement and of Completion
- 10 of Municipal Improvements.--[The] \underline{A} township engineer shall,
- 11 immediately after the completion of [any] a municipal
- 12 improvement, the cost of which, in whole or in part, is to be
- 13 paid by the owner of the abutting property, make certificate in
- 14 which [he] the township engineer shall state the day or time on
- 15 which the particular improvement was completed, and shall file
- 16 the [same] certificate with the township secretary, who shall
- 17 enter the [said] day or time of completion of the work in a book
- 18 to be kept by [him for said] the township secretary for that
- 19 purpose. The [said] day or time mentioned in [said] the
- 20 certificate shall be conclusive on all parties as to the time
- 21 the [said] work was completed. The time of completion of the
- 22 work, referred to in this section and in other parts of this
- 23 act, shall be taken to mean the time of the completion of the
- 24 whole contract for the improvement. [He] A township engineer
- 25 shall also furnish to the township secretary a certificate
- 26 showing the time at which [any such] a particular improvement
- 27 was commenced, and [such] the certificate shall be conclusive
- 28 evidence of the time when the [said] improvement was begun. An
- 29 entry of [such] the date shall be made by [said] the township
- 30 secretary in the book [aforesaid].

- 1 Section 1306. Surveys. -- [The] A township engineer shall have
- 2 the charge and direction of all surveys and regulations
- 3 authorized by [any] an act of Assembly or ordinance of [such]
- 4 the township.
- 5 Section 1311. Preparation of Books, Plans and Maps.--[The] A
- 6 township engineer of [any] a township in which [such] the
- 7 registry <u>under this subarticle</u> shall be established shall cause
- 8 to be made all [such] necessary books, maps and plans as will
- 9 show the situation and dimensions of each property therein,
- 10 which books, maps or plans shall be so prepared as to show the
- 11 house number, if any, the name of the owner or owners thereof,
- 12 with blank spaces for the owner of each lot, with provision for
- 13 the names of future owners, and dates of future transfer of
- 14 title. For [such] this purpose, [the] a township engineer shall
- 15 have free access, without charge, to any of the public records
- 16 wherein the necessary information may be obtainable [therefor.]
- 17 He]. A township engineer may also cause search to be made in any
- 18 other place for [any] muniments or evidence of title, not
- 19 reported to [him] the township engineer as hereinafter provided,
- 20 and requisite for the completion of [such] the books, maps or
- 21 plans.
- 22 Section 2303. Paving and Curbing Sidewalks. -- Townships may,
- 23 upon [such] notice as may be provided by ordinance, require
- 24 owners of property abutting on any street, including State
- 25 highways and county roads, to construct, pave, curb, repave and
- 26 recurb the sidewalks along [such] the property with [such]
- 27 materials, at [such] grades and under [such] regulations as may
- 28 be prescribed by ordinance, and upon failure of [such] the
- 29 owners to comply with [such] the notice, or without notice to
- 30 the property owners as [above] provided in this section, the

- 1 townships shall in either case have power to cause the [same]
- $2 \quad \underline{\text{work}}$ to be done by the township, and to levy and collect the
- 3 cost [thereof] of the work from [such] the owners of property
- 4 abutting [such] the sidewalk. All reconstruction, repaying and
- 5 recurbing may be provided for in the ordinance providing for the
- 6 original construction, paving and curbing, without the necessity
- 7 for adopting a new ordinance providing for [such] the
- 8 reconstruction, repaving and recurbing.
- 9 The cost of [any such] grading, paving, curbing, repaving and
- 10 recurbing shall be a lien upon the premises from the time of the
- 11 commencement of the work, which date shall be fixed by [the] \underline{a}
- 12 township engineer and shall be filed with the township
- 13 secretary. [Any such] The lien may be collected by action in
- 14 assumpsit or by lien filed in the manner provided by law for the
- 15 filing and collection of municipal claims.
- 16 The cost of [any such] paving, curbing, repaving and
- 17 recurbing may, in any case, be borne in whole or in part by the
- 18 township.
- No sidewalks shall be established and constructed upon [any]
- 20 <u>a</u> State highway without the consent of the [State Department of
- 21 Highways] Department of Transportation, or upon [any] a county
- 22 road without the consent of the county commissioners.
- 23 Section 3027.1. Removal of Diseased Trees.--The commission
- 24 may, upon [such] notice as may be provided by ordinance, require
- 25 owners of property to cut and remove trees afflicted with the
- 26 Dutch elm or other disease which threatens to injure or destroy
- 27 shade trees in the township, under regulations prescribed by
- 28 ordinance. Upon failure of [any such] an owner to comply with
- 29 [such] the notice, the township may cause the work to be done by
- 30 the township and levy and collect the cost thereof from the

- 1 owner of the property. The cost of [such] the work shall be a
- 2 lien upon the premises from the time of the commencement of the
- 3 work, which date shall be fixed by [the] a township engineer and
- 4 shall be filed with the township secretary. [Any such] The lien
- 5 may be collected by action in assumpsit or by lien filed in the
- 6 manner provided by law for the filing and collection of
- 7 municipal claims.
- 8 Section 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
