PENN STATE UNIVERSITY FENCING TEAM PRESENTED

The SPEAKER. The Chair recognizes the gentleman, Mr. Benninghoff.

Mr. BENNINGHOFF. Thank you, Mr. Speaker, and I thank my colleagues for taking a moment to share with us today as we have the Penn State University fencing team, recently recognized as they captured the 2002 NCAA (National Collegiate Athletic Association) combined fencing national championship.

We are very pleased that we have representatives from both the men's and the women's team with us today. This is the ninth NCAA title in 10 years under Coach Kaidanov and assistant coaches Glon, Liang, and Krasowitz.

We are very pleased with what they have done, and we are very proud of them, and their combination of score has given them this great honor to represent Pennsylvania and Penn State University in the national championship.

So I wish you to join with me and give them a round of applause for their great success and for continued success. Representatives from the team and the coach are joined behind us here on the rostrum.

PENN STATE UNIVERSITY **MEN'S ICE HOCKEY TEAM PRESENTED**

The SPEAKER. May I have your attention, please.

This is a doubleheader for Penn State today.

The Chair is very pleased to recognize at this time the gentleman, Mr. Herman.

Mr. HERMAN. Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker.

What an honor it is to honor such fine ladies and men at the Pennsylvania State University, who not only excel in athletic competition but also academics in the classrooms at Penn State.

Representative Benninghoff and I are here today to recognize another championship team at the Pennsylvania State University.

The 2001-2002 Pennsylvania State University men's ice hockey team captured its third consecutive American Collegiate Hockey Association national championship. What is very special about this team is that they have captured the national hockey championship 3 years in a row, 4 out of the last 5, and their sixth overall. In addition to that, they have defeated their opponents this past year by a collective score of 20 to 5 in the championship round.

Also, I mentioned that they are more than just athletes, but at Penn State this team has earned a team GPA (grade point average) of 3.12 for the fall semester, including 10 players on dean's lists, 19 players with a 3.0 or better—

The SPEAKER. Will the gentleman yield.

Conferences on the floor, please cease. Conferences along the wall, please.

I apologize, Mr. Herman.

Mr. HERMAN. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

I think it is worth repeating, and that is not only has this team, this ice hockey team, won its third national championship at the Pennsylvania State University, but they also excel in the classroom. This team has a team GPA of 3.12 for the fall semester, including 10 players on dean's lists, 19 players with a 3.0 or better, and the American Collegiate Hockey Association and school record of seven ACHA Academic All-Americans.

Their head coach is Coach Joe Battista, who just this past week – and that applause, Mr. Speaker, is that Coach Battista is from Representative Tony DeLuca's home area – but for everyone, the coach—

The SPEAKER. Mr. Herman, I do not think that is why they clapped.

I appreciate the clarification that the funds will not be utilized for the previous issue at question.

This legislation is very important to our poor and at-risk, low-income individuals across the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. While some attorneys provide pro bono, free legal services, oftentimes that is not the case. I can tell you that, as someone who worked in a law firm for 12 1/2 years and who has been a legislator for 10 years, I have had an opportunity to refer hundreds of individuals to free legal services in my legislative district. Often they need assistance with SSI (supplemental security income), Title 16 disability cases, landlordtenant issues.

DPW (Department of Public Welfare) administrative law type of hearings, and it is very, very important that they have legal representation. I believe that the additional revenue generated from this legislation is very much needed, and it will be used to help our very at-risk individuals in our society.

I would like to commend the maker of the legislation, Mr. Feese, from Lycoming County, for his leadership on this issue and ask that my colleagues kindly vote in the affirmative.
