AN ACT

Amending the act of October 24, 2018 (P.L.733, No.118), entitled "An act providing for requirements for documentation of the 2 need for an assistance animal or service animal in housing 3 and for the offenses of misrepresentation of entitlement to 4 assistance animal or service animal and misrepresentation of 5 animal as assistance animal or service animal," further 6 providing for definitions; establishing the trained service 7 animal card; providing for the documentation of service dogs 8 and for admittance of registered service animal to public 9 accommodations; establishing a trained service animal card 10 database; providing for immunity from liability; and making 11 12 editorial changes. 13 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 14 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. The act of October 24, 2018 (P.L.733, No.118), 15 16 known as the Assistance and Service Animal Integrity Act, is 17 amended by adding a chapter heading to read: CHAPTER 1

- Section [1] 101. Short title. 21
- 22 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Assistance

- 1 and Service Animal Integrity Act.
- 2 Section 3. Section 2 of the act is repealed:
- 3 [Section 2. Definitions.

- 14 "Association." The owners association established to operate

- 17 "Disability." A physical or mental impairment which
- 18 substantially limits one or more major life activities.
- "Service animal." An animal, other than an assistance
- 20 animal, that qualifies as a service animal under the Americans
- 21 with Disabilities Act of 1990 (Public Law 101-336, 104 Stat.
- 22 327) or as a guide or support animal under the act of October
- 23 27, 1955 (P.L.744, No.222), known as the Pennsylvania Human
- 24 Relations Act, or local law.]
- 25 Section 4. The act is amended by adding a section to read:

- 30 "Department." The Department of Health of the Commonwealth.

- 1 "Disability." A physical or mental impairment which
- 2 <u>substantially limits one or more major life activities.</u>

- 7 Section 6. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 8 <u>Section 301. Definitions.</u>
- 9 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 10 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 11 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 12 "Assistance animal." An animal, other than a service animal,
- 13 that qualifies as a reasonable accommodation under 42 U.S.C. Ch.
- 14 45 (relating to fair housing), 29 U.S.C. Ch. 16 (relating to
- 15 <u>vocational rehabilitation and other rehabilitation services) or</u>
- 16 <u>local law. The term includes an emotional support animal when</u>
- 17 the animal qualifies as a reasonable accommodation.
- 18 "Association." The owners association established to operate
- 19 <u>a condominium</u>, cooperative or planned community located in this
- 20 <u>Commonwealth</u>.
- 21 <u>"Service animal." An animal, other than an assistance</u>
- 22 animal, that qualifies as a service animal under the Americans
- 23 with Disabilities Act of 1990 (Public Law 101-336, 104 Stat.
- 24 327) or as a guide or support animal under the act of October
- 25 <u>27, 1955 (P.L.744, No.222), known as the Pennsylvania Human</u>
- 26 Relations Act.
- 27 Section 7. Sections 3, 4, 5 and 6 of the act are renumbered
- 28 to read:
- 29 Section [3] 302. Documentation of disability and disability-
- 30 related need.

- 1 (a) Right to request documentation. -- A landlord or
- 2 association that receives a request from a person to make an
- 3 exception to the landlord's or association's policy prohibiting
- 4 animals or limiting the size, weight, breed or number of animals
- 5 on the landlord's property or within property controlled by the
- 6 association because the person requires the use of an assistance
- 7 animal or service animal may require the person to produce
- 8 documentation of the disability and disability-related need for
- 9 the animal only if the disability or disability-related need is
- 10 not readily apparent or known to the landlord or, in the case of
- 11 an association, the executive board of the association.
- 12 (b) Minimum standards. -- Any documentation proving that a
- 13 person is disabled and requires the use of an assistance animal
- 14 or service animal as a reasonable accommodation in housing under
- 15 the Fair Housing Act (Public Law 90-284, 42 U.S.C. § 3601 et
- 16 seq.), the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (Public Law 93-112, 29
- 17 U.S.C. § 701 et seq.), the Americans with Disabilities Act of
- 18 1990 (Public Law 101-336, 104 Stat. 327) or the act of October
- 19 27, 1955 (P.L.744, No.222), known as the Pennsylvania Human
- 20 Relations Act, or local law shall:
- 21 (1) Be in writing.
- 22 (2) Be reliable and based on direct knowledge of the
- 23 person's disability and disability-related need for the
- 24 assistance animal or service animal.
- 25 (3) Describe the person's disability-related need for
- the assistance animal or service animal.
- 27 Section [4] <u>303</u>. Immunity.
- Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, a landlord or
- 29 association shall not be liable for injuries caused by a
- 30 person's assistance animal or service animal permitted on the

- 1 landlord's property or within property controlled by the
- 2 association as a reasonable accommodation to assist the person
- 3 with a disability under the Fair Housing Act (Public Law 90-284,
- 4 42 U.S.C. § 3601 et seq.), section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act
- 5 of 1973 (Public Law 93-112, 29 U.S.C. § 701 et seq.), the
- 6 Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (Public Law 101-336, 104
- 7 Stat. 327), the act of October 27, 1955 (P.L.744, No.222), known
- 8 as the Pennsylvania Human Relations Act, or any other Federal,
- 9 State or local law.
- 10 Section [5] <u>304</u>. Misrepresentation of entitlement to assistance
- 11 animal or service animal.
- 12 (a) Offense defined. -- A person commits the offense of
- 13 misrepresentation of entitlement to assistance animal or service
- 14 animal if the person intentionally:
- 15 (1) misrepresents to another that the person has a
- disability or disability-related need for the use of an
- 17 assistance animal or service animal in housing; or
- 18 (2) makes materially false statements for the purpose of
- obtaining documentation for the use of an assistance animal
- or service animal in housing.
- 21 (b) Grading.--A person who violates the provisions of
- 22 subsection (a) commits a misdemeanor of the third degree.
- 23 Section [6] 305. Misrepresentation of animal as assistance
- 24 animal or service animal.
- 25 (a) Offense defined. -- A person commits the offense of
- 26 misrepresentation of an animal as an assistance animal or
- 27 service animal if the person intentionally:
- 28 (1) creates a document misrepresenting an animal as an
- assistance animal or service animal for use in housing;
- 30 (2) provides a document to another falsely stating that

- 1 an animal is an assistance animal or service animal for use
- 2 in housing; or
- 3 (3) fits an animal that is not an assistance animal or
- 4 service animal with a harness, collar, vest or sign that
- 5 indicates the animal is an assistance animal or service
- 6 animal for use in housing.
- 7 (b) Grading. -- A person who violates the provisions of
- 8 subsection (a) commits a summary offense and shall, upon
- 9 conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine not to exceed \$1,000.
- 10 Section 8. The act is amended by adding chapters to read:
- 11 <u>CHAPTER 5</u>
- 12 SERVICE ANIMALS IN PUBLIC ACCOMMODATIONS
- 13 <u>Section 501. Definitions.</u>
- 14 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 15 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 16 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 17 "Individual with a disability." An individual who satisfies
- 18 <u>all of the following:</u>
- 19 <u>(1) has a physical or mental impairment that</u>
- 20 <u>substantially limits one or more major life activity;</u>
- 21 (2) has a history or record of an impairment described
- 22 <u>under paragraph (1); and</u>
- 23 (3) is perceived or known by other people as having an
- impairment as described under paragraph (1).
- 25 "Public accommodation." The term shall have the same meaning
- 26 as "public accommodation, resort or amusement" defined under
- 27 <u>section 4(1) of the act of October 27, 1955 (P.L.744, No.222),</u>
- 28 known as the Pennsylvania Human Relations Act.
- 29 "Registered service animal." A service dog that has been
- 30 issued a trained service animal card and is listed in the

- 1 trained service animal card database.
- 2 <u>"Service dog." A dog individually trained to do work or</u>
- 3 perform tasks for the benefit of an individual with a
- 4 <u>disability.</u>
- 5 <u>"Service dog in training." A dog that is being individually</u>
- 6 trained to do work or perform tasks for the benefit of a
- 7 <u>qualified individual with a disability.</u>
- 8 "Trained service animal card." An identification card issued
- 9 by the department to indicate that a dog is a registered service
- 10 animal that includes:
- 11 <u>(1) A specific insignia.</u>
- 12 (2) A photograph of the service dog.
- 13 (3) A photograph of the owner of the service dog.
- "Trained service animal patch." A patch with a specific
- 15 <u>insignia inscribed and issued by the department to indicate that</u>
- 16 <u>a dog is a registered service animal.</u>
- 17 "Trainer of a service dog." An individual who is training a
- 18 service dog to do work or perform tasks for the benefit of an
- 19 individual with a disability.
- 20 <u>Section 502</u>. <u>Trained service animal patch</u>.
- 21 (a) Duty of department. -- The department shall develop, make
- 22 and issue a trained service animal patch.
- 23 (b) Eligibility.--For an individual with a disability to
- 24 receive a trained service animal patch for their service dog,
- 25 the individual with a disability shall provide to the department
- 26 all of the following:
- 27 (1) A completed registered service animal application
- 28 <u>form developed by the department.</u>
- 29 (2) An application fee set by the department. The
- 30 application fee shall be limited to the cost of the trained

- 1 <u>service animal patch and trained service animal card.</u>
- 2 (3) An affidavit signed by the individual with a
- disability submitting the application and the trainer of the
- 4 <u>service dog certifying that the dog is a service dog. The</u>
- 5 <u>affidavit shall list the tasks the service dog is trained to</u>
- 6 <u>perform.</u>
- 7 (4) Documentation from a health care provider
- 8 <u>demonstrating that the individual applying for the trained</u>
- 9 <u>service animal patch is an individual with a disability and</u>
- 10 requires the assistance of a service dog.
- 11 (c) Exception. -- The department may promulgate regulations to
- 12 <u>develop a procedure to address situations in which the trainer</u>
- 13 <u>documentation is not otherwise obtainable but the department</u>
- 14 receives information detailing that training of a service dog is
- 15 sufficient.
- 16 (d) Materials issued by department. -- Within 45 days after
- 17 the receipt of the eligibility information provided for under
- 18 <u>subsection</u> (b), the department shall issue the following
- 19 materials to the individual with a disability:
- 20 (1) A trained service animal patch capable of being
- 21 affixed to clothing or a collar.
- 22 (2) A trained service animal card. The trained service
- 23 animal card shall expire after the death of the registered
- 24 <u>service animal</u>.
- 25 Section 503. Admittance of registered service animal to public
- accommodations.
- 27 (a) Admission. -- Notwithstanding any other provision of law,
- 28 a registered service animal shall be:
- 29 (1) Admitted to any building open to the public.
- 30 (2) Admitted to any public accommodation.

- 1 (3) Allowed access to all common carriers.
- 2 (b) Duty of owner or training. -- A registered service animal
- 3 or service dog in training shall remain under the control of an
- 4 <u>owner or a trainer of a service dog at all times in a public</u>
- 5 <u>accommodation</u>.
- 6 (c) Denying access. -- Regardless of a policy denying pets
- 7 <u>entry to a public accommodation or common carrier, an individual</u>
- 8 with a disability with a registered service animal may not be
- 9 <u>denied entry into a public accommodation or common carrier.</u>
- 10 (d) Additional entrance fee. -- An individual with a
- 11 registered service animal or a trainer of a service dog may not
- 12 be required to pay any additional fee for admittance or usage
- 13 <u>because of the registered service animal.</u>
- 14 (e) Liability.--An individual with a disability or a trainer
- 15 of a service dog shall be liable for any property damage or
- 16 personal injury caused by a registered service animal.
- 17 Section 504. Trained service animal card database.
- 18 (a) Duty of department. -- The department shall develop a
- 19 database containing records of all registered service animals.
- 20 (b) Information collected. -- The database shall contain the
- 21 following information about the registered service animal:
- 22 <u>(1) The name, breed, height and weight.</u>
- 23 (2) The age as of the date of issuance of the trained
- 24 <u>service animal card.</u>
- 25 (3) A description of the registered service animal's
- fur, including color, length and texture.
- 27 (4) A copy of the affidavit submitted to the department
- under section 502(b)(3) and medical documentation provided
- 29 under section 502(b)(4).
- 30 (5) Date of issuance of the trained service animal card.

- 1 <u>Section 505. Immunity from liability.</u>
- 2 An owner of a public accommodation shall not be liable for a
- 3 personal injury or property damage caused by a registered
- 4 <u>service animal or service dog in training so long as the</u>
- 5 personal injury or property damage has no causal relationship
- 6 with the owner of a public accommodation's own negligence,
- 7 recklessness or willful misconduct.
- 8 <u>Section 506. Regulations.</u>
- 9 The department may promulgate regulations as necessary to
- 10 <u>implement this chapter</u>.
- 11 <u>CHAPTER 7</u>
- 12 <u>MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS</u>
- 13 <u>Section 701.</u> (Reserved).
