An Act providing for the financial stability of cities of the second class; establishing an authority empowered to assist cities of the second class in their financial affairs and to issue findings and recommendations to cities of the second class and to the General Assembly; providing for powers and duties of the authority; authorizing each city of the second class and the authority to enter into intergovernmental cooperation agreements and specifying certain terms of such agreements and ordinances whereby cities of the second class enter into such agreements; empowering the authority to incur indebtedness, receive revenues, acquire the obligations of assisted cities, make loans and offer other financial assistance to such cities subject to conditions; establishing procedures for the preparation and review of financial plans of cities of the second class while bonds of the authority are outstanding and providing remedies for failure to adhere to such plans; requiring certain contracts to be consistent with the financial plan; making certain provisions with respect to short-term borrowing by cities of the second class; establishing procedures for handling authority funds, and providing for certain payments to the authority; providing security for bonds and notes issued by the authority; authorizing the creation of a debt service reserve fund and providing for its maintenance; granting to the holders of the authority's indebtedness and to the authority certain remedies in the event of default by the authority or by an assisted city on authorized obligations; authorizing cities of the second class to receive financial assistance from the authority under certain terms and conditions; establishing the method for the appointment and composition of the authority board; prohibiting the authority and assisted cities from filing a petition under Federal bankruptcy statutes; authorizing an appropriation for authority operating expenses; authorizing cities of the second class to impose an optional sales and use tax; authorizing cities of the second class to impose certain taxes for the authority; creating the Second Class City Sales and Use Tax Fund and the Second Class City Fiscal Authority Tax Fund; authorizing emergency payment deferral; providing

jurisdiction for challenges to this act; making an appropriation; and making a repeal.

Thelma Williams and the seventh grade class from Bala Cynwyd Middle School for taking the lead in a statewide campaign to stop school violence.

These students, greatly concerned by incidents of school violence all across the nation including Pennsylvania, decided to get directly involved in a month-long campaign to bring attention to the crisis. Their teacher contacted both Senator Tilghman and me, asking that we consider introducing resolutions that they would draft, and the young people also encouraged Governor Ridge to sign a proclamation, Stop the Violence Month in Pennsylvania, and this resolution, as I stated, the proclamation, was written by the students and signed by the Governor.

We are happy to help these outstanding students with a hands-on learning experience that recruits Pennsylvanians everywhere to combat violence in our schools. I have to say that they have enlisted and this resolution has been cosigned by 90 other Pennsylvania schools, and it defines school violence as any form of physical, emotional, mental, verbal, or sexual abuse with the intention to damage, humiliate, intimidate, threaten, or invade the personal space of a person. The resolution notes that 25 percent of students nationwide have been the victim of a violent act that occurred in or around school and that approximately 800,000 6th through 12th grade students carried a gun to school last year.

The interesting thing about this project is that in enlisting 90 other schools throughout the Commonwealth, these are students from all over the Commonwealth, not just southeast Pennsylvania, and I would assume that almost every one of us sitting here is represented by students who have signed onto this.

So I urge all of my fellow members of the House of Representatives to honor our students everywhere by adopting this resolution. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

## **BILL ON THIRD CONSIDERATION**

The House proceeded to third consideration of SB 1, PN 1819, entitled:

An Act to provide from the General Fund for the expenses of the Legislative and Executive, Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth, the public debt and for the public schools for the fiscal year July 1, 2000, to June 30, 2001, for certain institutions and organizations, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining

unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2000; to provide appropriations from the State Lottery Fund, the Energy Conservation and Assistance Fund, the Hazardous Material Response Fund, The State Stores Fund, the Milk Marketing Fund, the Home Investment Trust Fund, the Emergency Medical Services Operating Fund, the Ben Franklin/IRC Partnership Fund, the Tuition Payment Fund, the Banking Department Fund, the Firearm Records Check Fund and the Tobacco Settlement Fund to the Executive Department; to provide appropriations from the Judicial Computer System Augmentation Account to the Judicial Department for the fiscal year July 1, 2000, to June 30, 2001, to provide appropriations from the Motor License Fund for the fiscal year July 1, 2000, to June 30, 2001, for the proper operation of the several departments of the Commonwealth and the Pennsylvania State Police authorized to spend Motor License Fund moneys; and to provide for the appropriation of Federal funds to the Executive Department of the Commonwealth and for the establishment of restricted receipt accounts for the fiscal year July 1, 2000, to June 30, 2001, and for the payment of bills remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2000.

On the question, Will the House agree to the bill on third consideration?

The SPEAKER. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Lancaster County, the gentleman, Mr. Barley, who speaks with unanimous consent.

Mr. BARLEY. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Very briefly, we have an opportunity---

The SPEAKER. Will the gentleman yield for a moment, please.

Members, these are the opening remarks on the conduct of the House in connection with SB 1, the budget, presumably the budget for the Commonwealth for the coming fiscal year. We have asked Mr. Barley to address the House to give us a bird's-eve view of what we might expect over the next day or two or three.

Mr. Barley.

Mr. BARLEY. Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker.

Today we begin the process of amending the budget for the fiscal year 2000-2001. This is an opportunity for the members of the House of Representatives to offer their amendments. They have filed a total of 250 amendments over a period of 13 days, from March 23 or actually March 21 until April 3. We have been able to process the amendments with the cooperation of the Democrat Appropriations staff as well. We have a process where we have enjoyed cooperation throughout until today, and certainly that cooperation continues here today as we move the budget process forward.

I would just like to mention a few very brief housekeeping aspects of the budget. We are beginning, obviously, now to proceed with the amendment process. The majority leader has indicated he would like to continue through this evening, possibly until around 10 o'clock, and then come back in tomorrow morning at 9 o'clock and continue the process, so that, again, we will provide a very timely manner and a very timely fashion that we can conclude the amendments. We would like to then move into the nonpreferreds immediately as well.

So again, I just want to thank my counterpart, Representative Evans, and I look forward to the amendment process and discussing it and debating it today and tomorrow. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Philadelphia, the Democratic Appropriations Committee chairman, Mr. Evans.

Mr. Speaker, I, too, rise to indicate, especially to members on this side of the aisle, on your desk there is a blue book which basically explains all of the various amendments, the 250 that the chairman described. It lays it all out for you. I hope you really pay attention to the amendments so we can move through this process smoothly. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

On the question recurring, Will the House agree to the bill on third consideration?

#### Mr. COHEN offered the following amendment No. A1449:

Amend Bill, page 386, by inserting between lines 18 and 19

Section 2010. Transfer from Department of Corrections.-An amount equal to 1% of the total Commonwealth funds appropriated to the Department of Corrections is transferred to the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency for community-oriented policing grants. These funds shall be distributed to municipalities operating local law enforcement agencies or municipalities contracting for local law enforcement services with another municipality. Grants to municipalities shall be based on the following formula: 50% shall be based on population and 50% shall be based on the number of Part 1 offenses under the Pennsylvania Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program for the preceding calendar year. Municipalities failing to report are ineligible to receive funds.

On the question,

Will the House agree to the amendment?

The SPEAKER. This amendment, 1449, is a technical change replacing amendment No. 1008.

Mr. Cohen.

Mr. COHEN. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, this amendment seeks to allocate \$11 million to the Commission on Crime and Delinquency to provide statewide funding to aid communities in hiring additional policemen or providing for additional man-hours to deter crime in our communities. Under this amendment, every municipality in this Commonwealth will receive additional funds for community-oriented policing services.

Mr. Speaker, many of us in the House have been advocates of putting more cops on the beat, or community policing. We have passed this amendment in previous budget years only to have it stripped out of the final version.

The public supports these efforts to provide for more police in each of our communities. This amendment offers the House an opportunity to support our many communities in their efforts to provide a safe and secure environment to live and to raise families. This amendment provides the opportunity to place the equivalent of 275 more policemen on the streets and in our communities, assuming a cost of \$40,000 per policeman.

This amendment distributes half the money based solely on population, and the other half is distributed based on the number of serious crimes reported in each community. By serious crimes, I mean those reported in part 1 of the Uniform Crime Report, including crimes of murder, manslaughter, rape, robbery, assault, burglary, larceny, vehicular homicide, and arson.

Distributing half the money based on population, I believe, recognizes the political realities in this Commonwealth that all communities in some measure feel threatened by crime.

Distributing money based on the number of serious crimes recognizes that we must fight crime where it occurs. We must begin to put our resources where the problem is greatest. If we do not fight to contain and deter crime where the problem is greatest, we can be assured that the crime problem will spread, as it has been spreading, to neighboring relatively save and secure communities.

I sent to each member of the House a printout which delineates how much money will be available to Pennsylvania's municipalities, by county, should this amendment pass. A few were eligible for more than is estimated in the printout because they do not now report the crime statistics required in the funding formula. Should this amendment or anything like it become law, I am confident that crime statistics reporting will quickly reach 100 percent.

Mr. Speaker, as the rule requires, my community policing amendment takes 1 percent from the Department of Corrections to fund these additional crime prevention efforts. Spending a small percentage of the corrections budget on crime prevention is an approach that some States like Michigan have taken.

Mr. Speaker, the real question that this amendment raises is, will this House support hiring 275 additional police equivalents to deter crime in our neighborhoods? I hope the answer to that is yes. I hope this will sail through the House and be backed fully by the leadership in negotiations with the Senate.

The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

The Chair recognizes the gentleman, Mr. Barley.

Mr. BARLEY. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, the amendment that is before us cuts from the Department of Corrections 253 corrections officers. Since we debated the budget a year ago, we have had two escapes from two different corrections institutions in Pennsylvania. There have been many press releases generated by members of this House and others in the law enforcement arena calling for an increase in funding for our State prisons. As I have indicated, the 1-percent cut that this amendment calls for would eliminate 253 corrections officers.

Now, in addition to that, this amendment will reallocate this \$11 million for the Commission on Crime and Delinquency. I think it is very important for members to listen to this point: If you are a Representative from the city of Philadelphia, you probably will be more inclined to support this amendment, because 25 percent of the money being reallocated finds its way to Philadelphia. Now, if you happen to represent Greene County, .04 percent finds its way there. If you represent Fulton County, .01 percent finds its way to Fulton County, and I could go on. Ridgway Borough in Elk County receives .06 percent of the funding.

So, Mr. Speaker, the redistribution is grossly inequitable, and as I have mentioned, if you are from Philadelphia, you probably will disagree with me. For the benefit of the members, I have provided a printout that will show you specifically what this amendment will mean for your municipalities. I would urge members to pay attention to that, and I believe we should be voting "no" on this amendment.

The SPEAKER. The Chair is about to recognize the gentleman, Mr. Cohen. However, prior to doing that, I would remind the members that, again, with the budget we have certain rules that apply that do not ordinarily apply. The members are limited to speaking – other than the sponsor of the amendment – the members are limited to speaking on the

subject one time. Everyone other than the majority and minority leaders, every other member is restricted to a 5-minute period that he may debate.

Mr. Cohen.

Mr. COHEN. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, this budget provides for an increase in the corrections budget by \$41,100,000. In addition to the \$41,100,000 increase in this budget document, the Ridge administration is seeking an additional \$43-million increase that will be presented in the form of a supplemental appropriation. Therefore, there will be an additional \$84,100,000 available to the corrections budget, which could easily cover those 250 extra correction guards. There is no need to defeat this amendment in order to have extra correction guards. In addition, I am told that our big problem with correction guards has been filling the vacancies year after year. We have 2 to 5 percent of the positions that we have the money for unfilled because of a lack of people who are qualified and willing to fill them.

But beyond the question of whether or not money should come from this particular pie, beyond that question, this really is an artificial construction that is forced upon us by the rules. Under our rules, in order to take money and put it for any worthwhile purpose, we have to take it away from some other worthwhile purpose. Clearly it is the job of the conference committee, when everything is all sorted out, we will have one document, and it will be up to the conference committee to determine exactly how much money goes everywhere. If Mr. Barley wants to keep this extra \$84 million in the correction budget, instead of reducing the increase from \$84 million to \$73 million, I am sure he could use his influence to have all \$84 million of the increase, which brings the total correction budget to \$1.2 billion in this budget.

Mr. Speaker, the real question is not whether we take a minute percentage of the corrections budget or whether we take the money from somewhere else. The real question is, do we want to deter crime by having police form a visible presence? Right now, our crime-fighting policy in this Commonwealth is basically just, let us lengthen sentences. Does that work to some degree? Yes. Could there be policies that work to a better degree? Yes. If there were more visible deterrents, if there were more visible police out in the communities, many people who are on the borderline of whether or not to commit crimes or not would decide, no, they are going to be caught; they do not want to commit a crime. The people who commit crimes are not by and large great long-term strategic thinkers. They commit crimes thinking they are not going to get caught. Of course, the odds are overwhelming they will be caught, but we can strengthen those odds and create a much more visible deterrent by giving more money to police throughout the State.

I urge support of this amendment, support of efforts to deter crime. The deterrence of crime saves this Commonwealth an enormous amount of money. Our corrections budget of \$1.2 billion is the highest it has ever gone. Every year we set a new high. Deterring crime saves this Commonwealth money as well as makes our citizens feel a lot safer than they otherwise would feel.

I urge support of vigorous, active crime-fighting deterrents. Thank you.

The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

#### **GUESTS INTRODUCED**

The SPEAKER. The Chair interrupts the deliberations to welcome to the hall of the House today a group from the Ben Franklin Middle School in Bristol Township, the guests of Representative Tony Melio. These guests are a band who just a short time ago performed in the rotunda. David Bowman is the band director. The 41 students comprising the band are in the gallery. Would they please rise to be acknowledged.

#### **CONSIDERATION OF SB 1 CONTINUED**

The SPEAKER. The Chair recognizes at this time the gentleman, Mr. Hasay, from Luzerne County.

Prior to the gentleman continuing, I repeat the interpretation of the rules that no one may speak more than once on a subject unless that person is the sponsor of the amendment. That does not apply to the majority or minority leader, the majority or minority Appropriations Committee chairman. All others are restricted.

Mr. Hasay.

Mr. HASAY. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, I come from northeast Pennsylvania, Luzerne County. It would be, Mr. Speaker, insane, insane to cut the Department of Corrections budget. I have an institution called Chase and Retreat that are older institutions and need as much money for facility improvements, need as much money as they can get for staff personnel, for prison guards. Mr. Speaker, I oppose this amendment. The prisons are now understaffed. They need to be staffed much more fully, and some of those facilities that were built in the 1960s need new fences, new institutional maintenance facilities as well. So, Mr. Speaker, I oppose this amendment and would hope the other members would oppose it as well.

There were two escapes at Chase last summer, and it was very trying on the community and the residents in that particular area. So, Mr. Speaker, we need more prison guards; we need more staff at our State correctional institutions. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

Mr. Sather.

Mr. SATHER. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

First off, I have two State correctional facilities in my district. Both are housed in Huntingdon County, and we were one of the unfortunate ones where there was an escape, and I can assure you that those people that I represent back there want to make sure, as I have said in the past here on the floor, that they are safe and secure on their property, and I think they have every right to expect that.

The other point that I need to make, I looked at the numbers that would be provided to me for additional services of municipal police or others, and I had a low of \$800; I had a high of \$6,000 for one of those. I do not think I could hire too many additional policemen and put them on the beat, if you will; maybe provide a little overtime, but I do not think it addresses this problem that we really need.

I think it is something that needs to be looked at, but I do not think this is the way to do it. I oppose this amendment.

The SPEAKER. The gentleman from Lancaster County, Mr. Strittmatter.

Gruitza

Mr. STRITTMATTER. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

I rise to ask for a "no" vote on this amendment.

It is a very good cause to have community policing. It is very bad to be taking it from the Corrections Department. We have a crisis of understaffing with our correction officers. We have a crisis of underpaying our correction officers. This is not the time to go and hurt them again. They have been waiting for many years to be paid for what they do. We should start now. We should not be taking more money away from them.

We had before us in the State Government Committee many of the correction officers come forward and point out their plight. It brought tears to everyone's eyes to find that one correction officer who has been working on behalf of all of our citizens for the last 6 years, keeping these people, who, by the way, are not in these correction facilities for missing choir practice; they are in there because they are very dangerous and they should be kept away from us, and for 6 years this person has worked as a correction officer and is a father of four and has not had one weekend off in 6 years. I think it is terrible to even think about taking one penny from the Corrections Department when we are treating our correction officers this way, and I would ask for a "no" vote. Thank you.

Mr. **DeWEESE** offered the following amendment No. **A1016**:

Amend Bill, page 386, by inserting between lines 18 and 19

Section 2010. Prison privatization prohibited.-Commonwealth funds appropriated to the Department of Corrections shall not be used to privatize and/or out-source prison operations. All contractual agreements entered into prior to the adoption of this act, and their renewal, are exempt.

On the question, Will the House agree to the amendment?

The SPEAKER. The Chair recognizes the gentleman, Mr. DeWeese, on amendment 1016.

Mr. DeWEESE. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The essence of this language is to assert the will of the House and hopefully the General Assembly that our penitentiaries will not be privatized. This has been a keen issue in the body politic in recent years, and we have affirmed our support of this same amendment on three consecutive budget debates. It has been a bipartisan vote. We have had help from the Republicans, and most of the Democrats in phalanx have supported the theme, the concept, the idea that incarceration by State authorities should be within State facilities, that we should not under any circumstances privatize our big penitentiaries, and if this measure receives an affirmative vote, it will send a message to our colleagues in the State Senate and to the community in general that we are irrevocably firm in our commitment to making certain that our penitentiaries remain under the arm of the State government.

So I would ask for an affirmative vote for this amendment. Thank you very much.

The SPEAKER. The gentleman, Mr. Barley.

Mr. BARLEY. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, I would like to point out for the members that this amendment is not entirely about privatizing the ownership of State prisons, and you may or may not have a strong feeling one way or the other on that. But what this amendment does, and I think it is important for members to understand, it would prohibit the Department of Corrections from using funds for privatizing, contracting, or outsourcing any services that they may choose to outsource. Examples: For instance, the State corrections institution in Chester, Pennsylvania, they did a cost analysis, and it showed very clearly that it was less expensive to contract for commissary, nursing, drug and alcohol treatment, and a variety of other services. This amendment is more than prohibiting privatization of prison ownership, management, and so forth. This amendment would roll, actually roll the process back. It would undo what is happening in many of our prisons today where we have, for instance, we have outsourced laundry. Maybe that is another good example. It has been very efficient, it has been very practical, for the laundry to be picked up on vans or trucks, taken out to a private laundry, laundered, returned. It really has nothing to do with employees from within. I do not think there is any magic in having the washing machines and the dryers located within the four walls of a prison and that the employees actually operating them should be State employees. This amendment would have the effect of mandating that as contracts that now provide for that to be outsourced would be coming due.

So I want members to be aware of that as they cast their vote. I certainly will be voting against the amendment, and I would hope members with that information could make an informed decision as they cast their votes.

The SPEAKER. The gentleman, Mr. DeWeese.

Mr. DeWEESE. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The big contracting out that we do now in the Commonwealth is health care, and if you look at the text of the amendment, we are not trying to abrogate any contracts that are already in place. I would agree with the honorable gentleman from Lancaster that from time to time, some of these outside contracts are appropriate, and we have as a State government realized outsourcing and out-contracting historically. What this amendment does, Mr. Speaker, it says that we have already reached the threshold that is appropriate. We do not want to go any further. We do not want to privatize our facilities any more. They are already quasi-privatized in a variety of areas, especially in the very, very abundant area of health care, dental care. We are already doing a lot of things with non-State employees in our penitentiaries. But I think this is the threshold. There is a liability question that looms over all debates regarding privatization, and again and again and again, on three occasions, Mr. Speaker, this House has voted to make certain that our contracting has gone far enough.

So for the fourth year in a row during the budget we are trying to send a message to the State Senate that although we do have some private affairs within our prison situation, we think it is enough. That is why we are asking for an affirmative vote. But the gentleman is wrong. Any contracts now existing will be honored by this legislation. There will be privatization that has already taken place that will be unmitigated by this language. So I would again ask for an affirmative vote. Thank you.

The SPEAKER. Mr. Barley.

Mr. BARLEY. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

If the gentleman misinterpreted my statement, I apologize, or if I was not clear. I was not indicating or would not want to indicate that present contracts could be abrogated or in any way modified. As a matter of fact, the amendment would allow for existing contracts to be renewed in existing institutions. However, the point I was making, as we find and as we have discovered, many of these programs have been very successful, and as subsequent prisons come online or as we review services in prisons, we would not be able to duplicate the same level of services that we are now providing through the private sector in prisons that may not have them being provided for them today.

So again, technically we are not voiding any contracts; I would agree with that, but we really are tying the hands of the prison system, and in some cases we could be incurring additional costs to the taxpayers.

The SPEAKER. The gentleman, Mr. Birmelin.

Mr. BIRMELIN. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Let me follow up on what Representative Barley just said and give you an illustration why I think this amendment does us a disservice in Pennsylvania and in particular with our Department of Corrections. And let me say from the beginning of my argument that I, too, am opposed to the privatization of the prison as a whole. I do not think it would be wise or anywhere in our best interests to privatize our entire prison system or any one of our particular prisons. But in one of our newest prisons that we have opened up in the city of Chester, the Chester State Correctional Institution, the Department of Corrections has a contract with an organization called Gaudenzia. Now, I am not sure how long they have been around; I know it has been a long time, but the Gaudenzia drug and alcohol counseling program was brought into Chester SCI to deal specifically with counseling those inmates who have drug and alcohol problems. It is a highly respected and internationally recognized, effective organization for drug and alcohol counseling, and what we have in Chester is an experiment of sorts in that they were the first prison that brought in an outside consultant to do their drug and alcohol counseling. If they are successful, and one can only hope that they are, and the Department of Corrections says, well, we would like to provide this type of drug and alcohol counseling through Gaudenzia, this organization or a similar organization, in years to come, this amendment would prevent that from happening.

This amendment takes away flexibility. This amendment takes away the opportunity to build on success, and I think that

would be a mistake. So for that and for other reasons I, too, would ask for a "no" vote on this amendment. Thank you.

The SPEAKER. The gentleman, Mr. Sather.

Mr. SATHER. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

I will be very brief.

I, too, support this amendment. When we talk about privatizing our State prison system, it goes to a more serious issue of, again, what people back in my home district are calling the lowest whether-we-know-it-is-responsible-or-not bidder.

And the other thing he talked about is outsourcing. I have an acute-care hospital that had to wait and wait and wait to receive funds that were due them by outsourcing a contractor that was not in the immediate area, and I think that is an issue that we need to look at; that is something that Corrections ought to look at.

But as far as being supportive of the whole idea, the whole concept, of privatization, I think you will find that the majority of people who have a facility in their backyard are not too enthused about it. Thank you very much.

The SPEAKER. On the question, the gentleman, Mr. Hasay. Mr. HASAY. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, I rise to support the gentleman from Greene County on this amendment. I do not think we need to go any further in privatization of our State correctional facilities. I think it is important, and I think the Commonwealth has a responsibility, a responsibility of protecting the public where these institutions lie. I do not want some prisoner being watched by some individual that is making the minimum wage. I want professional people in our institutions, Mr. Speaker, to protect the public and the safety of the communities.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Support the amendment.

This amendment stipulates that no less than \$2 million of the appropriation to DCED (Department of Community and Economic Development) for the Pennsylvania Technology Investment Authority shall be earmarked for the Pittsburgh supercomputer.

Over the past 13 years, this State has given \$18 million toward the Pittsburgh supercomputer and, in that process, has leveraged \$230 million of Federal and private investment. Much of that Federal money requires State participation, and this appropriation would continue that just by earmarking at least \$2 million this year, and I urge a positive vote. Thank you.

Mr. TANGRETTI. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, if anybody has had the distinct honor and pleasure of driving the parkway east from Westmoreland County on the parkway and reaching the Squirrel Hill tunnels at rush hour, one immediately knows the reason for this amendment. The geography of access to the city of Pittsburgh from the east is hindered dramatically by the tunnels, and we have been, a lot of us in the eastern suburbs and eastern counties, have been complaining for years that we cannot build enough highways or bypasses or anything else that would solve this problem, and I can remember as a boy many individuals commuting by train who had employment, and for other reasons - for recreation, whether it be the Steelers or the Pirates or a cultural event - being able to go into the city of Pittsburgh by that means. This is an effort to take \$500,000 and take a look at the process of perhaps a commuting access using existing rail lines to the city of Pittsburgh.

I would ask all of those of you in this chamber to support this amendment, even though you may not have a necessary reason to do that immediately, but I suggest to you, if you have the opportunity to drive to Pittsburgh from the east, you would vote for it in a second. So I would ask for an affirmative vote. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

On the question, Mr. Barley.

Mr. BARLEY. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

For the benefit of the members, this is an amendment that specifically proposes a line item of \$500,000 for the benefit of a specific legislative district and a specific county that should otherwise be handled through the process of the county planning commission, their transportation department of the county planning commission, and the Department of Transportation. We provide for grant money that is allocated on a competitive basis for all 67 counties of Pennsylvania.

Now, if I were the gentleman from Westmoreland County, and I certainly do not fault him for being here today at the microphone advocating for a special one-time \$500,000 grant that will benefit his local community, but I do not believe we should be in the business of establishing line item after line item that will allocate several hundred thousand dollars to specific areas when we have a mechanism in place that does this for all 67 counties fairly, does it in a competitive fashion.

500,000

So I would urge members to oppose this amendment, really more from a standpoint of being fair to the other 66 counties in Pennsylvania.

The SPEAKER. Mr. Tangretti, for the second time on the amendment.

Mr. TANGRETTI. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

With all due respect to the chairman of the Appropriations Committee, I do have to at least correct a couple of items. First, this does not specifically benefit my district, although my district is part of it. There are a number of other districts and areas and counties who would have access to a commuter line from Westmoreland County into Allegheny County.

Secondly, I do sit on the advisory committee for the Southwestern Pennsylvania Commission, and they are in the midst of putting together a corridor study. This would be a means of augmenting that study so that it can be enhanced and perhaps speed it up.

I think we have waited long enough in the eastern part of our western Pennsylvania area, if you will permit, and I think we need to get this done. So I would respectfully disagree with my colleague from Lancaster County and ask for an affirmative vote.

Mr. LaGROTTA. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, as the members of this House know, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania disburses millions of State and Federal dollars every year to local municipal county governments for road and bridge design, repair, and maintenance. Up until I had a project in my district several weeks ago that I had been involved with, I did not realize that there was nothing in statute that required the Department of Transportation to verify that work had been completed before actually reimbursing the county or the municipality for that work. In other words, a county or a city or a borough can bill PennDOT for work that they say is done, and PennDOT does not have to verify that the work was done before reimbursing the county or the local government. I think that is something, Mr. Speaker, that this House needs to change, and that is exactly what this amendment would do, and it is very simple. It simply says that the Department of Transportation shall verify that any work that they reimburse a local unit of government for has been completed, verified, and approved by the department before State and Federal dollars are disbursed for reimbursement.

It is just a good-government bill, Mr. Speaker. It helps us better manage our taxpayers' dollars, and I would ask that the House vote in favor of this amendment.

Miss MANN. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

This amendment increases the appropriation to DCED for housing development by about \$10 million, and it reduces an equal amount from 22 various administrative and general government operation line items.

I offer this amendment because housing is basic to a quality life, because Pennsylvania lags far behind our neighboring States per capita in the expenditure for affordable housing. At 62 cents per capita, we lag behind Maryland that is at \$10.24 per capita, New York at \$9.06, and New Jersey at \$2.59 per capita. With this increase, we will near the \$2 per capita mark.

Affordable housing is an increasingly significant issue as our State's population grows older. Without funding to rehab and retrofit housing of seniors, many of our elderly will lose their independence and turn to more expensive forms of housing such as nursing homes. Affordable housing provides a more stable environment for our children, provides better economic opportunities and less dependence on the State welfare system. Affordable housing is a key to our efforts to develop strong and safe neighborhoods.

This is an investment in the people of our Commonwealth, and I ask for an affirmative vote. Thank you.

The SPEAKER. The gentleman, Mr. Thomas, on the question.

Mr. THOMAS. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, I could rise and probably double if not triple the reasons that the previous speaker gave for support of increasing the State's appropriation to housing and redevelopment, but I think that she articulated some very sound and credible reasons as to why we need to increase this line item, and I stand in support and urge my colleagues to support this amendment, amendment 1035, and let us move forward. Thank you.

The SPEAKER. On the question, the Chair recognizes Ms. Mundy.

Ms. MUNDY. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, I rise today to ask you to support an amendment to the State budget that would begin to provide some prevention and some ongoing assistance to at-risk families and their children. Amendment 1039 provides \$6 million in grant funding, predictable grant funding, for home visitation programs.

Representative Pat Browne and I in the House and State Senators Dent and O'Pake in the Senate introduced recently a bill called the Ounce of Prevention Act. It is grant support for home visitation programs that are already in existence in Pennsylvania that are working to provide assistance to at-risk families with newborns until the children are up to 5 years of age or until they start Head Start, whichever comes first.

Home visitation programs help at-risk parents be better parents. They provide for the health of children, better immunization rates, better school readiness. Studies have shown that over the years, you can save up to as much as \$7 for every dollar invested in home visiting for these families. We need to begin to invest in prevention instead of continually increasing our prison budget, our juvenile justice budget, our children and youth budget. Let us begin to prevent some of the problems instead of intervening when families fail.

The money comes from \$3 million in TANF (Temporary Assistance to Needy Families) funds, which would be dedicated to this grant program. Many other States are already using their TANF funds this way. Texas, Florida, Illinois, are three examples, and there are others. The rest of the money comes from the general government operations lines in the Departments of Treasury, General Services, and Revenue by \$1 million respectively.

Mr. Speaker, this is an investment in our families, an investment in people and their children. This will help children achieve their full potential. Please support this amendment. Thank you.

The SPEAKER. On the question, the gentleman, Mr. Browne.

Mr. BROWNE. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, I rise in support of the Mundy amendment.

This Assembly continues to look for ways to improve the educational system for our children, including rigorous academic standards, but we cannot expect many of our children to meet these rigorous standards if they are not ready to learn when they get to school. Because of many risk factors our children are exposed to - poor health and nutrition, the low education level of parents, and sometimes abuse and neglect - they experience a readiness gap which will leave them behind in their early years in school.

The Mundy amendment will support some very successful home visiting programs that will assist parents in helping their children be prepared to learn. If we are serious about public education, serious about equal opportunity in education, these are the types of programs we have to support and reinforce, and I ask for an affirmative vote.

The SPEAKER. The gentleman from Philadelphia County, Mr. Thomas, on the amendment.

Mr. THOMAS. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, I rise to support the Mundy amendment.

Representative Mundy and a number of other speakers have made it very clear that the time has come for us to invest on the front side of life and not on the back side. Clearly if we can spend \$27,000 a year to keep individuals in Pennsylvania prisons, then we can spend \$6 million to make sure that those prisons do not grow any faster than they are growing.

This amendment deals with prevention, intervention, and redirection. Home visitation programs work in rebuilding families, in rebuilding self-esteem, in providing stability to communities that have been torn apart with crime, blight, and disinvestment. Mr. Speaker, \$6 million sounds like a lot, but when you put it next to the outcome, when you put it next to the result, \$6 million is very small.

I urge my colleagues to support the Mundy amendment, amendment 1039. Thank you.

The SPEAKER. The Chair recognizes the lady, Ms. Steelman.

Ms. STEELMAN. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

I rise in support of the Ounce of Prevention program.

A little while ago we had a discussion on the cost of corrections in Pennsylvania. Our corrections budget for next year is more than \$1 billion, and unfortunately, in many cases, those who become inmates of the corrections system are not cured as a result of their experiences but only return again to prison after being released. Is it not better to invest in an ounce of prevention rather than, as in our case, 50 or 60 pounds of cure that does not work? Starting early is the best way to ensure

that young people growing up in a loving, caring family are far less likely to find themselves incarcerated. Six million dollars as against \$1 billion is very little money.

It is an ounce of prevention, and it is well worth our support. The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the lady.

The majority having voted in the affirmative, the question was determined in the affirmative and the amendment was agreed to.

On the question recurring,

Will the House agree to the bill on third consideration as amended?

Mr. BIRMELIN offered the following amendment No. A1040:

Amend Sec. 219, page 294, line 16, by inserting after "SUPPLIES."

As a condition for receiving funds for women's medical services, including contraceptive supplies, a project shall not promote, perform or refer for abortions or engage in abortion counseling and shall be physically and financially separate from any facility engaging in such activities as verified by an audit and inspection conducted by the Department of Public Welfare and evidence of such physical and financial separation shall be supplied by such documentation as the Department of Public Welfare shall request.

On the question, Will the House agree to the amendment?

The SPEAKER. The gentleman, Mr. Birmelin. Mr. BIRMELIN. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Statistics show in Pennsylvania, through the Department of Health, that abortions are continuing to decrease in our State, and that is good news. We think the reason for that is Pennsylvania's law which includes parental consent for minors, and the funding of alternatives to abortion has helped to provide protection for teens and a safe haven for women. But we believe that there is also a disturbing trend that is occurring in Pennsylvania. At a time when abortions are decreasing, Planned Parenthood's abortion numbers are increasing, and as they continue to accelerate the opening of these new abortion centers, we see that trend continuing. At the present time, they are attempting to open their sixth abortion center in Lancaster.

It is important the Pennsylvania General Assembly make sure that the taxpayer funds that we intend for family planning are not used to promote abortion or any entity that operates abortion centers, such as the Planned Parenthood organization, and we know that it is difficult to monitor the proper use of taxpayer dollars, especially when family planning funds are being used by the same staff and in the same location that do abortions. We owe it to the taxpayers of Pennsylvania to assure that their tax dollars are not being used for abortion purposes. I think we need to establish a clear line of separation between the two. In speaking on behalf of the pro-life caucus of the House of Representatives, I offer this amendment to you this afternoon.

We have over the last several years included contract language for family planning providers in Pennsylvania. In essence, that language has said something to the extent that if you agree to receive these moneys for family planning, then you will not counsel for or refer for abortions. But unfortunately, it is a blurry line when this person who is going into a family planning center is going into an organization that has that restriction on their State tax dollars but no restriction on their Federal. As a matter of fact, from what I am told, they have to refer for abortions. So we literally have a two-headed monster here. It is almost reminiscent of the statement that Abraham Lincoln made when he said that a house divided against itself cannot stand, and we have people going into family planning centers where they are getting mixed messages. and that mixed message depends on who is paying them at that moment to provide that message. It is clearly a problem.

The pro-life caucus does not take a stand on family planning. We do not say we are for it or against it. That is up to the individual members who belong to our caucus. But one thing that we do understand and we do appreciate as a pro-life caucus is that you must make a distinction between family planning and abortion. Abortion is not family planning. Abortion is not contraceptives. Abortion should not be birth control. And through the amendment that I have prepared for us today and ask for your support, I am suggesting to you that we need to draw a stronger, clearer distinction between those two, between abortion providers and those who counsel for and refer to them and those that are strictly in the business of contraceptives delivery for those who are seeking family planning services.

Now, by doing this, I understand it will create some problems for some family planning distributors now, but I also understand that it ought to be our policy that when we provide money for family planning, there should be no connection, no way that it could be misconstrued, no way that it could be misapplied, no way that it could be used in such a fashion by the people who are also in the business of performing, referring, or counseling for abortion and using that money for that purpose for which we did not intend it.

So I would appreciate your listening carefully to the debate that follows. I am sure there are going to be several who will speak against this amendment. But keep in mind that the bottom line is, we want to make that clear distinction between abortion and family planning, and my amendment, which requires separate facilities and separate financial arrangements, will do just that. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. The gentleman from Chester County, Mr. Ross.

Mr. ROSS. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

I would like to point out – and I ask the members' attention on this - that we have very clear language and a very clear distinction in all of the existing contracts that the family planning centers operate under. There are over 250 family planning centers throughout the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. They are performing a variety of very important services - everything from screening for cervical cancer and breast cancer; screening for diabetes, anemia, and high blood pressure; sexually transmitted disease testing and treatment; HIV-AIDS (human immunodeficiency virus-acquired immune deficiency syndrome) education and prevention; as well as contraceptive education, information, and supplies. These are medical centers, because many of the contraceptives require a

physician's prescription. And basically, the language – and I have copies of that language from the contract, if any of my fellow members wish to look at it – is very explicit. None of these dollars can be used for abortion counseling or abortion services. So we have an existing clear line.

Now, we also have some language that we have been working under for the past 5 years, during the period of time when the previous speaker mentioned that the total number of abortions have been declining.

So what is going to be the effect of the Birmelin amendment if it actually is passed? Well, it is very simple, Mr. Speaker. What will happen is there will be increased costs to the clinics in two ways: One, there will be an increased cost because they will have to essentially duplicate services in new facilities: secondly, there will be a loss of revenue because the Federal dollars operate under a set of languages that are in conflict with the Birmelin language. So what we are going to wind up having is a choice for these clinics to either drop Federal dollars or drop State dollars. There will be a net reduction in services that are designed to prevent unwanted pregnancies. We will have logically an increase in unwanted pregnancies, which include potential for more abortions, just the reverse of what the previous speaker was intending. It will also in other cases wind up taking people that are trying to get off the welfare rolls and put them back in a condition where they have to either put their children in day care or wind up being in a position where they give up income for the family which is desperately needed. So the net effect of this is going to be contrary to the intent.

And finally, there is another provision that the maker of the amendment did not discuss, and that was that previously the directors of these clinics wind up being legally responsible for making sure that these dollars are not used for abortion services. The language is changed here so that now the Department of Public Welfare is going to have to go through and send teams into these different clinics, 250-plus across the State, and do a review, probably for several days, over all of their expenses in order to assure, because they are now on the hook to assure, that these dollars are not spent for the purposes of abortion counseling or abortion services. So that is going to take money out of this program also and further reduce the dollars that are available for pregnancy prevention.

I think that this is unnecessary. We have existing language that is working well currently, that is preventing the issue that has been raised here, and the unintended consequences are going to be increased unwanted pregnancies with all the problems that are associated with that.

I strongly urge my fellow members to vote against this amendment. Thank you.

The SPEAKER. The Chair recognizes the lady from Luzerne, Ms. Mundy.

Ms. MUNDY. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

I rise in vehement opposition to the Birmelin amendment.

It seems to me at a time when we are asking low-income women to go to work instead of being on welfare, we should be doing everything possible to make sure that they are able to postpone pregnancy and childbearing until they are able to sustain themselves and their families.

But beyond that, this amendment is completely unnecessary. The Federal family planning regulations are abundantly clear: No family planning funds are to be used to advocate, encourage, or perform abortions. No funds are used to perform abortion counseling. How much more clear can we be than that? You may not use Federal family planning funds for abortion services. So basically what you are doing is forcing these family planning agencies – and in our area, it is not just Planned Parenthood; it is also Maternal and Family Health Services and other clinics who provide family planning services – you are forcing them to choose between their Federal and their State funding. At a time when we need more family planning, we need more counseling, we need better access to low-income women being able to postpone pregnancy, you are putting these family planning providers in a horrible situation.

It is not fair to women. It is not fair to their families. Let us vote "no" on the Birmelin amendment.

The SPEAKER. The Chair recognizes the lady, Ms. Steelman.

Ms. STEELMAN. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Do you think we could have a little more quiet in here?

The SPEAKER. The House will please come to order. Conferences on the floor, please. Conferences on the floor.

Ms. STEELMAN. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

We are---

The SPEAKER. The Chair recognizes the lady, Ms. Steelman.

Ms. STEELMAN. Thank you.

We are advised from time to time in making legislative decisions to beware of the unintended consequences of our actions, and I am afraid that the Birmelin amendment, although well intended, has the potential to create serious unintended consequences. As two previous speakers have pointed out, if the Birmelin amendment becomes part of our law, it will force health-care providers to choose between accepting Federal funds and accepting State funds in order to provide women's health services.

In my county, the primary provider of many of these services is the Family Health Council. In addition to providing contraceptive services, screening for sexually transmitted diseases, providing services for the diagnosis of breast and cervical cancer, this organization is also involved in providing prenatal care and infant and toddler care for families. They are not lavishly funded by the State. None of these associations are. And if we put further financial burdens on them, we have a good possibility of eliminating many of these services, particularly in our rural counties. It is very hard to imagine. given the struggles that many of our rural hospitals are having just to stay in operation, who is going to step into the gap and provide these services, and I am very much afraid that a vote for the Birmelin amendment, however high the ideals of those who are voting for it may be, will actually turn out not to be so much a vote against abortion as a vote for the spread of sexually transmitted diseases, for higher levels of cancer, for less health care for children and less health care for pregnant women, and eventually, because of the absence of contraceptive services, it may even turn out to be a vote for more abortions.

Please vote "no."

The SPEAKER. The Chair recognizes the gentleman, Mr. Sturla.

Mr. STURLA. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, I rise in opposition to the Birmelin amendment.

As has been pointed out by several previous speakers, this will have a severe impact on the access to family planning that many women in Pennsylvania need. Family planning is located in 65 of Pennsylvania's 67 counties, and these include major teaching hospitals, suburban and rural community hospitals, community health centers, health department clinics, Planned Parenthood affiliates, and university health centers.

One of the things I fear about this amendment is that instead of providing options to women who are seeking counseling, what we will end up doing is having women making uninformed decisions beforehand to either go to one specific clinic where they can receive an abortion or to go to a separate clinic where they cannot. Instead of understanding what those options are and having somebody counsel them on those options, they will be making uninformed choices prior to entering one of those clinics. The further we separate this mechanism, the more walls we build in this, the further we reduce women's access to health care in Pennsylvania, and I would urge every member to vote against this. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

#### **PARLIAMENTARY INQUIRY**

The SPEAKER. The Chair recognizes the lady from Montgomery County, Ms. Williams.

Ms. WILLIAMS. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, I am going to vote "no" on this amendment for many of the reasons that have already been spoken to on the floor, but I have a question for you.

Based on the fact that this amendment requires additional auditing and inspection by the Department of Public Welfare, I do not believe that it is revenue neutral and that it complies with rule 19(b), and therefore, I ask you to put a ruling on it whether it is in order or not.

The SPEAKER. Would the lady state her point of parliamentary inquiry again.

Ms. WILLIAMS. I do not believe that this is a revenue-neutral amendment, according to rule 19(b), since it puts additional pressures on the Department of Public Welfare, and I would like your ruling on this.

The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the lady.

In response to the question asked by the lady, Ms. Williams, let me say parenthetically that this question came up earlier today. The Parliamentarian and I had one discussion on it at that time and hoped that it would not be raised again. You have raised it. The conclusion we came to earlier and come to again is that this does not offend the rule that is adopted for the purpose of doing the budget, because among other things, the amendment does not have an appropriation in it. The rule states - and I do not have it before me, but I can open it - that where an appropriation is made by amendment, there has to be a corresponding reduction in another area of the budget. Secondly, through usage and custom over a long period of time, the departments have traditionally, not traditionally but have more than once or twice in the budget been required to do separate audit procedures, which are not deemed to affect the budget in earlier sessions nor so far in this session. Under those circumstances, on a close call, I am going to say that it does not offend the rule.

The Chair recognizes the lady, Ms. Bebko-Jones.

Ms. BEBKO-JONES. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, would the sponsor of the amendment agree to interrogation?

The SPEAKER. The gentleman indicates he will stand for interrogation. You may begin.

Ms. BEBKO-JONES. Mr. Speaker, I am not going to repeat what the other previous speakers have said, but, Mr. Speaker, you indicated you did have some family planning centers in your legislative district. Is that correct?

Mr. BIRMELIN. No; I did not indicate that.

Ms. BEBKO-JONES. Oh, you do not have any family planning centers?

Mr. BIRMELIN. No; I am answering your question. You asked me if I had indicated that I had any, and no, I did not indicate that I have any.

Ms. BEBKO-JONES. Okay.

Mr. BIRMELIN. But I do have one.

Ms. BEBKO-JONES. Okay. Okay. So you do have some.

And have you visited those family planning centers?

Mr. BIRMELIN. I have one, and I have visited it, yes.

Ms. BEBKO-JONES. And so then you are very much aware, truly, what these family centers do for women's health care for low-income women.

Mr. BIRMELIN. Yes.

Ms. BEBKO-JONES. I mean, I am sure you walked through the center and they showed you the services that they provide.

Mr. BIRMELIN. Yes.

Ms. BEBKO-JONES. And mainly for low-income women, Mr. Speaker, do you have a percentage of low-income women in your district that are being served by these family planning centers?

Mr. BIRMELIN. Every county has a percentage.

Ms. BEBKO-JONES. But again, to be clear, this amendment is going to strip all of our family centers across Pennsylvania. Family planning centers do not perform abortions. I think you heard that over and over again from previous speakers.

I would ask my colleagues on both sides of the aisle for a "no" vote.

#### THE SPEAKER PRO TEMPORE (PATRICIA H. VANCE) PRESIDING

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair recognizes the lady from Lancaster County, Mrs. True.

Mrs. TRUE. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

I rise in support of the Birmelin amendment.

I think philosophically we have to look at the constituency we represent, and really what I feel this boils down to is trust, and unfortunately, there is a segment of Pennsylvania society that does not trust a good deal of the clinics, and that is what this amendment is all about. If we truly want to help – and most of us do – women in medical services, we should be able to pull the money out to do just that, and I think it is sad that we have the lack of trust we do, but speaking for someone who is from Lancaster County, where an abortion center was trying to get started, I know what the rhetoric is, and I speak for my constituents that support this point of view. Thank you.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Westmoreland, Mr. Tangretti.

Mr. TANGRETTI. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

Madam Speaker, I think that there are many in the pro-life caucus – although I do not want to speak for anybody but myself, but I believe this is true – I think there are many in the pro-life caucus who very much want to vote for moneys,

additional moneys, for these women's health services. We think they are important and necessary, particularly for those that are poor.

But we have a huge philosophical difference with some of our colleagues relative to the abortion issue, and it just seems to us that we could put this whole thing to bed, so to speak, if we separate out these facilities structurally and financially. I think that is the perfect alternative. I think that you will see, if we were able to accomplish that, many, many of us support all of the services – the medical services, the counseling services – for these poor women. But as long as there is a suspicion and a possibility that these clinics are referring or counseling or actually providing abortions, we cannot support any additional moneys.

I think that this is an alternative that we can all support. I do not know what the drastic difficulty is. I do not believe it is going to reduce services to those people who need them, and I think for the first time in a long time you will see practical unanimity in terms of support for those kinds of services.

So I would ask all of the members to consider that and support the Birmelin amendment.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair recognizes the minority leader, from Greene County, Mr. DeWeese.

Mr. DeWEESE. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

This amendment and this discussion is all about keeping women healthy. I am going to urge the men and women in the chamber, because this certainly is not a partisan issue, I am going to urge people to take a moderate perspective. As the 20th century ended and the 21st century commenced, all kinds of phenomenon within the body politic have taken place toward moderation. Conservatives have moved toward the middle. Liberals have moved toward the middle. This gentleman's amendment, my worthy colleague's amendment, is, in my view, an arch-, archconservative, restrictive, overbearing intercession into the lives of Pennsylvania women.

My view is that the moderate perspective, as has been espoused by moderate men and women like our Governor, moderate men and women like Ms. Hillman from Pittsburgh, moderate men and women like sit on the other side of the aisle, and some habitues in the back rows who are moderate, a moderate perspective will gainsay this amendment.

The Birmelin amendment is overreaching. The Birmelin amendment should be defeated. Moderation, moderation, Madam Speaker, will be realized with a negative vote against this overly aggressive intercession on behalf of the gentleman from Monroe.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Wayne County, Mr. Birmelin.

Mr. BIRMELIN. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

Let me make two corrections in the previous speaker's remarks. Number one, I am from Wayne County, not Monroe, and secondly, if he would look in the mirror, he would not see any moderation there.

Let me just spend a few minutes to tell you briefly why I think those who have spoken against this amendment are in error.

The first is, they are trying to make you think that my amendment will end all medical services to women, particularly poor women. It does not. We are only talking about one specific issue, and that is the issue of abortion, abortion which takes the life of an unborn child.

C ( C )

The second thing they would have you to believe is, if we have to have these separate facilities, this is a terrible burden on us, and in so doing, we will not be able to take these State dollars, because then we would not be able to refer people and counsel them for abortion. That is what the amendment is intended to do, to stop you from referring and counseling for abortion. If you want to be in the business of referring for abortions and helping people get abortions, then do not ask us to give State tax dollars to do that to you.

And in addition to that argument, what we are hearing is that, oh, well, you know, the Federal government, they say that we have to refer and counsel for abortions because that is the attachment that comes with that money. Here we go again. The Federal government says you have to refer and you have to counsel for abortions. So what can we do? We must have to do the same thing. If we want to give them some money, we will just do the same thing. Well, how many times have people on this House floor stood up time after time after time and said, we do not want the Federal government telling us what to do, and here you are saying, well, we just have got to do what they tell us to do. We do not have to do it. We raise this money. We will decide how it is spent.

If you want to refer and counsel for abortions, then do not take the money. That is the argument. That is the simplicity here. Prove that you are not doing it. Do you honestly think that when you walk into one of these family planning centers that gets both Federal and State money, that that receptionist sitting at that desk can tell you who is paying her salary that day, or if you go in to see a counselor, that that counselor will say, let us see; the first 2 hours I am on State time; I cannot say anything about abortion; the next 6 hours I am on Federal time; now I have got to tell them to have an abortion. Come on; get real, Madam Speaker. You know that does not happen. There is a big blur here. They do not know who is paying for what minute of the day and what they are supposed to be saying.

We are saying, let us draw the line. We are not going to give them State tax dollars. We want to do the right thing here. Please vote for this amendment.

Mr. CALTAGIRONE. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

The amendment would allow for a \$2-million line-item appropriation for the third-class cities in our Commonwealth for firefighter training.

I would appreciate your support for this amendment. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Lancaster County, Mr. Barley.

Mr. BARLEY. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

The gentleman was certainly very forthright and very clear when he explained what his amendment would do, and I want to amplify for the benefit of the members so that they are aware that this amendment allocates \$2 million very specifically for training of firefighters in third-class cities only. This money is not being used uniformly for the purpose of training firefighters in second-class townships, boroughs, or any other municipality. We are now again discriminating by appropriating this money for only third-class cities.

Many of our municipalities are served by volunteer fire companies. I am not aware of the practice in every third-class city, but certainly most of them are served by paid fire departments, and so they are on a bit of a different level than our volunteers. So as members determine how they want to vote, I think it is important that you understand, if you represent an area other than a third-class city, your firefighters will not receive any of this appropriation.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Lancaster County, Mr. Sturla.

Mr. STURLA. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

Madam Speaker, the previous gentleman who spoke is absolutely correct; this money would only go to third-class cities. But if you will all recall, recently there was a piece of legislation on the floor of this House that passed \$25 million for volunteer fire departments only, and it was made very clear at that point in time that no one with a paid fire department was getting one red cent of that \$25 million, and yet I believe that passed nearly unanimously. Members like myself and other members who represent third-class cities that have paid fire departments, first-class cities with paid fire departments, various other communities in the State of Pennsylvania with paid fire departments, all voted to say that those volunteer fire departments deserve some dollars also. All that we are asking at this point in time is that you all vote with us to ensure that we have some dollars for our firefighting efforts in our communities also. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Lawrence County, Mr. Sainato.

Mr. SAINATO. Madam Speaker, I also rise to support this amendment.

I think my two previous speakers hit the nail right on the head. We need to do something to help municipal governments such as third-class cities. New Castle is a third-class city. They have got a good paid fire department. I also represent nine volunteer fire departments in my townships and boroughs, and we helped them 2 weeks ago, which is very important because they needed help. I think this is the second step as we move forward to help cities such as New Castle by helping them, by giving them this money to help train firemen. We have helped our volunteers. Now we can do something for third-class cities and help all firemen.

So this just complements the work which we did a few weeks ago with our volunteer fire departments. The municipalities with paid fire departments were next. We can do it today by passing this amendment to help third-class cities. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Westmoreland, Mr. Casorio.

Mr. CASORIO. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

I rise in support of amendment 1047.

I have a third-class city, the city of Jeannette in Westmoreland County, with a paid department, and, Madam Speaker, they have been a bit down on their luck, but the city is on a rebound. This \$2-million appropriation would help the city of Jeannette purchase new equipment, would help them protect the dwindling tax base, would help them protect seniors, and would help them protect the surrounding communities.

Madam Speaker, this \$2 million does not go very far if you divide it amongst the third-class cities throughout the Commonwealth, but it goes a little bit towards helping those folks that have been down on their luck most, have lost their tax base, lost the industrial and economic base, but are on the upswing.

Madam Speaker, I would urge an affirmative vote on amendment 1047. Thank you.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Berks County, Mr. Caltagirone, for the second time.

Mr. CALTAGIRONE. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

Just to clear the record, make no mistake about it, Madam Speaker, our third-class-city paid fire departments to a company assist many of the volunteer fire companies outside our cities. As an example, in Berks County, the fire training facility owned and operated by the city of Reading allows all 75 municipalities to participate in that fire training. We have an extra HAZMAT (hazardous materials) team in Reading that goes out and helps to provide that extra protection to the outlying municipalities at no cost to them.

So there are many extraordinary services provided by the fire departments in our third-class cities that go outside their jurisdictional areas to help out the other fire departments. I belong to the Reading Hose Fire Company, and our equipment many, many times goes out into the municipal areas to help fight their fires. We do not get reimbursed for that, but when they call for help, we respond.

I would really appreciate an affirmative vote on this small appropriation. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. On that question, the Chair recognizes the gentleman, Mr. Buxton.

Mr. BUXTON. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

Amendment 1051 creates the Keeping Women Healthy Initiative. It is a commonsense program of health care for uninsured and underinsured women in Pennsylvania. This investment will provide preventative health services, including screening for high blood pressure, cancer, and sexually transmitted diseases, together with prenatal care. Keeping Women Healthy also provides education about good health, about prenatal care and parenting and adoption education, and outreach to inform women of the benefits and availability of preventative health care.

It is estimated that more than 400,000 Pennsylvania women lack health insurance, of which 275,000 are of childbearing age. The underinsured are predominantly low- and middle-income workers and their families, minority groups, and people who work for small businesses. The poor run the highest risk of being uninsured since they do not qualify for Medicaid but cannot afford health insurance. Lack of health insurance means that women are less likely to receive preventative health care. Hence, many health problems such as cancer and heart disease go undetected and untreated.

Women without insurance are four times more likely to be hospitalized for conditions that could have been avoided. By providing women's preventative health care, we can reduce hospitalizations, diagnose cancer earlier when it comes more treatable, intervene early to help manage diabetes and hypertension.

One in four Pennsylvania women has high blood pressure. Heart disease caused 34 percent of all female deaths in 1997. This is the number one killer of Pennsylvania women. Almost one in five pregnant women received late prenatal care or none at all. Pennsylvania ranked 26th nationally in the number of low-birth-weight babies in 1997. These statistics are inexcusable.

Therefore, I would ask for your affirmative vote to provide needed health coverage for over 400,000 Pennsylvania women. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Wayne County, Mr. Birmelin.

Mr. BIRMELIN. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

In the closing portion of this amendment, there is a phrase or a sentence that says, "No portion of this appropriation shall be used for abortion procedures or counseling," and while I applaud the maker of the amendment for his attempt to segregate that issue, I do not think the language that he has here does that as well as it should or could. There is a legal definition and a distinction made when one refers to abortion counseling and referrals. Had his particular amendment included the word "referral," I think I would have almost been persuaded to support it, but it does not.

In essence, what we will have done if we have adopted his amendment is we will say the program that is being funded for \$15 million would be able to be funded, and the people who as clients or customers come into whatever facility receives this portion of this grant, those people would not be able to perform abortions; they would not be able to take people into the back room and counsel them and say, hey, I think that you should be thinking about having an abortion here; this might be one of your alternatives. They would not have been able to do that under this language, but what they will be able to do under this language is, when they come in the door, the client, the customer, et cetera, the person who greets them and gives them their options and gives them literature will be able to refer them to abortion clinics. They will be able to verbally as well as in writing tell them that that is an option that is available to them.

Now, the second problem I have with this amendment – and this sort of pertains to the amendment that you passed under my name just a few minutes ago – this is a line item, this \$15 million, that is separate from the line item that we dealt with previously with my amendment, and that referred to women's contraceptive services, and what you said when you adopted the Birmelin amendment was that there should be a clear distinction, a clear separation, so that there is no abortion referral, no abortion counseling, or no abortion performed in those facilities. This amendment only covers two of those three aspects, and in essence, what you will create if you adopt this amendment is you will create that loophole in which abortion

referral will be allowed to be made at facilities that contract for portions of that \$15 million.

Again, I will applaud the maker of the amendment for his attempt to deal with the issue. I do not think he has dealt with it in complete fashion. I think the addition of a couple of words might have done that. But here we are. We are facing this amendment. We do not have a chance to change it at this point in time.

So I am respectfully going to ask that members of this caucus and those in the pro-life caucus in particular would vote "no" on this amendment. Thank you.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Chester, Mr. Ross.

Mr. ROSS. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

Earlier we talked about the idea of making sure that there were sufficient funds available for women's health issues, and there were some very good sentiments here in the chamber about the idea of making sure that we had sufficient funds associated with that. We have a set of clinics out there. With the adoption of the previous language, those clinics are under obligations that they were not previously under. Those obligations are going to cost them more money. They are going to drive up their operating costs. If we do not add additional money along the lines of the current amendment we are discussing, there will be fewer dollars spent on family planning; there will be fewer dollars spent to prevent pregnancies. There will be additional hardships borne by women.

I ask my fellow members who spoke earlier who said that they do wish to help women and do wish to improve their health, particularly those that have low income, to be able to give the Buxton amendment a positive vote and to move forward so that we can have some funds to improve poor women's health and reduce unwanted pregnancies. Thank you.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Dauphin County, Mr. Buxton, for the second time.

Mr. BUXTON. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

Madam Speaker, the members may recall last year a similar amendment offered by me overwhelmingly passed this House of Representatives, and during that debate a year ago, most of the issues centered around the question as to whether any of these funds would be used for abortion or abortion counseling in Pennsylvania, and at that time I indicated that they would not, that the contract written by the Department of Public Welfare would dictate how the moneys would be used.

In an effort to put those fears to rest in this year's budget, we included language that restricts this money from being used for any type of abortion or abortion counseling in Pennsylvania. That is specific with the language this year. I do not know what we have to do to appease those who believe there is always a loophole with any issue dealing with women's health, that somehow moneys are going to be used for abortion or abortion counseling. I could tell you for the record today, that is not the intent of this amendment; it is not the purpose of this amendment.

We only serve one purpose with this amendment today, and that is to provide over 400,000 women in Pennsylvania with the opportunity to receive adequate health insurance, and I would respectfully request an affirmative vote. Thank you, Madam Speaker. On the question recurring, Will the House agree to the amendment?

Madam Speaker, this amendment adds language to the Department of Health's general government operations State appropriation for a public education campaign about the causes and effects of coronary artery disease in women.

Madam Speaker, according to the American Heart Association, cardiovascular diseases are the number one killer of women, claiming the lives of more than half a million females every year. Almost one in two women's deaths is due to cardiovascular disease. This disease claims the lives of more women each year than does cancer. Each year more than 479,000 females die of cardiovascular diseases, while approximately 246,000 females die of cancer. Heart attack kills more than five times as many females as breast cancer. Stroke kills twice as many females as breast cancer. One in five females has some form of cardiovascular disease. Of females under age 65, each year more than 20,000 die of heart attacks.

And I could go on and on giving these grim statistics, but it is very important, Madam Speaker, that the people in the Commonwealth are aware of the dangers and the prevalence of cardiovascular disease. I think it important that the department have an education program to make all of our citizens aware of preventive measures that they can take to keep themselves healthy.

I urge all of the members to vote in favor of this amendment. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. On that question, the Chair recognizes the gentleman from Northampton, Mr. Samuelson. Mr. SAMUELSON. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

A year ago this General Assembly approved in the current year's budget the Read to Succeed program, which has been a phenomenal success. Governor Ridge proposed this program in February of 1999, and the \$35 million that is in this year's budget for Read to Succeed has benefited students in 710 schools in 275 school districts throughout Pennsylvania. Right now schools are in the process of applying for year 2 funding. Unfortunately, the Read to Succeed program as proposed goes from \$35 million to \$25 million to \$25 million to \$15 million, a declining State appropriation.

I believe we should maintain the Read to Succeed program at \$35 million, and this amendment would restore that funding to that level. The source of the proposed funding is the proposed academic empowerment act, which currently has no statutory authorization. There is draft language being circulated by the Department of Education, and at this point it looks like that proposal for the academic empowerment act would benefit 11 school districts in Pennsylvania.

I believe that this funding could be better directed to the Read to Succeed program, a proven program that will benefit students throughout the Commonwealth in hundreds of school districts, not just 11 school districts.

The Read to Succeed program focuses funding on the early elementary grades, and I commend the Governor for this approach, because I believe that attacking reading programs early on will have benefits for students throughout their educational careers. So let us build on the successful Read to Succeed program and maintain the funding at the \$35-million level in this year's budget.

I urge a "yes" vote on amendment 1059.

Mr. STURLA. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

Madam Speaker, I rise in support of the Samuelson amendment.

Mr. SAMUELSON. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

Each of us in this chamber can probably agree that smaller class sizes lead to increased educational opportunities for our students. I was at a meeting of school principals 2 weeks ago where I and the other Lehigh Valley Representatives were thanked for the smaller-class-size funding that is in place in schools this year. Well, as you know and I know, the smaller-class-size funding in schools this year is not a result of our State action; it is a result of the Federal initiative, which this year is providing \$51 million and benefiting students in approximately 400 school districts across Pennsylvania.

This budget as proposed does not include any State funding for smaller class sizes, and I believe that Pennsylvania should be a partner in lowering class sizes. This amendment would reallocate \$10 million so that more students in more school districts could experience the benefits of smaller class sizes. There have been studies across the country about the benefits of small class sizes, most notably a study in Tennessee that tracked students for 13 years, from kindergarten in 1985 to 12th grade in 1998. And I visited classrooms in my own legislative district where the Federal initiative is in place and there are classrooms of 18 students. The comments you get in those classrooms are: there is more time for individual attention; the small groups are smaller; there is more time to assess student progress and adjust lesson plans accordingly; and also, there is more interaction between students and teachers.

As with the previous amendment, the source of funding is the proposed educational empowerment act, and I believe rather than allocating this \$10 million to the proposed empowerment act that would benefit 11 school districts, we should allocate this funding to provide smaller class sizes across Pennsylvania for the benefit of students not only today but for years to come. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Allegheny County, Mr. Costa.

Mr. COSTA. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

I stand up in support of this amendment.

I strongly believe that smaller class sizes do produce better results. We have test results that have shown that,

This amendment would redirect the funding in the proposed budget for the CyberStart program in favor of book distributions for kindergartners and first graders. While the CyberStart program, which focuses on the Internet, providing the Internet in day-care centers, is a laudable goal, I believe that before we start putting our preschoolers online, let us focus on the basics. Let us help our kids learn to read. That same \$1.6 million that is in the proposed budget for CyberStart is enough to pay for two books for every kindergartner and every first grader, public and nonpublic, across Pennsylvania.

We are all familiar with the RIF program, the Reading Is Fundamental program, which distributes books to students across the country and across Pennsylvania. In my own community, students take home three books from school funded by a combination of sources – the RIF program; the gas company, UGI providing books to first graders; school funds; and PTA (Parent-Teacher Association) funds. Currently there is no State funding appropriated for book distributions, but this could provide those two books to all 333,000 kindergartners and first graders in Pennsylvania.

My final point is that distributing books at the end of the school year, right before summer vacation, would encourage students to read with their parents throughout the summer months.

So I encourage a "yes" vote on amendment 1062. Before we put our day-care centers online, let us make sure our kids can read. Thank you, Madam Speaker. On the question recurring, Will the House agree to the amendment?

Mr. BARLEY. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

In order to be consistent, I want to point out to the members that this particular amendment allocates \$200,000 to the counties of the second class, which would be Allegheny County only. So the allocation that is proposed in the amendment is for Allegheny County only. It does not benefit any other subdivision of the Commonwealth.

The SPEAKER. The gentleman, Mr. DeLuca.

Mr. DeLUCA. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

This is a very important amendment because the program, the violence prevention program, is not in every county. The Federal government originally funded about four or five counties. Now other counties are starting to look at this, and what is happening, the Federal government has reduced the funding, and for this program to be successful, we need to put some State dollars into it.

Now, we talk about violence prevention in our schools. This is one way of a successful program being initiated. We did this last year; we put it in the budget. Unfortunately, the Governor stripped it out. I would hope my colleagues would see a need for this since all counties have not taken advantage of this Federal money to start a violence prevention program. When the time comes, I would be happy to introduce legislation to affect all 67 counties.

So I would hope you would have an affirmative vote on behalf of this program. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

TOBACCO SETTLEMENT

Section 1801-A. Tobacco Settlement Fund.

(a) Establishment.-There is hereby established within the State Treasury a trust fund to be known as the Tobacco Settlement Fund. The moneys of the fund shall consist of moneys received by the Commonwealth under the Master Settlement Agreement and all interest earned thereon.

Preservation of fund.-Each payment received by the (b) Commonwealth under the Master Settlement Agreement shall be deposited into the fund. Fifty percent of each payment shall not be expended and shall remain in the fund. The remaining 50% of each payment received by the Commonwealth may be expended from the fund. Each year the interest earned on money in the fund shall be added to the remaining 50% to be expended. An amount less than 50% of each payment received and not to be expended may be expended to ensure that the amount to be expended in any given year is not less than the amount that was available the preceding year.

(c) Custodian.--The State Treasurer shall be the custodian of the fund.

(d) Control and management.-The members of the Tobacco Settlement Board shall be the trustees of the fund. Regardless of any other provision of law governing the investments of funds under the control of an administrative board of the State government, the trustees shall have exclusive control and management of the said fund and full power to invest the same in accordance with the provisions of this section, subject, however, to the exercise of that degree of judgment, skill and care under the circumstances then prevailing which persons of prudence, discretion and intelligence, who are familiar with such matters, exercise in the management of their own affairs not in regard to speculation, but in regard to the permanent disposition of the funds, considering the probable income to be derived therefrom as well as the probable safety of their capital. The trustees shall have the power to hold, purchase, sell, lend, assign, transfer or dispose of any of the securities and investments in which any of the moneys in the fund shall have been invested as well as of the proceeds of said investments, including any directed commissions which have accrued to the benefit of the fund as a consequence of the investments, and of any moneys belonging to said fund, subject in every case to meeting the standard of prudence set forth in this subsection.

(e) Fiduciary status of board.—The members of the Tobacco Settlement Board shall stand in a fiduciary relationship to the Commonwealth regarding the investments and disbursements of any of the moneys of the fund and shall not profit either directly or indirectly with respect thereto. The board may, when possible and consistent with its fiduciary duties imposed by this subsection or other law, including its obligation to invest and manage the fund, consider whether an investment in any project or business enhances and promotes the general welfare of this Commonwealth and its citizens, including, but not limited to, investments that increase and enhance the employment of Commonwealth residents, encourage the construction and retention of adequate housing and stimulate further investment and economic activity in this Commonwealth.

Vehicles for authorized investments.-The Tobacco (f)Settlement Board in its prudent discretion may make any investments which meet the standard of prudence set forth in subsection (d) by becoming a limited partner in partnerships that will hold such investments; or by acquiring shares or units of participation or otherwise participating beneficially in bank collective trusts or in the separate accounts of any insurance company authorized to do business in this Commonwealth; or by acquiring stocks or shares or units of participation or otherwise participating beneficially in the fund of any corporation or trust organized or created and existing under the laws of the United States or of any state, district or territory thereof, which fund is maintained for and consists of assets of employees' benefit trusts, including governmental plans as defined in section 414(d) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (Public Law 99-514, 26 U.S.C. § 1 et seq.) or which meet the requirements for qualification under section 401, of that code provided that, in any such case, the liability of the fund shall be limited to the amount of its investment.

(g) Legislative declaration concerning certain authorized investments.—The General Assembly finds and declares that authorized investments of the Tobacco Settlement Fund made by or on behalf of the board under this section whereby the board becomes a joint owner or stockholder in any company, corporation or association are outside the scope of the original intent of and therefore do not violate the prohibition set forth in section 8 of Article VIII of the Constitution of Pennsylvania.

Section 1802-A. The Tobacco Settlement Board.

(a) Status and membership.—The Tobacco Settlement Board shall be an independent administrative board and shall consist of six members, two of whom shall be appointed by the Governor, two of whom shall be appointed by the President pro tempore of the Senate and two of whom shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives. Of the two members appointed by the President pro tempore of the Senate, one must be recommended by the Minority Leader of the Senate. Of the two members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, one must be recommended by the Minority Leader of the House of Representatives. Each member of the board may appoint a duly authorized designee to act in that member's stead.

(b) Terms.-Each member of the Tobacco Settlement Board shall serve for a term of three years.

(c) Oath of office.—Each member of the Tobacco Settlement Board shall take an oath of office that he will, so far as it devolves upon him, diligently and honestly, administer the affairs of said board and that he will not knowingly violate or willfully permit to be violated any of the provisions of law applicable to this part. Such oath shall be subscribed by the member taking it and certified by the officer before whom it is taken and shall be immediately filed in the Office of the Secretary of the Commonwealth.

(d) Corporate power and legal advisor.—For the purposes of this part, the Tobacco Settlement Board shall possess the power and privileges of a corporation. The Attorney General of the Commonwealth shall be the legal advisor of the board.

On the question,

Will the House agree to the amendment?

The SPEAKER. On the question of the adoption of the amendment, does the gentleman desire recognition?

Mr. TIGUE. Yes, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. The Chair recognizes the gentleman, Mr. Tigue.

Mr. TIGUE. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, this amendment sets up the tobacco settlement trust fund. In my opinion, as we receive the tobacco settlement funds, I do not think we should just turn around and spend them on a year-by-year basis. This would set up a fund where we would spend 50 percent of the funds, and the other 50 percent of the funds would be put into a trust fund so that over the years, the accumulation of the money, we would calculate the interest, and in the end we would have a fund which would go on forever, basically, if we would only spin.

So I think, just like our personal finances, if we received a windfall, I do not think we would want to spend it immediately but rather invest it and use the investment money to maintain funding, and that is basically what this does. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

#### **CONSTITUTIONAL POINT OF ORDER**

The SPEAKER. Mr. Barley.

Mr. BARLEY. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

I reluctantly challenge this on constitutionality, Article III, section 11, of the State Constitution. I do not disagree with what the gentleman wants to do. However, the general appropriation bill is not the appropriate vehicle; it is not the appropriate legislation. The gentleman is proposing to establish a permanent board, so consequently, he is proposing to establish permanent law. He should be doing it in the Fiscal Code, not in a general appropriation bill. The general appropriation bill has a lifespan of 12 months. It takes effect July 1 and it expires June 30 of the subsequent year. So any board that we attempt to establish—Well, first of all, it is unconstitutional to do that. Even so, even if it were constitutional, we would be establishing it only for 12 months, and I believe the gentleman's intent would be to establish it on a more permanent basis.

So again, reluctantly I challenge the amendment on constitutionality.

The SPEAKER. The gentleman, Mr. Barley, raises a point of order that the amendment offered by the gentleman, Mr. Tigue, is unconstitutional. The Speaker under rule 4 is required to submit questions affecting constitutionality to the House. The Chair now does that.

On the question,

Will the House sustain the constitutionality of the amendment?

The SPEAKER. The Chair recognizes the gentleman, Mr. Tigue, on the question.

Mr. TIGUE. Mr. Speaker, I believe that this is totally constitutional for two reasons. One is, this does not appropriate any money or change anything that is in the general appropriations bill. Secondly, Mr. Barley was talking about it is only good for a year, and that is fine; I understand that. But this is the vehicle where we can do this for 1 year, and then later on as the year goes on, after we establish it for 1 year, we should go on to the second year and do it.

I do not particularly see anything in here which would be declared unconstitutional. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. On the question of constitutionality, Mr. Barley.

Mr. BARLEY. Mr. Speaker, again, what the gentleman is proposing to do, he is proposing to establish a permanent board in this amendment. He even dictates who will be on the board. That is something that is prohibited by the Constitution. I am not trying to be difficult, but I genuinely believe that it is unconstitutional and would be happy to work with the gentleman to establish it in an appropriate fashion, and I would urge members to cast a vote that this is unconstitutional.

The SPEAKER. On the question of constitutionality, those believing the amendment to be constitutional shall vote in the affirmative; those believing the amendment to be unconstitutional shall vote in the negative.

Will the House sustain the constitutionality of the amendment?

I would like to submit for the record some comments.

The SPEAKER. The gentleman will send his comments to the desk.

Mr. SATHER submitted the following remarks for the Legislative Journal:

This amendment provides financial support for a basic education – higher education science partnership in central Pennsylvania.

These moneys will be used to support a partnership between public and private institutions of higher education and participating public schools and school districts, whereby higher education institutions provide a science program that strengthens and enhances the science curriculum at the participating public schools or school districts.

A Science in Motion program is in place at Juniata College in Pennsylvania, and plans are being made to incorporate this program at other higher education facilities.

The students participating are enthusiastic about this program, and that is important.

The program now serves 25 school districts in the central region of Pennsylvania and 20 in the Pittsburgh area. It serves 30 chemistry and biology teachers and approximately 8,000-plus students. Plans are to have at least five more of these programs initiated throughout the Commonwealth with the passage of legislation to do so.

I would appreciate your support for this amendment.

Mr. GEORGE offered the following amendment No. A1170:

Amend Sec. 220, page 305, line 27, by removing the period after "REBATES" and inserting

, provided that only the school district where a taxpayer primarily resides shall distribute the property tax rebate and the Department of Revenue shall reimburse the school district for the rebate.

On the question,

Will the House agree to the amendment?

The SPEAKER. The Chair recognizes the gentleman, Mr. Barley. This is amendment 1170 offered by the gentleman, Mr. George.

Mr. BARLEY. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

I would like to point out to the members the specific language in this amendment. This amendment would mandate that school districts distribute the property tax rebate to taxpayers. So it would be a mandate, as I interpret it, placed on the local school districts to first redistribute or rebate to the taxpayers the refund that we passed unanimously back on March 13 in HB 2263. Now, after the school districts would rebate the money, then the Department of Revenue is directed to reimburse the school districts.

Now, Mr. Speaker, I oppose such an amendment simply because I believe it places significantly more responsibility on the school districts than is necessary. The House spoke loud and clear, as a matter of fact unanimously, on March 13 saying we wanted the taxpayers of the Commonwealth to receive a rebate, approximately \$100 per residence. This amendment, in my opinion, complicates that tremendously, and I would urge that the members vote "no" on the amendment.

The SPEAKER. The Chair recognizes the gentleman, Mr. George.

Mr. GEORGE. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, it honestly is not my intent to complicate. In deference to what my good friend, Mr. Barley, has said, this does not complicate but basically eradicates a lot of problems. For example, I as well as everyone else am happy that our homeowners are going to get \$100 back, and I assume that that

\$330 million is going to be welcomed as much as anything else. I simply thought, Mr. Speaker, from all that I read and all that we will read, for example, it will cost \$33 million to give this money back.

Secondly, Mr. Speaker, some whose earnings are so high and file a tax form in the long method will pay tax on that \$100.

And thirdly, Mr. Speaker – and I do not know who can argue what I am going to say now and try to put it in any manner but that that is legitimate - I remember, Mr. Speaker, when I first came down here an old gentleman that had been gassed in World War I and was getting \$100 a month pension from the Federal government, and because he had never been able to work from the time he was discharged, never worked at any gainful or meaningful employment, all he had coming was that \$100 a month, Mr. Speaker, plus the SSI (supplemental security income), because he was not making enough money, and therefore, he was entitled to SSI. He came to me on this day and said, we got an \$18-a-month increase in our pension, and I do not want it. And I said, why is it you would not want this? He said, because it will eliminate my SSI. So in order to take \$212, I will be losing \$384. Well, Mr. Speaker, the gentleman, Mr. Barley, can argue, but there are going to be hundreds of people- If you will, Mr. Speaker. I have difficulty bringing them to this attention.

The SPEAKER. Members, please.

Mr. GEORGE. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. Mr. George.

Mr. GEORGE. Thank you, sir.

I would hope they would listen, because their constituents are going to listen.

So those that get that \$100, and some of them are making the maximum that allows them to be able to get on the PACE (Pharmaceutical Assistance Contract for the Elderly) program, that \$100 is going to take them over that limit; it is going to be counted as earnings. And for those that might be deriving or benefiting from the rent or tax rebate, that \$100 could take them over the limit. And, Mr. Speaker, for those, and I just saw an amendment put in today that we all voted for to increase the amount of LIHEAP, since Pennsylvania is only 1 of 12 States that put no LIHEAP money in, that \$100 could take them above the limit. And, Mr. Speaker, those that we go back and tell our constituents we have a program – in fact, it was one of the first bills that I had passed into law, 3715, which gives them a \$10 license – that \$100 could take them over the limit.

So, you know, I am not going to stand here all day, Mr. Speaker, and I know you will appreciate that, but I am going to be very direct and say to my colleagues, surely, surely you would not want to make a program that is meant to help one that hurts. You would not want that \$100 to cut some individual that is benefiting on the PACE program and, therefore, having a couple of thousand dollars' worth of medication paid for under a fine program that people like you and I had voted for only to have them now not be able to because of that \$100.

Mr. Speaker, I do not know; maybe, Mr. Speaker, I do not deal in high finance like Mr. Barley, and maybe I do not know how these things operate, but you see, Mr. Speaker, that as we sit around and we think about ways to help our people, I differ no more or no differently than anyone else, and I simply thought, wow, everybody goes to the tax collector every year and pays their taxes; would it not be much easier, Mr. Speaker, if that tax collector gave you a receipt and deducted that \$100? Would that not, Mr. Speaker, not only make sense, it would make dollars? Would that not be, and, Mr. Speaker, it is not your fault, but I wish the entire congregation was here, because, Mr. Speaker, we would be wrong not to adopt this amendment. It does not cost the State a nickel. It saves them about \$30 million. It allows those that might, through no fault of their own, not be able to turn that money down lose out on a program that is beneficial.

I submit to you, Mr. Speaker, and to my friend, Mr. Barley, that we will sit here and we will pass 20 billion dollars' worth of amendments that are meant to help people, so this does not cost anything; it saves them money. So why in the world would we stand up, those that have the intelligence—

# THE SPEAKER PRO TEMPORE (J. SCOT CHADWICK) PRESIDING

The SPEAKER pro tempore. Mr. George, your 5 minutes have expired.

Mr. GEORGE. I am sorry; I am sorry.

Can I say, though, I trust that the colleagues will understand, this makes things much better.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. Thank you.

On the amendment, Mr. Barley.

Mr. BARLEY. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Once again to clarify what I believe the purpose of this amendment to be, this amendment will not interfere in any way with the \$100 rebate being remitted to homeowners. So tax consequences and so on will not be impacted one way or another. The language is very simple, very clear; it is really only less than a paragraph, but what the specific amendment does, it directs your local school districts to advance the \$100 rebate to eligible homeowners. Now, it may require your local school district to actually borrow the money for purposes of making the rebate payment, because the amendment directs them to make the payment in advance of the Department of Revenue making their payment to the school district. So I just think it is very important for you to understand that I do not believe your local school districts will appreciate this unfunded mandate that we are placing on them and requiring them to incur this expense prior to receiving the payment from the Department of Revenue.

I would urge you to vote "no" on the amendment.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. On the amendment, the Chair recognizes the gentleman from Franklin County, Mr. Coy.

Mr. COY. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, if you were hearing the same things in your district that I have in mine about the \$100 rebate that we passed, people are concerned whether they will actually see it. They are concerned about the Federal taxability of it. I think we have all heard that. I think what Representative George is trying to do with this amendment is trying to provide a more direct route. And frankly, I am not so much concerned about what the school districts think about it as I am the taxpayers who pay the taxes to the school districts. I think that they will appreciate this more direct route of funding. They do not have to get a letter from Harrisburg signed by anybody from Harrisburg; it is simply on their local property taxes. It comes off there rather than a State program from Harrisburg. It is more direct. I think it makes more sense, and I truly believe Mr. George when he says he is not trying to make it more difficult; he is trying to make it more simple.

I think it is a much more simplistic approach. I think it is an approach that makes sense, and I think we ought to adopt it. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. Those in favor of the amendment will vote "aye"; those opposed— The Chair apologizes. I did not see you.

The gentleman from Allegheny County, Mr. Costa, is recognized on the amendment.

Mr. COSTA. Mr. Speaker, can I ask the majority chairman of the Appropriations Committee a question about this amendment?

The SPEAKER pro tempore. Certainly, if that is how you choose to use your 5 minutes. The gentleman indicates that he will stand for interrogation. You may proceed.

Mr. COSTA. Mr. Speaker, under the Governor's proposal as it stands right now, if we receive this check, is it considered income?

Mr. BARLEY. There were discussions on that, I believe on the floor when we debated it. This amendment does nothing to change the fact that it may be income or it may not be. I do not believe that it will be considered income. I am not an accountant. We have some members that are accountants and would be better prepared to give that advice. So I certainly would not want to give that advice. But as I have had it explained to me by the Department of Revenue and as I have had it explained by accountants, it is a tax rebate. If you receive— The example I will use: If you file your tax return and you receive a rebate from the IRS (Internal Revenue Service) - you have paid your taxes in 1999; you file in March of 2000; maybe next week you will get your rebate check back. - that is not income; that is a rebate. That is not income for 2000. That is how I believe it is being interpreted. But again, I am relaying that secondhanded to you.

However, to make the point, this amendment does absolutely nothing, has absolutely no impact whatsoever on the question of taxable, nontaxable, or anything else. This creates an additional layer of bureaucracy which I believe will make it more difficult to get the money back to the taxpayer.

Mr. COSTA. But, Mr. Speaker, the reason I asked the question is, I have asked, like you have, and I have gotten various answers, and I am trying to pinpoint if it is income, and my point that I am trying to make, if it is income, I have the concern about the people that qualify today under the rent rebate program and also under PACE. I would hate to see that this would kick them over the limit and they would be knocked out of the system. That is why I am trying to find out. I am not trying to put you on the spot—

Mr. BARLEY. No-

Mr. COSTA. -I am just trying to get an answer.

Mr. BARLEY. Mr. Speaker, it is not considered income for those purposes. For Pennsylvania tax-calculating purposes, it is not income.

Mr. COSTA. Thank you. I appreciate your answers.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The gentleman, Mr. Casorio, is recognized on the amendment.

Mr. CASORIO. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

I will be brief.

I stand in support of the George amendment. I am speaking on behalf of the entire Westmoreland County delegation. This amendment— Yes; thank you. I knew that would carry some weight here this evening. My chairman gave me permission to do that.

We stand in support of the George amendment. Listen, we talk about so often here on the floor mandates and unfunded mandates, and school districts' hands are tied, and why can we not help folks at the State level. Well, we can. We have the opportunity to help the folks tonight. We can say that that \$100, even if it is federally taxable and they maybe see \$70 or \$60 of it, we can send that right from the school district right into the homeowners' pockets. No State red tape; no wrangling in Harrisburg; no back and forth – the money goes directly to the school districts. Those folks who are elected on the local level know best, know best for their constituents. They can send that money directly to the homeowners, the property owners, in our respective legislative districts.

This is a good amendment. It is an amendment that cuts through the red tape. Now we have an opportunity to say to the folks back in the district, listen, we hear you; we understand; we do not need the State involved in any more than they have to. Give the local school districts the opportunity to send that \$100 or \$70 right into the people's pockets.

The Westmoreland County delegation is in unanimous support of the George amendment. I urge a "yes" vote. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. On the amendment, the Chair recognizes the gentleman from Philadelphia County, Mr. Cohen.

Mr. COHEN. Mr. Speaker, I am not an accountant either, and I have heard differing opinions on the taxability of the proposed rebate, and I assume at some point or other the Internal Revenue Service, if it actually becomes law, the Internal Revenue Service will issue a ruling as to whether it is or is not taxable, and then we will all know that and we will not be besieged with different opinions from different accountants.

It seems to me that in influencing the Internal Revenue Service whenever they issue their ruling as to whether it is taxable, it would make a lot more sense if the money was coming to our constituents from the same source that took the money away from them in the first place. The Bud George amendment does that. Under the Bud George amendment, they will get it back from the same taxing agency that took it from them, and I think that would probably create a stronger case for the Internal Revenue Service not to make this taxable income, and therefore, I support the George amendment.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The gentleman from Lancaster County, Mr. Sturla, on the amendment.

Mr. STURLA. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

I rise in support of the George amendment. Mr. Speaker, there are about 3 million homeowners in Pennsylvania that will be due a tax rebate as a result of this program. Now, even if a minuscule portion of the information that the State gathers from the counties who are now trying to tabulate who it is that qualifies and who does not, even if a minuscule portion of that information is incorrect, there will be tens of thousands of people that qualify for rebates that will now be faced with trying to contact Harrisburg to figure out where the discrepancy is, whether it occurred at the county level, whether it occurred at the State level, where that occurred. If in fact this program is run through the school districts, it will make much more sense; it will be much easier for people in those communities, particularly senior citizens, to go down to their local school district and get this straightened out rather than trying to deal with somebody 100 or 200 miles away across the State in a bureaucracy in Harrisburg.

I support the George amendment, and I would urge all members to do so.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. On the amendment, the Chair recognizes the gentleman from Allegheny County, Mr. Walko.

Mr. WALKO. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

I rise in support of the George amendment.

It is quite clear, this is the week that we are preparing our tax returns. If anyone received a refund of State or local taxes last year, that is reported as taxable income this year. So I think it is very ironic that of the \$330 million that might be coming as a refund to taxpayers, the typical percentage of taxability might be 30 percent. Therefore, 30 percent of that \$330 million will be going to the Federal government, to the Internal Revenue Service, and I think that is a bad way to approach relieving people of their property tax burdens.

Now, we know that tax rebates are not taxable income in subsequent years. Therefore, I support the George amendment. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The gentleman, Mr. Petrone, is recognized on the amendment. The gentleman waives off.

The gentleman, Mr. Grucela, is recognized on the amendment.

Mr. GRUCELA. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, it is my understanding that the Department of Revenue has declared on the Federal form that this \$100 would be counted as income, and therefore, I share Representative Costa's concerns that this will put individuals over the limit and knock them away from important programs that have been in the past benefiting them. I know many, many senior citizens in my district have shown concern about this.

So I rise in support of the George amendment, and I also believe it would be, as was stated by others, a much more efficient and practical manner to do it, by giving the moneys to the school districts and having them refund the moneys. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. On the amendment, the Chair recognizes the gentleman from Allegheny County, Mr. Maher.

Mr. MAHER. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

A number of those speaking on the George amendment have included in their remarks comments to the effect of, well, gee, I am not an accountant, but- Well, as you know, I am an accountant, and I am concerned that those watching this debate may be misinformed about not just what they would do with this 100 bucks but what they would do with any refunds they received in the past. The simple, simple truth is this: If you have enjoyed a tax deduction on your Federal return and you have some part of that deduction returned to you, whether it is tax or whether it is a cost for your vehicle or whether it is anything else, if you claimed it as a deduction and then ultimately you do not have that cost, you do need to get even with Uncle Sam. There is no doubt about that. However, if you are not among that small minority of individuals who itemize deductions, this 100 bucks has no impact and no place on your tax return, no more so than any refunds that someone might have gotten this year for taxes paid in the year before, and I really hope we do not have Pennsylvanians who were tuned in to this debate making the terrible mistake that they will be reporting as income refunds of taxes that they do not need to be reporting as

income for Uncle Sam, and I would hope that our rhetoric does not get to the point that we actually cause Pennsylvanians to erroneously send more dollars to Uncle Sam than they need to. So I would hope that clarifies the taxability concept.

As to the savings that will theoretically be enjoyed by having school districts burdened with the task of sorting through who receives this refund, the notion that it should be savings by passing the buck, figuratively and literally, from the State to the school district is about the same concept as lengthening a blanket by cutting off one end and stitching it on the other end. At the end of the day the same amount of work needs to be accomplished in order for those refunds to be received by the Pennsylvania residents who are entitled to it, and whether that work is done on a State level or a local level, the work will need to be done. I think that I would rather not pass off this responsibility and burden the school districts who are not anticipating this, not desiring this, and, frankly, would probably be rather unhappy to have this extra burden and quite reasonably so.

We have made this decision. I think just about everybody in this body voted to approve this refund. And we took that responsibility; I think we need to carry it through. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. Mr. DeLuca, on the amendment.

Mr. DeLUCA. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, I rise to support the George amendment.

You know, what we are doing with this \$100 rebate is building another layer of bureaucracy out there in State government. When we talk approximately \$25 million to \$30 million to send \$100 back to our constituents, that is ridiculous, when we could do it the easy way, by giving a tax credit when you go in to pay your taxes. The school district would give you a \$100 tax credit, and we could use that \$30 million for early intervention programs or other programs that we want to fund – domestic violence. Why should we pay that out of administrative costs? If we are talking about being conservative and saving money, what better way to do it than let the school districts give a credit like the George amendment wants to do? I think that is very simple. Why we want to throw good money away to give somebody \$100 when we should be giving it back to another program.

So I would ask for an affirmative vote on Representative George's amendment. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair recognizes the Democratic leader, Mr. DeWeese.

Mr. DeWEESE. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

It seems to me that the Republicans who have avowed over the long span of time their incontrovertible affinity for local government, for diminution in paperwork, for reductio ad absurdum – reducing it to the smallest element – would join with their honorable rural colleague from Clearfield, Representative George.

Now, these many millions of dollars that the Ridge administration wants to remit to the local taxpayers can be done a variety of ways, and I was stupefied when the tall, handsome man in the back row tried to argue against the honorable Mr. George, because we have a chance, Mr. Speaker, to have the Revenue Department send out 501 checks when we have a chance to have them send out millions of checks. Now, there is something wrong here. The Republican Party, undergirded by many score years of proclamations that they are for smaller government, less red tape, a more streamlined and definitive system, the gentleman has come up with it. If I owe \$1,400 in property tax back home, boom, now I only owe \$1,300 in property tax back home. What is wrong with doing it in a more simple way? I cannot fathom anything, Mr. Speaker, unless there is bald, unabated politics suffused within your opposition. If you want Tom Ridge's check flying through the mail in October, a \$100 rebate that is really only going to be a \$65 rebate, if that is what you want, why do you not have the audacity to say it?

This fellow has come up with a really innovative effort to reduce the paperwork, to reduce the commotion, to reduce the cost. Why do you not want to reduce commotion and cost and paperwork? Why do you not want to do what your ethos has always exemplified? Now is the chance to put up or shut up. The George amendment should be embraced unanimously.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. Mr. Perzel.

Mr. PERZEL. Mr. Speaker, I could not resist.

I did not know it was the plan from the beginning never to give the taxpayers back that 50-percent property tax reduction. Now, obviously we were going to give it to the school districts and not to the people of Pennsylvania. And not to mention the fact that you told us that was \$500 million; now we are giving back \$330 million, and it is only, as you said, just \$100 back to the average taxpayer, Mr. Speaker.

I really cannot talk for Cumberland County, Dauphin County, a lot of the counties around the Commonwealth, because I know that they can trust the local elected officials to give the money back, but I come from Philadelphia where my mayor is telling us we are \$300 million short and that we have to give them \$300 million. So this money, only \$30 million of it can actually go out if he is right; the other \$300 million belongs to the city of Philadelphia to pay for the school system.

But I do not believe that the local school districts will send that money back. I did not believe it the first time you said it and I do not believe it now, and I know in my district, in the city of Philadelphia, they would never send them that check back. So I am asking the members to make sure that they allow the Secretary of Revenue to send the check back and get full credit for sending the check back.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. Those in favor of the amendment will vote "aye"; those opposed, "no." The members will proceed—

Mr. COLAFELLA. Mr. Speaker? Mr. Speaker?

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair apologizes, Mr. Colafella. I did not see you up. You are recognized.

Mr. COLAFELLA. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, quite frankly, I am really surprised by the argument that our school districts would not send it back, and in particular, Philadelphia School District would not send it back. Maybe that is why people from western Pennsylvania never vote for anyone who is from Philadelphia in a statewide election, because all they ever hear down here is how bad Philadelphia is, and it should not be that way. If we are going to be a State that is supposed to be a great State, we should be saying great things about every area of this State.

But let us talk about this particular amendment. But believe me, that is why people from western Pennsylvania do not vote for anyone who is from Philadelphia, because when they watch TV back home and hear everyone, even from Philadelphia, blast Philadelphia, why in the world if you are from western Pennsylvania would you want to support someone from Philadelphia? And I throw that out because I hope in the future we stop criticizing the city of Philadelphia, because I do not think they deserve it.

But on this particular amendment, I think it is an excellent idea. I think the idea that our school districts will be able to subtract \$100 from the property tax that is due them is an excellent idea and I think it makes a great deal of sense, and it takes all the politics out of this whole thing, because back home, that is why we are criticized on this particular issue, because it has become a political issue and it should not be a political issue. It should be an issue that we have a surplus in our budget and we want to reward the taxpayers who have been so good to us all these years.

For those reasons I support the George amendment.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. On the amendment, the gentleman, Mr. Perzel.

Mr. PERZEL. Mr. Speaker, I apologize, I guess to the members of the General Assembly, for saying anything bad about what the Philadelphia School District does. But on March 7 the city council at the hearings, they asked for copies of the school budget for the district of Philadelphia, and they said that the computer system, the same one that paid dead people in September, could not print out a copy of the budget for the members of city council to read. So when you have a situation where you have a computer paying dead people and you cannot give a copy of your budget to the members of city council - 14 of them Democrats, 3 Republican, Mr. Speaker they are not even giving them a copy of the budget, and you are telling me now they do not even know what they are short, that you want to give them the money to give back to the people, I do not believe it. Now, maybe that is negative, maybe I should not have said that here, but it is the truth; it is in the paper; you all read it. I do not trust them. They will not give it back.

Ms. STEELMAN. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Over the last 17 years, the 14 campuses of the State System of Higher Education have maintained independent administrative technology programs, and the reason for that is that when the State System was created, the level of technology was insufficient to support a consolidated program. However, with advances in technology, it is now possible for the State System of Higher Education to coordinate its administrative processes. The system is seeking a \$3.4-million line item, which would be matched by private contributions. That investment of \$3.4 million on the part of the Commonwealth would enable the State System of Higher Education, it is estimated, to save \$29 million over the next 10 years. That is a pretty good leverage, and I hope that you will support the amendment.

The money for this appropriation is taken from three separate line items in the budget – approximately \$2 million from the line item for information communications, \$2 million from the Technology Investment Program, and approximately \$2 million from the integrated criminal justice system line item.

This amendment, which is similar to a bill I sponsored, HB 2285, is offered with the Democratic leader, who had offered similar amendments in the past. It provides for necessary transportation services for individuals with disabilities through the same program that is offered for senjors under the lottery-funded program. It is necessary so that citizens with disabilities can meet the same needs in their daily lives, such as entertainment, shopping, going to a doctor. It is necessary so we can provide for people with disabilities as we provide for seniors, and I ask for an affirmative vote.

Now, this amendment advocates that the Office of Attorney General would be required to house a capital appeals

defense case unit, so at the same time that they are charged with the responsibility of prosecuting capital cases, they are now being asked by this amendment to create within that same office a unit that would provide for an appeal process in capital cases. Now, I believe that is a direct conflict of interest. I do not see, under any circumstance, how an agency that has the obligation under law to prosecute can turn around and be that same agency serving as the appeal board, and that is the effect of this

I intend to vote "no," and I think members need to pay particular attention to what it does and make their decisions accordingly.

# CONSIDERATION OF SB 1 CONTINUED

Ms. MANDERINO. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

I ask for support of amendment 1186.

I think the alleged conflict of interest is something that is very easily solved, and we do it a lot in State government in a lot of our various aspects of appropriation, and that can be done very easily through a grant program.

Probably many people watched on PCN (Pennsylvania Cable Network) recently the very serious and long debate in the Senate on the death penalty moratorium, and whether or not people were in favor of or against any kind of moratorium on the death penalty or the death penalty itself, to a person, almost unanimously, when people testified, either in their testimony in chief or during the question-and-answer period in that Senate hearing, the testifiers said that they knew and understood that it was critical and crucial to the fair administration of justice in our Commonwealth for cases to be prosecuted and defended, particularly in capital cases, with fair and adequate resources, and even the prosecutors who testified during the question-and-answer session said that they would support adequate funding for capital appeals defense.

This line item is making the amount of funding available for capital appeals defense equivalent to the amount of line item that is available from State resources for capital prosecution defense. I think it is very important for folks in this chamber and in Pennsylvania to understand that we are among the very few States in the United States that provide zero resources from the State for capital defense appeal cases, and that if we want to be honest and if we want to uphold our constitutional obligations, we will take very seriously the fair, equal, and adequate administration of justice and we will appropriate the adequate and fair and equal resources to this life-and-death issue, and so I ask for a "yes" vote.

Mr. BROWNE. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, amendment 1187 creates a new line item in the DCED budget for grants to county affordable housing trust funds and decreases the Opportunity Grant Program by the same amount of \$10 million.

It is an important amendment, I believe, because it is trying to reverse what I believe is a dangerous trend in our DCED budget regarding economic development. What we have seen over the last 5 years is a 49-percent decrease in appropriations for housing, which, in addition to that, is very inconsistent with what is going on in other States, given the fact that the State of Maryland, for example, is appropriating \$10 per capita to housing initiatives; we are appropriating only 62 cents. In our urban centers where we are seeing a flight of people into the suburban areas and decay in our housing stock, we need additional commitment at the Commonwealth level. The housing initiatives will give opportunities to our low-income individuals, our disabled, and our seniors.

We have the wherewithal in our budget to reverse this trend and provide matching money through this initiative to commitments that are made at the county level so that we can restabilize some of the communities in our State and give a boost to our economic development initiatives in some of our urban areas, and I ask for an affirmative vote.

### CONSTITUTIONAL POINT OF ORDER

The SPEAKER. The Chair recognizes the gentleman, Mr. Barley, on 1249.

Mr. BARLEY. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, I would like to raise the issue on I believe that this amendment constitutionality. is unconstitutional.

The SPEAKER. Will the gentleman yield.

The gentleman, Mr. Barley, raises the point of order that amendment No. 1249 is unconstitutional. Under rule 4, I am required to submit questions affecting the constitutionality of amendments to the floor for decision. Accordingly, I do that at this time.

On the question,

Will the House sustain the constitutionality of the amendment?

The SPEAKER. The Chair recognizes the gentleman, Mr. Barley.

Mr. BARLEY. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

I am not certain that what the gentleman wants to do is at dispute so much as the fact that the way he goes about doing it is unconstitutional.

The reason it is unconstitutional: We have existing law; we have law on the books of this Commonwealth, permanent law that has been passed by previous legislatures. The gentleman is attempting to use the general appropriations bill – I gave this explanation earlier in the day – which is a bill, when signed by the Governor, that becomes the law of the Commonwealth for a period of only 12 months, and the Constitution clearly prohibits the legislature from using the general appropriation bill – which, again, has an effective date of July 1 through June 30 – we are prohibited from using that as a means of modifying, amending, or changing permanent law, law that is in place and has been put in place by previous legislatures, or for that matter, if it was put in permanent law in an earlier session of this legislature, it would be unconstitutional to do that through the general appropriations bill.

Therefore, I urge the members of this body to find this amendment unconstitutional.

The SPEAKER. The gentleman, Mr. George.

Mr. GEORGE. Mr. Speaker, it is very difficult for me to understand when all day we have been putting what we call substantive language in. This CHIP program (Children's Health Insurance Program) is an ongoing program, and all we are really trying to do, Mr. Speaker, is that an individual that has got a very catastrophic illness and he is 19 years of age and turns 20, well, what do we do? Push him out the door and let the kid die? I mean, I do not think any of us want that. I am not arguing with the Appropriations chairman in what is or what is not, but we are the ones that make the law, and all the amendment does is say, look, we want to extend that from 19 to 21.

So I am not going to take much time. I am going to leave it up to you as to whether or not we should take the initiative to protect these kids that are left behind simply because they might be 1 month too old, and I would insist that this is constitutional. Thank you.

The SPEAKER. Mr. Barley.

Mr. BARLEY. Mr. Speaker, again, not to be antagonistic or in any way attempting to prolong the debate, but I think it is important.

Again, I am not necessarily disagreeing with what the gentleman is advocating. I am not certain I agree, but I certainly am not standing here in disagreement with changing the age from 19 to 21.

Very important: Either we have rules, we have a Constitution; either we follow that consistently, or we change the Constitution.

The Constitution is very clear: When we have permanent law, which we have permanent law that created the CHIP program, and in the CHIP program or when the CHIP program was created, it established the age of 19 as an eligibility, as a cutoff. Now, if this body determines we should extend that to 21, that certainly is something we can do, but we need to go back and amend that law, not attempt to do it in the budget, because it will only be effective for a period of 12 months, and in addition to that, we are prohibited from doing it by the Constitution.

That is my argument here, and I would just urge the members to vote accordingly that this is unconstitutional, doing it in this fashion.

The SPEAKER. The gentleman, Mr. George.

Mr. GEORGE. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, I am not going to belabor this.

I saw in this budget and other budgets we talk about moneys going into private schools. They say that is unconstitutional, but we are going to change the law. And I am going to tell you the same thing, that together we want to help the kids; we can change the law if in fact Mr. Barley is completely accurate. But I want to remind the gentleman that we are not starting a program for those that are overage. All we are doing is saying, those that are already on the program and turn 19 and no longer will receive treatment for the disease and the care that they need, they will simply be able to continue on this program until they are 21. I do not think—

The SPEAKER. Mr. George, the Chair apologizes to the gentleman. I should not have recognized you for the second time. Under our rules, on the question of constitutionality, you are permitted to speak only once. I would ask you to quickly wrap up your remarks because of that mistake I made.

Mr. GEORGE. I thank you, Mr. Speaker. I apologize to the gentleman, Mr. Barley. I simply ask that we do defend these children and say it is constitutional.

The SPEAKER. Mr. Cohen.

Mr. COHEN. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, I support the constitutionality of the George amendment.

This dispute is not really an issue of the State Constitution; this is an issue of enforceability of Mr. George's amendment. Mr. George's amendment, I would agree with Mr. Barley, cannot work to spend money until such time as the legislature will change the law. I agree with him. But that does not mean it is unconstitutional. It will be in effect for 12 months, and we will have all the months up to the passage of this amendment plus the 12 months of the effectiveness of this budget in order to change the law.

We did this for Governor Ridge's school choice program. That was in the budget. The money expired when, after 12 months, we did not pass Governor Ridge's school choice program.

But there is no constitutional issue here. The real issue is the ability to spend the money. In order for us to spend the money, we will need to change the law. But this amendment is clearly constitutional.

I urge a vote for the constitutionality of the George amendment.

The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

On the question of the constitutionality of the amendment, those believing the amendment to be constitutional will vote in the affirmative; those believing it to be unconstitutional will vote in the negative.

The SPEAKER. Mr. Sturla.

Mr. STURLA. Mr. Speaker, I would appreciate calling this to the attention of members, because there are several members that should not vote for this amendment.

There are 19 out of the 67 counties that will benefit by this amendment. Now, that sounds like it is a loser, except that 75 percent of the State's population lives in those 19 counties. So that transforms into about 70 to 75 percent of the members of this legislature that will benefit as a result of this amendment. There are some members, however, that will not.

There was a circular put around describing who will benefit, who will not, which counties benefit out of this, which ones will not, and I would advise members to follow that strictly, and if it does not benefit your district, vote against it, but there should be about 140 members that will benefit, whose districts will benefit directly from this amendment. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. The gentleman, Mr. Shaner.

Mr. SHANER. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

I am glad that the gentleman explained that there were going to be some people hurt as a result of this amendment.

I applaud the gentleman from the 96th Legislative District trying to get more highway safety maintenance money into his district. However, I resent the fact that he has to take this money from other members of the chamber and their districts.

However, for that reason I am going to vote against this amendment, and I urge the people that are going to get hurt also to vote against it. There should be a better method. He has other methods to do things.

The SPEAKER. The gentleman, Mr. Sainato. Will the gentleman yield.

Please, conferences on the floor, conferences on the floor, please break up.

Mr. SAINATO. Mr. Speaker, I rise to oppose this amendment.

The SPEAKER. Will the gentleman yield. Will the gentleman yield.

Please.

Mr. Sainato.

Mr. SAINATO. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, I rise to oppose this amendment.

I think each and every member in this House should look at this very closely. I have looked at this chart, and this would not have a good effect on Lawrence County. This would not have a good effect on many of the rural counties in Pennsylvania.

We have two able chairmen of the House Transportation Committee. Anytime you want to change these formulas, these types of measures should go through the committee system. We should not be doing this during a budget debate.

I look at these statistics. Like my colleague from Fayette County says, why should we rural counties have to suffer at the hands of the bigger counties?

I think of the roads in Lawrence County, Mr. Speaker, the roads in Lawrence County; we have potholes. When they fix our roads, they use tar and chip, then they throw a little blacktop down. Now we have something here that is going to take money away. We should not be taking money away, Mr. Speaker. We should be giving more money, more money to counties like Lawrence and the rural areas to put blacktop on those roads, not tar and chip. We need blacktop on the rural roads so we would have good roads. Just like you have in eastern Pennsylvania, we want them in western Pennsylvania. Mr. Speaker. So I urge my colleagues, say no to this, say no, because it is wrong; it is wrong. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. Mr. Barley.

Mr. BARLEY. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

I am not certain that I can really add a whole lot to the debate that has already taken place on this amendment.

We provided for our caucus members, and I believe the other side did the same for their caucus members, a printout that explains what this reallocation would mean. I, being from Lancaster County, will probably vote in favor of it because we end up getting \$64,000 more. Cumberland County receives \$64,000 more. I believe, in looking at the printout, Adams County will receive \$31,000 less. So I would imagine that the folks from Adams County would not look as kindly on this amendment.

I just caution members to look what it does. I am not certain this is the best way to be advancing public policy. I think we would be better, as one of the gentlemen from the other side mentioned, to do this through the Transportation Committee and allow it to be done in a more equitable and a more thoughtful manner. But nevertheless, I just encourage members to check their printout and see how it affects you individually.

The SPEAKER. The gentleman, Mr. Saylor.

Mr. SAYLOR. Mr. Speaker, I rise to oppose the amendment as well.

I come from a county that will gain under Mr. Sturla's amendment, but let us be honest about some of this stuff that we are doing here today; it is the fact that the dollar figures that change are very minimal and mean very little to a lot of areas.

Pitting rural legislators against city legislators and suburban areas is not a good thing. If we are going to deal with the highway funding formula, let us be honest and do it all at one time and do it in a right way, not doing it with a little bit here and a little bit there. I think the amendment is bad. I think it pits a lot of people against others, and I do not see any great results coming out of this amendment for any of our counties that tremendously.

So I oppose Representative Sturla's amendment and ask for a "no" vote. Thank you.

The SPEAKER. The gentleman, Mr. Geist.

Mr. GEIST. Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker.

This is the wrong place, the wrong time, and the wrong vehicle. We went through a 2-year process to raise revenue. We debated the issue thoroughly on the floor of the House, and for those who voted "no" to now come and say they want more money by changing the formula is not the way it is done.

It is a pretty big puzzle, Mr. Speaker. It all fits together differently. I can remember years ago when Representative Manderino redid it. I can remember working on this formula. This is nothing that you can do on the floor of the House in one amendment based upon greed. We have a responsibility to maintain roads, we have a responsibility to give so much money back to local governments, and we have to do that very prudently.

To make this vote a vote about who wins and who loses today is not the way that we do it. We have a 12-year plan that is very balanced. We go through an MPO (metropolitan planning organization) process. If we do this and we find that we could do this on the floor of the House, do we come back then and say, okay, I want this project for Lancaster County and you in Westmoreland County should give up your process and your projects? I think not.

I think the very best thing that we can do and the smartest thing that we can do is vote "no" on this amendment. Even if you vote "yes" and you think you win, it is a revolving door that can come around and haunt you later. Let us be prudent. If we are going to do this, let us do it right. There has never been one of these formulas that is Republican and/or Democrat and there has never been one that pits member versus member even in the same county.

I ask for a "no" vote.

The SPEAKER. The gentleman, Mr. Sturla, for the second time.

Mr. STURLA. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, I would be happy if this would be handled by the Transportation Committee. This same amendment has passed in four consecutive budgets, every time in the neighborhood of 150 votes. It has yet to be addressed by the Transportation Committee. It was something I tried to get the Secretary of Transportation to address when we did the increase in gasoline taxes. It was not addressed at that point in time. This is about funding maintenance on roads where the cars actually are.

We read in trade magazines that Pennsylvania has the worst roads of all the States, and we are trying to work on that, but as long as we are maintaining roads that get 1,000 or 2,000 cars a day at a better and higher level than we are roads that get 10,000 and 20,000 cars a day, we are never going to improve the people's perception of the roads in Pennsylvania.

What this amendment does is seeks to drive dollars where the people actually drive on the roads. That is why it has passed in four consecutive budgets, why I hope it will pass in this budget, and why I hope if it gets ripped out, we will eventually address it in the Transportation Committee. Thank you.

Mr. BARLEY. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

According to Article III, section 11, of the Pennsylvania Constitution, when we are changing substantive law, we must do it – in this case, it should be done in the Administrative Code. What the gentleman seeks to do may or may not be a good idea. Again, I am not necessarily disputing what the gentleman wants to do, but he is using the wrong legislative vehicle. He is using the general appropriations bill to amend, really to amend a current law, and the law that governs what the gentleman wants to do is the Administrative Code. So, therefore, according to the Constitution, clearly we are prohibited from doing what this amendment would attempt to do, and I would urge the members to find this to be unconstitutional.

The SPEAKER. On the question of constitutionality, Mr. George.

Mr. GEORGE. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, all this does is insist on a condition in regard to what we are doing. There has not been an amendment that was put in on this day that did not have a specific condition.

Now, this does not change the law. It adds to section 2003, "CONTRACTS PREREQUISITE." There is not a piece of land that the highway department buys that they do not advertise its purchase. There is not a real that the highway department or anyone else within State government buys that is not conditioned on publicizing. All this does is condition the existing section 2003 and say it is a condition that when you buy a property over \$100,000, simply let the people know. I do not know why he would challenge it unless they are afraid of it.

#### VOTE STRICKEN

The SPEAKER. Mr. Barley? The clerk will strike the board.

The Chair recognizes the gentleman, Mr. Barley.

Mr. BARLEY. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

I wanted to point out to the members -I do not know that it is necessary to go through this debate a second time; I am assuming someone wanted to change their vote - this was passed when it was before the members before, but there were 66 negative votes. This is the amendment that limits the ability for our prison system to privatize various services as they move forward.

So this amendment, again, is a very restrictive amendment, and we are placing those restrictions on the corrections system, and I would just want members to be aware that they may want to vote "no." There were 66 of you voted "no" when it was considered the first time.

The SPEAKER, Mr. Birmelin.

Mr. BIRMELIN. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

I will be brief.

But just to reiterate the comments that I made in followup to Representative Barley earlier this evening, we have an ongoing situation in our prisons today where we are always trying to improve, we are always trying to look to do a better job, and we are doing that and have been doing that in some different programs, and I pointed out the example of the drug and alcohol treatment at the State correctional institution at Chester, which is the first of its kind in Pennsylvania. And we have the opportunity to do things, because we are always looking for innovative ways to do a better job. When your recidivism rate in your prisons is 50, sometimes 75 percent, we cannot say we have reached some threshold, that we cannot do better, that we cannot find a more effective way of dealing with our criminals, and to pass this amendment is to take away a tool that is going to help us to prevent that recidivism rate from getting any lower. So if you really want to do something to help our prison system improve, do a better job, try to rehabilitate prisoners, do not take away the option they have of trying to outsource some of these services that can be done better, and I might add sometimes cheaper, than are being done currently in our prisons.

Please vote "no" on this amendment.

The SPEAKER. Mr. DeWeese.

Mr. DeWEESE. Cheaper; cheaper, the man says, as he leans toward the melancholy concept of a Rent-A-Cop, Rent-A-Cops running our big State penitentiaries. We had 128 Republicans and Democrats vote to sustain this amendment the last time.

Now, this is not the middle of the night. The iron tongue of midnight doth not toll 12, but nevertheless, the hours are evolving and people are getting restless. This is a fundamental matter of how we are going to run our penitentiaries in the State of Pennsylvania, and I would just politely admonish the 128 people that voted to sustain this amendment to maintain their allegiance. We are not just walking the area, so to speak; this is serious business. This is Rent-A-Cop. I cannot believe that we are discussing this. Our most hardened criminals should be dealt with by professional correctional officers and a professional cadre that work in our penitentiaries.

Now, we all know and if we do not we should reaffirm the fact that many people in the medical delivery system in our penitentiaries are privatized. This amendment, Mr. Speaker, is going to do nothing to diminish the many hundreds and hundreds of health-care delivery workers that are already in the State penitentiary system. We already have a certain small segment of privatization in Pennsylvania's prison system, but we do not want the door to be any wider. We want to make

certain that State workers, State workers, State workers, not Rent-A-Cops, are running Pennsylvania's penitentiaries.

I would ask for an affirmative vote. Thank you. The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

#### **REMARKS SUBMITTED FOR THE RECORD**

The SPEAKER. For what purpose does the gentleman, Mr. Solobay, rise?

Mr. SOLOBAY. Mr. Speaker, earlier this evening we voted on amendment 1143. At that time I opted not to make comment but do have comments for the record.

The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the gentleman. Send them to the desk.

Mr. SOLOBAY submitted the following remarks for the Legislative Journal:

When we needed teachers, we encouraged students to become educators.

When there was a need for science, math, and computer professionals, we supported students who showed an interest in these professions.

We need to make the same commitment to the agricultural sciences if we want to keep our family farms and maintain our food production.

My amendment today would increase the funding level for the Future Farmers of America from the current appropriation of \$63,000 to \$100,000.

FFA (Future Farmers of America) is the largest intercurricular youth organization in the country, and Pennsylvania is home to the largest FFA chapter in the country.

The Pennsylvania chapter currently has over 8,500 members, and the membership has continued to increase over the past several years.

The increase in funding is needed to keep up with the expanded membership and to help support and continue to encourage young people that want to work in this very important profession.

FFA is a national organization dedicated to preparing members for leadership and careers in agriculture science, business, and technology.

The program helps students develop their potential for successful leadership, personal development, and career success. The organization provides recognition for hands-on agricultural programs and promotes opportunities to enhance community involvement.

The current funding level of \$63,000 has allowed FFA to support activities such as the Legislative Leadership Conference, Made for Excellence (a personal development conference), career development team competitions in over 20 skill areas including public speaking, salesmanship, animal judging, and others.

The funds are also used to recognize outstanding agricultural leadership and accomplishments of tomorrow's agricultural leaders.

Only a small percentage of the funding (less than 5 percent) is used for administrative costs, and that 5 percent is primarily used to coordinate and publicize FFA activities and programs.

Additional funding could be used to:

\* Promote agricultural education and the opportunities that exist within the FFA program.

\* Develop promotional materials that focus on the agricultural industry in general and also on agricultural education and the FFA

\* Allow greater travel and outreach educational opportunities in school districts that either do not have programs or have a declining enrollment.

\* Promote Pennsylvania agriculture opportunities and our agricultural products.

l ask for your support on this amendment and a "yes" vote for this worthwhile funding.

Thank you.

On the question recurring,

The SPEAKER. The Chair has in its hand a number of amendments that were filed late. My sentiments exactly. However, it is not my decision but rather the decision of the sponsors of these amendments, and on the question of suspension of the rules, it is up to the members themselves. But let me first go through and see if any of these are being withdrawn.

Mr. Clymer, you have amendment 1216. Do you wish to offer this? Do you wish to try and suspend the rules to offer this amendment?

The gentleman, as you note, is putting on his jacket, which is bad news. The Chair recognizes the gentleman, Mr. Clymer.

Mr. CLYMER. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, we are still in the budget process. I do feel I have an opportunity to somehow impact on the budget, to get my two amendments that I had proposed, that were, I think, I hour late, in getting approved. Having said that, I will withdraw my amendment.

The SPEAKER. Now a real test. Mr. Rohrer, I have here before me amendment 1277. Do you wish to move to suspend the rules, or—

Mr. ROHRER. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Unfortunately, I would like to try to do that.

The SPEAKER. The gentleman is well within his rights.

#### MOTION TO SUSPEND RULES

The SPEAKER. The Chair recognizes the gentleman, Mr. Rohrer.

Mr. ROHRER. Mr. Speaker, I move that the rules of the House be suspended to permit me to offer amendment A1277 to SB 1, PN 1819.

The SPEAKER. On that question, this is debatable only by the floor leaders or their assignees, if you will.

For the benefit of the members, to suspend the rules it takes a two-thirds vote under the rules that pertain to the budget.

On the question,

Will the House agree to the motion?

The SPEAKER. On the question of suspension, the gentleman, Mr. Rohrer.

Mr. ROHRER. Mr. Speaker, I would like to, obviously, ask that the House suspend the rules. A little bit different on this amendment.

As the Republicans know on our side and I think Democrats know on that side, the amendment was timely written. Because of a communication problem between the Reference Bureau and staff, the amendment in fact was not filed in time. However, it certainly was written in time, and it was the full intent and staff fully knew as well as most members of this House knew that the amendment was going to be offered, and in fact it is on our list on our Republican side as we sit here tonight. To show how things can happen, we did vote an amendment earlier tonight that had but a certificate filed, but the language was never received by any member of this House and, frankly, was never received by staff as well.

So I am requesting that the members provide a courtesy to another member. This is not the typical late-amendment filing as many are. This is not in that category. I believe that this amendment and the debate that would ensue would probably be the best debate that we have had on this floor, because it really does absolutely talk about what goes into a budget.

The SPEAKER. Mr. Rohrer?

Mr. ROHRER. Yes, sir?

The SPEAKER. I have allowed you to debate, despite the fact that Mr. Barley is the designee of the majority leader in this matter. You cannot go into the substance of your amendment, though. I mean, you just cannot do that.

Mr. ROHRER. Mr. Speaker, I am trying not to go into the subject, but I am trying to give just a little bit of an idea for those who do not know so that they can appropriately decide whether or not to suspend the rules. Can I afford just a little bit of latitude on that degree? A little bit; a little bit.

For those who do not know, this amendment has as a part of it a set-aside of \$400 million for the elimination of the inheritance tax in 2 years. This amendment, if we were to adopt it, would allow for this House for the first time in the history of this State to adopt what would be a zero-growth budget but at the same time—

The SPEAKER. Mr. Rohrer—

Mr. ROHRER. —allow for growth in this State and allow this General Assembly to appropriate \$400 million. I got to say it, Mr. Speaker. Thank you.

The SPEAKER. You are quite welcome.

On the question, the gentleman, Mr. Barley, as the designee of the majority leader.

Mr. BARLEY. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

I regretfully stand here and oppose one of my colleagues, one of my fellow caucus members, on their request to suspend the rules. It is a courtesy that I normally would support extending to any member. However, we are operating under rule 19(b), which is different than the normal rules of the House. We adopted this rule in order for the budget process to be handled in a timely fashion and in an orderly fashion.

On March 21 I stood at this microphone and announced to members that they would have until 2 o'clock on April 3 to file their amendments. That provided 13 days, 13 calendar days, for members to have their amendments drafted and filed. I believe that that is more than adequate time, and in all fairness to the members that filed 250 amendments in a timely fashion, I do not believe we should stand here today and set aside the provisions that we agreed on under rule 19(b). Therefore, Mr. Speaker, I oppose this motion to suspend the rules and would ask my colleagues to do likewise.

The SPEAKER. The Chair recognizes the gentleman, Mr. DeWeese.

Mr. DeWEESE. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

This is an piquant opportunity for those of us on this side of the aisle to watch two thoroughbreds, two conservative individuals in the Grand Old Party, decide which one can be more pristine in their fiscal policy perspectives, and I will have to admit, this is one of the more delectable moments of debate I have experienced in recent months. I would like to think that the gentleman from the 128th, Mr. Rohrer, who has made the motion, and he is trying to make a zero-growth budget – zero-growth budget. It sounds like Ronald Reagan; it sounds like pure Republicanism; it sounds like undiluted Republicanism to me.

The SPEAKER. Mr. DeWeese, no debate.

Mr. DeWEESE. I am under the impression, with all due respect - and we have had some amicability lately, sir, Mr. Speaker - I think that as a floor leader, substantial amplitude should be rendered to the floor leader.

Again. So the gentleman from Lancaster, the honorable Appropriations Committee chairman, big-spending, liberal Lancaster County Republican politician, I want— No; number one, I want to suspend the rules and vote against you, sir. But let the fight begin. I want to see Republican conservatives and Republican conservatives clash. I want to feel the concussion.

My advice to my colleagues would be, vote "yes" to suspend the rules, and then vote "no" on what you are trying to do. Thank you.

The SPEAKER. Ah, I am so tempted to comment on the consistency of your position.

On the question of suspension of the rules, those in favor of suspending the rules will vote "aye"; opposed, "no." One hundred and thirty-five votes are necessary to suspend the rules.

The SPEAKER. Ms. Josephs, I have a late amendment filed by you, A1307. Do you still desire to offer this? Do you desire to move to suspend the rules to offer this amendment which you filed late?

Ms. JOSEPHS. Mr. Speaker, I am a short politician and I do short business. No thank you.

The SPEAKER. A smart politician.

Mr. Herman, I have— I am a good politician. I am not going to comment on that. No; no.

Mr. George has a late filing of amendment 1402.

Mr. GEORGE. I am withdrawing it, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

How about 1421?

Mr. GEORGE. You are withdrawing that one, Mr. Speaker. The SPEAKER. Very good.

Mr. Thomas, Curt Thomas, 1471?

Mr. THOMAS. Mr. Speaker, that amendment is a duplicate. The original amendment has already been approved. I withdraw that duplicate.

Bill as amended was agreed to.

The SPEAKER. This bill has been considered on three different days and agreed to and is now on final passage.

The question is, shall the bill pass finally?

Agreeable to the provisions of the Constitution, the yeas and nays will now be taken.

(Members proceeded to vote.)

#### VOTE STRICKEN

The SPEAKER. The clerk will strike the board.

Does the gentleman, Mr. Rohrer, desire recognition on final passage?

Mr. ROHRER. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. The gentleman is recognized.

Mr. ROHRER. Since we were not able to debate the merits of the amendment 1277, it definitely has bearing on the final passage of SB 1. And what I would like to do is to contrast what in fact we are doing with SB 1 and what we are giving and doing to the people of this State as contrasted to what we could have done had we rightly, in my opinion, considered the merits of the amendment.

Let me cite for a couple of things these: It seemed to me that it would have been a fantastic thing to have gone into this new millennium with the first budget of the 2000 year doing something historically different for this State. We could have done that. Frankly, we still could if the Senate would do it, but that appears unlikely. But here it is, we are going into this new millennium with a budget of \$20 billion. That includes \$330 million of tax rebate, one-time funding - I am aware of that - and that is a legitimate thing to do, give money back to the taxpayer. So you back that out, that leaves a budget of \$19.7 billion. That is a lot of money. Do you know how much \$19.7 billion is? The Governor said that is \$400 million than what we did last year. He said that is a 2.1-percent spending increase, which is a reasonable number. The problem is, it is not, because when we sat in this House last May, we passed a budget that was \$19.0 billion - not 19.3, 19.0. That is really a 3.6-percent increase or \$700 million more than we sat here last year and passed. But it goes beyond that.

The Governor's Budget Office upon interrogation from me in an Appropriations Committee hearing, when I asked the Secretary to come back to us with information that would lead to a zero-growth budget, he informed us that the Office of the Budget had in fact cut over \$800 million from the budget before they added spending to it. Now, in my opinion, those were legitimate cuts, and every one of you who sit here and will vote for this will vote for reductions in spending over last year of over \$800 million. Now, they are one-time funding items; they are a \$200-million savings in debt refinancing; they are programs that have run their course, legitimate in my opinion, but that is \$800 million-plus. So you take \$800 million-plus off of \$19.3 billion, which is not the base but the base that we are using this year for this budget, it takes you down to \$18.4 billion. Now, that is where the budget starts. And what are we voting through this year? 19.7. Do you know what kind of an increase that is? 6.1 percent. That is really what we are spending in new moneys - \$1.2 billion. So when we as a group recommended zero growth, we did it at, frankly, 19.3, because at that point, before we got all the information, that is what we thought the budget base was, but it is not. So in our amendment at \$19.3 billion, you are still spending more than last year.

There is not one item, there is not one item that would have to take cuts under this proposal that was embodied in the amendment, not one – not one less education dollar; not one less correction dollar; frankly, not one less welfare dollar. Frankly, they could have all gotten increases. But in addition to that, you could have taken \$400 million and set it aside for inheritance tax elimination in 2 years, and what have we all been saying has been important to us? The elimination of the inheritance tax. We could have done it. This budget says nothing about it and, frankly, spends the money that we could have, should have used for reduction of inheritance tax, which we all know feeds suburban sprawl and guarantees that new businesses are not passed on to the second generation. We could have done that with no pain.

Now, let me rephrase what this does. If we were to eliminate the inheritance tax and include it as a part of this budget, so instead of a \$19.7-billion budget it would be a \$19.3 billion—

The SPEAKER. Mr. Rohrer?

Mr. ROHRER. —you do not increase the base by \$400 million.

The SPEAKER. Your 5-minute limitation is-

Mr. ROHRER. Okay; my time is up. I am going to have to stop because of 5 minutes, but let that suffice to say that there were a lot of things we could have done embodied in that no-growth, \$19.3-billion budget that would have benefited everybody in here, including every taxpayer and every person in our district. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Butler, Mr. Metcalfe; final passage, 5-minute limitation.

Mr. METCALFE. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

I just wanted to speak for a couple of minutes – I do not know if I will take up the full 5 minutes; I will try not to – regarding the current budget that we are now considering with the absence of the amendment that Mr. Rohrer had tried to propose, that we were unable to get the suspension of the rules for. But there are 10 of us that many of you know had signed a letter that we sent to the majority leader, and many of you have received or seen a copy of that, that we called for a zero-percent-growth budget this year, and in that we were also calling for an elimination of the inheritance tax over the next 2 years and an elimination of the capital stock and franchise tax over the next 4 years. But today I stand before you, sent here by the taxpayers of the 12th District, speaking to you on behalf of the children of the 12th District, one of which is my daughter, looking at the future of Pennsylvania, looking at the past of Pennsylvania, and hoping that we can learn something from the past to apply to the future.

As we look at the past budgets over the last 10 years, we have seen our spending as a State increase by approximately 60 percent. Sixty percent we have increased our spending, while at the same time our population growth has been stagnant at .2 percent. So who do we expect to keep paying for more and more spending as our young people flee the State? As our population gets more elderly, do we expect them to keep paying the increased taxes to increase programs and increase spending in the State of Pennsylvania? We cannot expect our citizenry to keep funding more and more spending. We have to do things different if we are going to see a different result. In order to see our young people— Mr. Speaker? Mr. Speaker, I am running on kind of a short time here, and I would like at least the appearance of people listening.

The SPEAKER. The gentleman will yield.

The gentleman is exactly correct. It is late, but we have just a short ways to go. Now, please.

Mr. METCALFE. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

I did not plan on speaking the full 5 minutes, but with the stoppages, I guess I will have to.

The SPEAKER. You have 2 1/2 minutes to go.

Mr. METCALFE. Thank you.

As I mentioned, our population growth is stagnant. We are 47th in the nation in job creation. Why do our young people leave Pennsylvania? It is obvious: They are not able to find the jobs that would keep them here. Why are we seeing this, what has been termed "suburban sprawl," inheritance taxes driving many of our families off of their property and forcing them— Mr. Speaker?

The SPEAKER. Please; please. Members, take your seats.

Mr. METCALFE. For the benefit of our children, for the benefit of my daughter who is 13 and for the benefit of all of your children, grandchildren, nieces and nephews, I think that we really need to evaluate where our State is heading with this increased spending we have seen over the last 10 years. The amendment that we were trying to offer earlier would have allowed us to do that, but since we were unable to get that passed, hopefully we will be able to see some changes in conference committee and see a zero-percent-growth budget brought back here for us to consider, one in which we can eliminate the inheritance tax in 2 years and eliminate the capital stock and franchise tax in 4 years, one in which we can give hope and give promise to our young generation that would like to be able to stay here where they have grown up, to be able to maintain jobs here, to be able to get jobs here if we see jobs created.

So I would ask for a "no" vote on this budget, that we might be able to reconsider and make the changes that are necessary for the wealth of our Commonwealth, for the common wealth of our Commonwealth, for the good of our children, for the good of all of our citizenry. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Cambria, Mr. Yewcic.

Mr. YEWCIC. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

I, too, am not going to support the budget. About a month or so ago I was told that I was going to vote for a budget with a 2.1-percent increase, and I thought that was fairly reasonable. But I began to realize over the last several years that we have had tremendous surpluses, so if we had just kept the budget to the rate of inflation, we could have eliminated the inheritance tax, the capital stock and franchise tax, one or the other. We could have done a lot of things for the people of Pennsylvania. But here we are again, playing this shell game with numbers, when the real numbers indicate a 6.1-percent increase in new spending this year.

And today's process, I sat here for 8 hours and voted for a couple hundred amendments with little or no debate, and I am not sure anyone here knows the impact of everything we did here today. So in that respect I am going to vote against this budget. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

Mr. Evans?

Mr. EVANS. Yes.

The SPEAKER. The gentleman, Mr. Evans.

Mr. EVANS. Thank you.

Mr. Speaker, I was just asking a few of my colleagues here on this side of the aisle about a little history, and when I was listening to a number of speakers who stood up and spoke, I was asking them if they were around in 1992, because I heard the statement that there never was a no-growth budget that ever passed this House. Well, in 1992 the Senate Republicans controlled the Senate and the House Democrats controlled the House and there was a Democratic Governor, and in 1992 we passed a no-growth budget. Now, a lot of people did not like it because there was a lot of pain - 1992, no-growth budget. A lot of people got upset about it, but this side of the aisle joined with the Senate Republicans, and we passed a no-growth budget. So I am saying that to clarify the record, because if anyone thinks that we are fearful of standing up and making hard decisions, we have made hard decisions, but I want the record to understand, I want people to understand, that this side of the aisle, we bit the bullet; we know what it is like with a no-growth budget. So though we have been smiling and laughing about it, 1992, so we can set the record straight, that is exactly what we did in this Commonwealth of Pennsylvania; we stood up.

Secondly, when we talk about tax cuts, 1994. The same exact tax cuts that the current Governor has accelerated are the tax cuts that were established by the Casey administration — the same exact tax cuts. The difference was that Governor Casey had expanded it over the next 3 to 4 years. But these same exact tax cuts had been started by the Democrats.

So I want to put those things on the record so we can set the record straight, that in 1992 we had a no-growth budget, and in 1994, the same tax cuts that you see taking place today we started in 1994.

I just wanted to set the record straight. I will be supporting SB 1. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. Mr. Barley.

Mr. BARLEY. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

As we are about to vote on final passage, I would just like to say that this is truly a historic opportunity for us, this budget that we are passing or are about to pass this evening. It is a balanced budget, a budget that provides for the largest tax reduction in the history of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. We had fine bipartisan cooperation, not only today, but we had that type of cooperation throughout the process.

The legislature has done its job to date in the budget process. I want to commend everybody, thank them, and ask for an affirmative vote on final passage of SB 1.

The SPEAKER. The gentleman, Mr. Benninghoff.

Mr. BENNINGHOFF. I will keep this brief because I know people are getting antsy, but two things. I want to make a correction. If I remember correctly, the 1992 budget had a no-growth because 1991 had one of the largest tax increases in Pennsylvania's history.

First of all, I just want to thank our leadership, because they did take some time to listen to some of us who wanted to propose this, and whether you like it or not, that is what this debate process is all about. That is what each one of you, if I read through your original campaign pieces, probably talked about, wanting to be part of the process, coming down here and making a difference, less spending, whatever you may have said. Think about your first campaign piece. It is one of the reasons I joined with Representative Rohrer. I think Sam deserves some credit for at least being courageous.

It is easy whether you are in a herd of cows or in a herd of people to follow the herd, and I think it is important in an institution that stands on individualism and debate and some liberties and freedoms, which a lot of us talk about to our young people, to tell them to stand up for, and respect I would not mind mentioning as well, that that is why we are here, to speak up for the people back home, many of which ask you to please lower their taxes, please cut their spending.

I am not going to tell you how to vote on this thing; I am going to tell you to listen to your constituents. My people say that to me whether I am in a grocery store, coming out of church, or whatever. I give Sam and some of the other members of this initiative credit for at least being willing to stand up for a new idea, to stir up some debate, because that is what this is all about, and I think the budget process is probably one of the most important issues that we as individuals, as members elected by our people, come down here to debate for, and again, I thank the leadership for allowing us to do that.

So think about it, think about why you were first elected, and then cast your vote. Thank you, Mr. Speaker, for allotting the time.

The SPEAKER. The gentleman, Mr. George.

Mr. GEORGE. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, this is my 26th time at a budget. I do not believe that if you are here 50 that you can say you honestly are happy with every budget. I listen to these people talking about cutting government. Everybody wants to cut it. That is why tonight, Mr. Speaker, I put an amendment in that cuts 5 percent off of every department in State government and let the Governor make that choice. So I attempted to do something. Now, it does not cut the meat and potatoes, Mr. Speaker; it just cuts the so-called administration. That is where it is heavy.

Now, we do not know whether, those of us that will be here when this bill comes back, whether it will have our amendments in. That is when I will make the final decision. But at this time getting all these programs in that the people wanted, being able to cut State government's administrative costs as we were willing to do tonight, I intend to vote for the budget and then wait until it comes back from the Senate. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. The gentleman from Philadelphia County, Mr. Thomas.

Mr. THOMAS. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, I rise to support SB 1. During my tenure I have voted against more budgets than I have supported, because I have always had concerns about whether or not we have fairly addressed those in the dawn of life, twilight of life, and those working families, people who go out and work every day to take care of their families.

And while we have not accomplished all that I wanted in SB 1, I do want to thank my colleagues on both sides of the aisle. I think in total I put forth maybe 25, 30 proposals, and I want to thank my colleagues for supporting those proposals, and I hope and trust that when they come back from the Senate, that the Senate will sustain the good work that we have done on this side of the Assembly.

And last but not least, I would like to thank leadership from both sides, and thank you, Mr. Speaker. This is the first time that I have seen amendments and I have seen the budget organized in a way that each and every one of us could play a substantial part in responding to it. And so I want to thank whoever was responsible for organizing these amendments and organizing this process in the way that we have had an opportunity to address it.

So I am asking my colleagues on both sides of the aisle to join me in supporting SB 1, and let us fight like heck to make sure that the Senate sustains what we have done in the House today. Thank you.

The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

The gentleman, Mr. DeWeese.

Mr. DeWEESE. Just one last opportunity to reassert what I believe will be the effectiveness of Bud George's amendment. I think the 5-percent cut in government costs that Bud put into the measure, if adopted by the Senate, will be collateral with what Mr. Rohrer was attempting to do, and I want to ask for an affirmative vote. But I also want to ask that our Republican colleagues urge their brethren and sisters in the Senate to sustain the 5-percent cut that the George amendment realized. Thank you.

The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

Mr. HUTCHINSON. Mr. Speaker, I rise to submit some written remarks regarding amendment A1137.

Mr. HUTCHINSON submitted the following remarks for the Legislative Journal:

I rise today to ask the members' support for increased funding for Pennsylvania's heritage parks from \$2.75 million to \$5 million. Such an investment is a key part of the ongoing efforts we all take part in to remake Pennsylvania for the future. As we seek to create more new, family-sustaining jobs, we must continually look for ways to make Pennsylvania a more attractive place to live. One impediment to a new, improved future has been the failure of our population growth to keep up with our economic progress, which weakens Pennsylvania's competitive position in several ways.

As one of our courses of action, we must stress all of Pennsylvania's positives – our colorful economic and industrial history, cultural diversity, a wonderfully varied ethnic heritage, unparalleled recreational opportunities, and abundant natural resources.

One specific way to accomplish these goals is to increase funding for Pennsylvania's heritage parks from its current \$2.75-million appropriation to \$5 million. Far from small plots of green space used for recreation as the traditional "park" is often defined, heritage parks comprise much of Pennsylvania's vast land area, extending over large geographic regions, and are wonderfully varied.

Heritage parks are living history classrooms. They preserve our natural resources and provide recreational opportunities. They trumpet Pennsylvania's diversity and culture to the world and display what has made our State great. And they create jobs and attract significant investment and people to our Commonwealth.

Now, heritage parks need our help to grow and flourish. There are now nine designated heritage parks with two more regions under study, and those regions may be designated as part of the system as early as next year. The first heritage park was designated in 1991. State funding reached the \$2-million mark in 1992 when there were only three parks. Despite the fact that six more parks have been designated since then, funding has not kept pace — with no increases since fiscal year 1997-98, while additional dollars are being used to support an increasing number of designated parks other than heritage parks.

Nearly every one of us in this body can lay claim to a part of the State's heritage park system. Forty-eight of our 67 counties contain a portion of at least one of the State's heritage parks or the two additional regions under study. This means that virtually every corner of the State would have an interest in and would benefit from a heritage park.

Tourism is big business in Pennsylvania and heritage tourism is a big part of that business. According to a report commissioned by the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, the economic impact of heritage tourism in Pennsylvania reached \$5.35 billion in 1997 - a fifth of the State's tourism dollars. That included \$1.34 billion in wages and salaries, \$617 million in taxes, and more than 69,000 jobs. Of all leisure trips to Pennsylvania, 25 percent were attributed to heritage tourism, representing \$2.99 billion in direct expenditures. And, heritage tourism has been found to be one of the fastest growing segments of the tourism industry.

Statewide hearings held by the Joint Legislative Air and Water Pollution Control and Conservation Committee provided compelling testimony from State and local officials and volunteers stressing the need for more resources for heritage parks. DCNR (Department of Conservation and Natural Resources) reports that over the last 5 years, 419 applications for heritage park funding have been received but only 252 have been able to be funded. Requests for funding totaled nearly \$28.8 million, but only \$12.16 million have been able to be approved.

Since the program began in 1989, a total of \$21.5 million has been appropriated for program grants and administration. That has been matched by \$17.8 million in local public and private funds and has been leveraged with more than \$100 million in federal funds.

The heritage park program works and provides a significant return on the dollar. Now we need to take it to the next step and provide additional funding to help increase the economic development potential of heritage parks. This will encourage population growth while preserving open space and promoting redevelopment of traditional population centers that are part of Pennsylvania's heritage regions. The result – Pennsylvania will be a more attractive place to visit, to live, to work, and to raise a family – goals we all share.

I ask for your support for this amendment. It will not be simply money spent but a wise investment made.
