Mr. SCHRODER. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, could I have the indulgence and the attention of the House for just a brief moment or two? This will not take long.

The SPEAKER. The conferences on the floor, please break up. Mr. Schroder.

Mr. SCHRODER. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, today we are reminded that whenever our emergency services volunteers and rescue personnel answer a call, they are placing themselves on the line and placing themselves in danger no matter how routine that call might at first glance appear to be.

Mr. Speaker, never was that more evident than Monday, a week ago. Monday, March 9, you might recall, was a very wet, rainy, miserable day, and members of the Lionville Fire Company and Uwchlan Ambulance Corps answered a call to assist a driver who had slid off the road on the Pennsylvania Turnpike in the westbound lanes just west of the Downingtown Route 23 interchange. After they arrived at the scene and proceeded to begin to place the woman who was driving the vehicle into the ambulance, a tractor-trailer that was coming along overturned and ended up slamming into the rescue workers and their vehicles. The result, Mr. Speaker, is that nine volunteer firefighters and ambulance personnel were injured, some were very seriously injured — a couple remain in the hospital even today — and one, Mr. David Good, 36 years old, lost his life during that particular accident.

Therefore, Mr. Speaker, the community has lost something precious and something that is increasingly rare, and that is an emergency services volunteer, and a wife lost a husband, and two teenage boys lost a father as a result of that mishap.

Mr. Speaker, I can tell you that I had the opportunity to visit with some of the firefighters last Thursday at the fire station, and as one of the injured members said to me, it will probably take them a lot longer to get over the mental and emotional impact of this tragedy than it will for them to actually recover from their physical injuries, but I am pleased to report that the members seem to be dealing with this tragic accident as best as can be expected.

I think it is also worthy to note the outpouring of help and assistance that they have received from both near and far. That was certainly evident at the funeral for David Good and it also was evident at the firehall that afternoon where firefighters from across Chester County were there to support the Lionville Fire Company members and to answer any calls that might come in.

With this resolution, Mr. Speaker, we pause for a moment here today to honor the memory of David Good, wish a speedy recovery to those who were injured, and commend the Lionville Fire Company and the Uwchlan Ambulance Corps for their continued dedication to service in the community.

Mr. Speaker, there is one thing that I know for sure, and that is that the members of the Lionville Fire Company and the Uwchlan Ambulance Corps will be there to answer the next call when it does come.

So I thank the House for its time, and of course, I ask for a "yes" vote on the resolution.

Emergency Response can always be dangerous.

Sadly, it was tragic for David Good. Our prayers are with David, his wife Mary Ann and his two sons, Jonathan and Jason. May God look after them in their grief.

Our prayers are also with the other injured volunteers of the Lionville Fire Company and the Uwchlan Ambulance Corps.

Mr. BUNT. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, this legislation addresses four topics within Title 3 of the Pennsylvania Code. Number one, it incorporates the Pennsylvania Agricultural Commodities Marketing Act of 1968 into Title 3 and specifies that aquacultural products are indeed agricultural commodities. This addition to the definition will allow the aquacultural industry the opportunity to consider a referendum to create a commodity marketing program for the promotion of

aquacultural products — fish. Other commodity marketing programs exist for apples, potatoes, vegetables, peaches, nectarines, and dairy products.

Number two, it would require the Department of Agriculture for avian influenza eradication and control under the authority of Act 100 of 1996.

Three, it replaces the current definition of "garbage" in Act 100 of 1996, replacing it with a definition more satisfactory to the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

Lastly, it amends section 4112(C) of Title 3 to extend the deadline for testing and inspection of all scanning devices until June 30, 1999. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

On December 10, 1997, this legislative chamber unanimously passed **HB 1757** by a final vote of 192 to 0. In a similar manner, our esteemed colleagues in the Pennsylvania Senate unanimously passed an amended version of **HB 1757** by a vote of 48 to 0.

In summary, Mr. Speaker, this bill will provide specific and significant penalties for those dealers who attempt to peddle their poison using children. The only aspect of **HB 1757** that was changed in the Senate was the elimination of the mandatory minimum sentences assigned to persons convicted of solicitation of minors to traffic drugs. However, the most important aspect of this bill remains intact.

HB 1757 is an important legislative measure that would help protect and increase the safety of our children by giving local enforcement officers an effective tool in apprehending and prosecuting drug dealers.

Mr. Speaker, I ask my distinguished colleagues in this House for a "yes" vote on concurrence. Thank you.
