SARAH HAUPT PRESENTED

The SPEAKER. The House will please come to order. Members will take their seats. Members will please take their seats.

The Chair recognizes the gentleman, Mr. Nailor. Will the gentleman yield.

Please. This is going to be a difficult week. I am going to ask for your cooperation in keeping order on the House floor.

Mr. Nailor.

Mr. NAILOR. Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, I am very privileged to be able to present to the House of Representatives a three-time PIAA (Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic Association) champion swimmer in the butterfly title, Ms. Sarah Haupt, and Sarah is here with her coaches. Coach Mike Gobrecht and Coach Gary Bricker are here with us as well.

Sarah is a senior at Trinity High School in Cumberland County, and she holds the State record in the 100-yard butterfly. She established a State record in the 100-yard backstroke. She is a YMCA national champion in the 100-yard backstroke, a high school All-American, and she is going to continue her swimming at Penn State University next year.

Will you not join me and give a round of applause to Sarah for all of her accomplishments and her coaches.

In the back of the room, Mike and Pam Haupt, her parents, are also here. Would you please stand.

The SPEAKER. Conferences on the floor, please cease.

Sergeants at Arms, I am going to expect you for the next 3 days to maintain the best order possible until we get through this budget circuit.

TIMOTHY HAAS PRESENTED

The SPEAKER. Mr. Nailor.

Mr. NAILOR. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Joining me now is a junior from Cedar Cliff High School, Tim Haas, and his coach, Rick Peifer. Tim is a junior at Cedar Cliff High School, and as a junior, or as a sophomore – let me back up a second – he was third in the AAAA PIAA State wrestling championships last year. As a junior, he was 39 and 0 this year, and he was, of course, State wrestling champion in the 119-pound weight class. His overall record is 107 to 11. He is a Patriot-News Big 13 wrestler, he is the Carlisle Sentinel Wrestler of the Year, and the good news for those of us on the West Shore is that Tim is only a junior and he is coming back next year to do it all over again. Will you not join me in applauding Tim on his accomplishments.

There are a few folks in the back I would like to introduce as well – his parents, Royce and Lois Haas. His brother and sister, did they attend? Were they able to be here? Would your parents please rise.

BRIAN BAGLIO PRESENTED

The SPEAKER. Mr. Smith.

Mr. B. SMITH. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

I am proud to present a wrestling champion to you all who has ties all over the State in what he has accomplished. I have behind me Brian Baglio, a champion from Red Land High School. He accumulated an undefeated record this year. He was 39 and 0. He was a PIAA AAA champion. His 4-year record at Red Land High School was 127 wins and 18 defeats. He is a 130-pound champion.

In the quarter finals of the State wrestling championships, Brian defeated the defending champion from the Lehigh Valley. He went on from this championship to the Dapper Dan Tournament in Pittsburgh, and at the Dapper Dan Tournament he defeated the top-ranked wrestler in the United States and was awarded the most valuable wrestler of the Dapper Dan Tournament.

I am very proud to present Brian Baglio to you all. Would you join me in a round of applause.

Also behind me is his coach, Craig Helmuth, and in the back of the room we have the principal of Red Land High School, Ed Novosel, and Brian's parents, Tony and Judy Baglio. Would you please rise. And, yes, Brian got a full scholarship to the University of North Carolina.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

GUESTS INTRODUCED

The SPEAKER. May I have your attention, please.

It is my pleasure today to introduce to the members of the House the All-Pennsylvania Academic Team sponsored by the Pennsylvania Commission for Community Colleges. These scholars are seated in the rear of the chamber. The students were selected by their community colleges for this honor on the basis of their academic scholarship, leadership, and service to their communities.

In addition, the students competed for selection to the 2002 All-USA Academic Team sponsored by Phi Theta Kappa, the international honorary society for 2-year colleges, the American Association of Community Colleges, and USA Today. The good news is that two Pennsylvania community college students were selected for this national recognition. Norine Shipley, from Delaware County Community College, was named to the All-USA Academic Second Team, and Gina Yacynych, from Cambria County Area Community College, is one of 20 students nationwide to be selected to the All-USA Academic First Team. She is also the New Century Scholar for Pennsylvania and will receive a \$2,000 scholarship for that.

Would the House please congratulate these superb students for their achievements with a round of applause. Would the students please rise.

REMARKS BY MESSRS. COSTA AND DIVEN

The SPEAKER. The gentlemen, Mr. Costa, Mr. Diven. Will the gentlemen yield.

May I have your attention, please.

The Chair recognizes the gentleman, Mr. Costa.

Mr. COSTA. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Please pay attention because this is really good stuff here.

Over the past year and a half Representative Diven and I have been trying to bridge the gap between the majority and minority parties of this General Assembly. Pennsylvania has long been considered one of the most partisan legislative bodies in our country, and we have been trying to eliminate that perception. So Michael and I believe we have found a way to bring the members of the General Assembly together in an arena that is less formal in nature and allows us to understand each other and to begin to lay the groundwork for longstanding friendships that will no doubt benefit the citizens of Pennsylvania. Our vision is to create a caucus where this could be accomplished.

In pursuing our dream, we have asked the Parliamentarian for his assistance. He informed us that the only way that we could become officially recognized by the House of Representatives is to annually perform at least one official act on the House floor.

Mr. DIVEN. And, Mr. Speaker, seeing as how you are such a great guy, we felt the best way to fulfill this requirement as set forth by our Parliamentarian is to each year have the distinct honor and privilege of leading the General Assembly in singing "Happy Birthday to You," the Speaker of the House. I must caution you that I have been instructed by the caucus chairman, Representative Costa, that the karaoke caucus already has over 30 members and is growing rapidly, and these members have reserved the right that if the next Speaker is not as cool as you, we can change that official action that we are required to do by the Parliamentarian in order to retain our officially recognized status.

Mr. COSTA. Now, we do not pretend to be the Delfonics; heck, we do not even pretend to be Juliann Pugh. We cannot sing, but we will.

Mr. DIVEN. And that is what makes us dangerous.

a practice over the years, if someone was asleep at the switch, to pause and call your attention to the fact that you had neglected to vote on a given bill. Because for the next 3 days we have 300 amendments, I am going to suspend that practice. You have to be here; you have to be on time; you have to vote the bills, and if you are asleep at the switch, you can correct the record at the end of the day, but we are just, once we come back, we are going to keep it rolling.

Mrs. WATSON. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

This amendment appropriates \$25 million to a new line item within the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency's budget providing for grants to volunteer fire companies, volunteer rescue companies, and volunteer ambulance companies who are licensed by our Department of Health and then decreases the amount— It is deducted from the Department of Ed's school employees' retirement line item based on what we have just done, the recertification of the 2002-2003 rates.

The SPEAKER. On the question of the adoption of the amendment, the gentleman, Mr. Sturla. The gentleman will yield. Please. Conferences, please cease.

Mr. Sturla.

Mr. STURLA. Mr. Speaker, will the gentelady rise for a brief interrogation?

The SPEAKER. The lady indicates she will stand for interrogation. You may begin.

Mr. STURLA. Mr. Speaker, under this amendment, is there any money that would go to paid fire departments and ambulance departments and rescue departments or is this strictly for volunteer departments?

Mr. WATSON. This is strictly for volunteer departments, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. STURLA. If I could comment on the amendment, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. The gentleman is in order and may proceed.

Mr. STURLA. Mr. Speaker, I have and will continue to support programs that support volunteer fire companies throughout this State. However, I am always concerned that we neglect about half of the State's population with these amendments when they fail to fund municipal fire departments also. Those people in those local municipalities that pay their local taxes for their own fire protection also pay State taxes that then help fund volunteer fire companies out in other areas that do not pay local taxes for fire protection, and what it means is that those of us that live in municipalities where we provide our own fire protection get taxed twice.

So I would encourage members in the future to include municipal fire departments when they prepare these amendments so that we can get our fair share also and get good bond rates on our fire equipment and those types of things. Whenever I go to my firemen's parade, it is the municipal fire departments that have the 30-year-old equipment and the volunteer fire departments that have the brand-new shiny equipment, and I would hope that we could start to fund those municipal fire departments as well.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. On the question of the amendment, those in favor— Mr. Vitali, do you desire recognition? You are going to have to hang up the phone.

Mr. VITALI. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Would the maker of the amendment stand for brief interrogation?

The SPEAKER. The lady indicates she will. You may begin.

Mr. VITALI. This is the second amendment that takes moneys from the State's appropriation to the public school retirement fund. Apparently this is not a problem based on recent legislation, but I am not really sure how that works. Could you explain to me why this is not a problem?

Mrs. WATSON. Mr. Speaker, according to what we have done previously where we spread out the payments for the school

employees' retirement fund, it was money that was already in the budget. This is the difference between what we have done and using it, and I recognize that there was another amendment that used the same, which is why I voted "no," because I stand strongly for the volunteer fire and ambulance and emergency services companies.

Mr. VITALI. In other words, what you are saying, that other amendment aside for a second, that that money, this \$25 million we are talking about based on recent legislation, is without a use right now? That other amendment aside.

Mrs. WATSON. Mr. Speaker, I am sorry. I had trouble hearing the first part of his question.

The SPEAKER. The lady will yield.

I can fully understand that the lady had trouble hearing, and it is not because Mr. Vitali is not speaking clearly, it is because too many other people are speaking clearly.

Mr. Vitali, would you ask the question again and let the lady answer you again?

Mr. VITALI. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

In other words, what you are saying, the previous amendment aside, just totally discounting what happened there, based on what we did last week or the week before, that created a surplus, \$25 million, \$25 million which was no longer needed for this fund? Is that what happened?

This amendment would add a line item of \$43 million to the budget that would provide PEMA (Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency) grants to fund fire departments. Now, these are not just the volunteers but paid and volunteers within the Commonwealth, and ambulance divisions. So I think it is important to note that.

These funds will come from also the Department of Education's school employees' retirement line item. Based upon that recertification, we were told that the funds would be somewhere between \$140 and \$150 million available to us.

The SPEAKER. On the question of the adoption of the amendment, the Chair recognizes the gentleman, Mr. Lewis.

Mr. LEWIS. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

This amendment provides funding for small district assistance for the growing school district supplement that we started last year and provides State funding for charter schools.

PARLIAMENTARY INQUIRY

The SPEAKER. Mr. Samuelson, on the amendment.
Mr. SAMUELSON. Mr. Speaker, a parliamentary inquiry.

Up until this point in the budget proceedings—
The SPEAKER. The gentleman will state his point of parliamentary inquiry.

Mr. SAMUELSON. I have an amendment, A1319, which comes before A1364, and it addresses the same line item. My amendment would take the additional money for the Philadelphia School District and spread it out equally to all school districts. A1319 should have been the 34th amendment we dealt with today, and Mr. Lewis's amendment is the 51st amendment.

I am wondering why we are not calling up my amendment A1319 first.

The SPEAKER. The Chair—

Mr. SAMUELSON. Up until this point—

The SPEAKER. Now, are you going to keep questioning or have you completed your question?

Mr. SAMUELSON. I have completed my question.

The SPEAKER. The answer to your question is found in the Journal in a 1999 ruling on the same parliamentary inquiry by Mr. Gordner. The bills are called up and the amendments are called up at the direction essentially of the majority leader. The Speaker received a list, and I am following that list.

Mr. SAMUELSON. Mr. Speaker? Mr. Speaker, I have printed out a list—

The SPEAKER. Are you continuing a parliamentary inquiry?

Mr. SAMUELSON. Yes.

Mr. Speaker, I listened on April 9 very closely when the majority Appropriations chairperson made an announcement about the budget and directed us all to procedure for filing our budget amendments. In fact, I left that session of the House late in the afternoon on April 9, went directly to the Appropriations Committee within about 10 minutes, and finalized the paperwork on my amendment. And on the list, I am holding in my hand a list of 275 amendments; mine is the 34th one that should have been called up, and we are going with an amendment that was filed later. The Legislative Reference Bureau assigned a later number—

The SPEAKER. The gentleman will yield.

You are making a speech, not a parliamentary inquiry.

Let me make a suggestion to you to maybe resolve your dilemma, and that is, you have an answer to your problem. You can move that your amendment be called up as a special order of business. But other than that, what we are doing is what we have always done – that is, the Chair – and that is follow the, Republican or Democrat, the Chair ordinarily follows the dictate of the majority leader, whoever it may be, who controls the flow of legislation. If you are not satisfied with it, then you have a motion that you can make to accelerate your amendment.

MOTION FOR SPECIAL ORDER OF BUSINESS

Mr. SAMUELSON. Okay. I would then move that we have a special order of business to consider A1319, amendment A1319, which was the amendment directly following the last one we did, so that we could take that \$75 million that the Governor has proposed for the Philadelphia School District and spread it out equally to all school districts across the State. So I therefore move that we consider A1319, the next amendment on our list, at this time.

The SPEAKER. The question before the House is the motion of the gentleman to consider as a priority list of business amendment A1319. Is that correct?

Mr. SAMUELSON. Yes, A1319.

The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

On the question,

Will the House agree to the motion?

The SPEAKER. On the question of that motion, Mr. Evans.

Mr. D. EVANS. Thank you.

Mr. Speaker, since both gentlemen want to take the \$75 million,

the compromise would be to let both of their names be on the amendment. Mr. Speaker, since I am going to disagree with both of them, I was trying to say let them be bipartisan, and in the spirit of cooperation, since they want to take the money from Philadelphia, let them both put their names on it. I am going to argue against the substance of it, but I just think they should put both their names on the amendment, and we could save a lot of time.

The SPEAKER. Is that a question of the Speaker—

Mr. D. EVANS. Yes, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. —or is that a general statement to the House?

Mr. D. EVANS. I think it is fair to be bipartisan, working together. They both want to take the \$75 million. I mean, they can get together, they can put their names on it, and then we can debate the substance.

The SPEAKER. The question before the House is the motion of the gentleman. I do not necessarily disagree with you.

Mr. Horsey.

Mr. HORSEY. Thank you, Mr. Speaker, and they control it down there.

I heard the gentleman's motion, and I need to just ask a technical question, and I do not know if it is in order or not but I am going to ask it anyway. Do both amendments do the same exact thing?

The SPEAKER. Does somebody care to respond to that?

Mr. HORSEY. I understand, I understand—

The SPEAKER. The gentleman, Mr. Kelly Lewis, do you desire to respond to that?

Mr. LEWIS. Mr. Speaker, both amendments are not similar.

Mr. HORSEY. No?

The SPEAKER. Would you explain the difference for Mr. Horsey.

Mr. LEWIS. Well, I can speak to my bill, and that is, we provide \$20.5 million for small district assistance, \$19.8 million for growing school district supplements, and \$34 million for charter schools.

The SPEAKER. Mr. Samuelson.

Mr. SAMUELSON. And if I might, my amendment A1319 would take that additional \$75 million that Governor Schweiker is proposing for one school district while proposing 1 percent for all others, and that would increase the basic education subsidy to 2.85 percent for all districts across Pennsylvania. But, Mr. Speaker—

The SPEAKER. Do not debate the bill; just explain the answer. Mr. Horsey is satisfied with your answer now.

Mr. SAMUELSON. Okay.

The SPEAKER. Thank you.

Mr. Sturla.

Mr. STURLA. Mr. Speaker, I know that with regard to the motion by Representative Samuelson, I know that Representative Samuelson has provided a printout for us that tells us how his money gets distributed. So that I know whether to vote for Mr. Samuelson's motion or whether I want Mr. Lewis's motion to go, can I ask Mr. Lewis whether he has provided us a printout so we know where the money goes under his amendment?

The SPEAKER. Mr. Lewis, you have explained where the money goes under your amendment. Is there any further information available other than what you have explained?

Mr. LEWIS. Mr. Speaker, our members have been provided printouts with this amendment and its distribution.

Mr. STURLA. Mr. Speaker, was that distributed to the entire membership of the legislature or just the Republicans?

Mr. LEWIS. Mr. Speaker, I cannot speak to the other side of the aisle.

The SPEAKER. I have no idea.

Mr. STURLA. Mr. Speaker, if I could comment on the motion.

The SPEAKER. Please, stay on the motion.

Mr. STURLA. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, I would encourage members, because I do not know exactly what Mr. Lewis's money goes to, to vote for the Samuelson motion, because my sense, in just looking at the Lewis motion, is that a large portion of that \$75 million goes back to Philadelphia anyway, because that is where a majority of the charter schools are and some of the other things. So my sense is that a majority of the school districts in the State would do better under Mr. Samuelson's motion, and so I would ask—

The SPEAKER. You are debating the two. Please, do not do that.

Mr. STURLA. I would ask that the members vote for Mr. Samuelson's motion to put his amendment first.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

PARLIAMENTARY INQUIRY

The SPEAKER. Mr. Blaum.

Mr. BLAUM. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Just a question on this. I do not care whose name is on the amendment, but they do do two different things. If we were to vote on the Lewis amendment and it was adopted, being that I believe the Samuelson amendment is better, can we also vote on the Samuelson amendment subsequent to that and have that carry the day?

The SPEAKER. My initial reaction is no, because the first amendment would have used up the money that was available or was going to be available for the second amendment. So I would say, no, the amendment would be out of order.

Mr. BLAUM. Then could I speak on the motion?

The SPEAKER. On the motion.

Mr. BLAUM. On the motion, if I could have the attention of the members of the House, I think this is a fairly important vote, not that what we are doing here today matters a whole heck of a lot, but I think it will send a message on what we want done with the \$75 million. I think the gentleman, Mr. Lewis, has crafted a decent amendment, but I do not think it does what we all want it to do, and that is to be redistributed fairly to the other 501 school districts, all of them, in Pennsylvania.

And I assume this is a difficult vote for our friends on the other side of the aisle, but I think the Samuelson amendment is the one we would like to adopt and send a message not only to the Governor's Office but to the Pennsylvania Senate that we would like to see that \$75 million divided fairly between the 501 school districts.

So I would ask for an affirmative vote on this motion, because I think it is very important that we send that message.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. Mr. Samuelson; Mr. Lewis.

(Conference held at Speaker's podium.)

This amendment would provide for a 2-percent cost-of-living increase to the Human Services Development Fund. In light of the fact of the budget constraints, I believe that you are going to find in the counties, they are going to need the discretion that HSDF, Human Services Development Fund, will provide. This will take money, \$736,000, from the cash assistance program in DPW, and I am assured that these estimates are correct. They have had some recent update in the caseload projections.

Mr. SATHER. The cash grant line item is not the only line item that the State uses in that match requirement.

Mr. STURLA. Given the fact that earlier we passed an amendment which already took another \$2 million from the cash grants, if we take these additional funds, will that put us over the brink?

Mr. SATHER. There are two separate funds, and this would be a slight but only a slight change, a reduction, in the funding.

Mr. STURLA. I understand that this amendment is only a slight change, but we already took \$2 million out of it, so we have a total of \$2.7 million coming out of that fund. Does that put us over the limit where we get sanctioned by the Federal government?

Mr. SATHER. I think the point that needs to be made, those were cuts made to the Federal funds, the transfer of the Federal funds, not from the State funds.

The SPEAKER. On the question of the adoption of the amendment, Mr. Samuelson. I called Mr. Lewis first on the amendment. I will call on you first for the explanation.

Mr. SAMUELSON. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

At the suggestion of the Speaker and Representative Evans and others, Representative Lewis and I have gotten together, and at this time I would like to defer to Representative Lewis for the purposes of offering amendment A1319.

The SPEAKER. Mr. Evans, you are the great negotiator.

Mr. Lewis.

Mr. LEWIS. Mr. Speaker and Representative Evans, thank you for your leadership on that great compromise, and I will defer

to my colleague across the aisle for a description on amendment 1319.

The SPEAKER. This has got to stop.

Mr. Samuelson, you are going to be recognized for the second time on your amendment that you share with Mr. Lewis.

Mr. SAMUELSON. And briefly, there is a printout on the desk of every Representative. This takes the special line item that the Governor had put in the budget specifically for the Philadelphia School District and, instead, takes that \$75 million and distributes it equally to all 501 school districts. The net effect of that, as you can see from the printout, is that the 1-percent increase proposed by the Governor in the basic education line item could now be an increase of 2.85 percent, and that is 2.85 percent statewide; whether you live in Allentown or Erie or Cumberland Valley or Philadelphia or Pittsburgh, all districts, all students, all taxpayers, treated the same with a 2.85-percent increase in basic education funding.

I respectfully ask for an affirmative vote.

The SPEAKER. The gentleman, Mr. Horsey.

Mr. HORSEY. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, I am opposed to this amendment, and I intend to be against it and to oppose it in that it takes steps backwards. Why would we take money away from kids as opposed to making efforts and finding somewhere in the budget to increase the funds for other school districts? Why would we hurt one group of kids at the behest of another? Why do we not find a space in the budget that we can take additional funds from and spread it to the 500? This is backwards legislation, Mr. Speaker, and I would urge opposition to this legislation.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE

The SPEAKER. The Chair interrupts the debate to recognize the gentleman, Mr. Smith, who asks that the gentleman, Mr. TULLI, be placed on leave for the balance of today's session. Without objection, the leave will be granted. The Chair hears no objection.

CONSIDERATION OF HB 2489 CONTINUED

The SPEAKER. The gentleman, Mr. Evans.

Mr. D. EVANS. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, I am glad I was able to get both of those gentlemen together. However, I just disagree with what they are recommending.

I agree with the gentleman from the city of Philadelphia. I said here on the day of the budget that we should be trying to expand the pot for all school districts; we should not be trying to just rearrange the deck on the Titanic. And in my view, all children in Pennsylvania should benefit. We should not pit one against the other, and I agree with the gentleman from Philadelphia.

So I would hope that my colleagues on both sides of the aisle would understand that this will only have what I consider negative ramifications in trying to deal with the reform that the Governor has put forward, that I have supported. And I had not looked at this as a Democrat-Republican issue when Governor Ridge was there; now it is Governor Schweiker. I have looked at it from an issue that we are working together. I think we should expand the pot

rather than shrink the pot.

So again, I would hope that we would be against this particular amendment, and I would like to thank my colleagues.

The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the gentleman, Mr. Evans. Mr. Roebuck.

Mr. ROEBUCK. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

I wondered if the maker of the amendment would stand for interrogation.

The SPEAKER. Which one?

Mr. ROEBUCK. Whichever.

The SPEAKER. Mr. Samuelson indicates he will stand for interrogation.

Mr. ROEBUCK. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Am I correct in understanding that under this proposal, the money in question is divided equally among all school districts in Pennsylvania?

Mr. SAMUELSON. Yes; all 501 school districts would receive a 2.85-percent increase.

Mr. ROEBUCK. Is that to say then that all school districts are in equal need of increased funding?

Mr. SAMUELSON. Mr. Speaker, our students across Pennsylvania face many challenges and our taxpayers face many challenges. The Pennsylvania School Boards Association has basically come out and said that with a 1-percent increase, as proposed by the Governor, school districts all across Pennsylvania are looking at raising taxes this year.

There are challenges in Philadelphia schools, there are challenges in every school district across Pennsylvania, and the purpose of my amendment and Representative Lewis's amendment is to treat all students, all taxpayers, across Pennsylvania the same and provide the same percentage increase. Under this amendment, Philadelphia would get a 2.85-percent increase in basic education funding, and under this amendment, the other 500 school districts across Pennsylvania would also get a 2.85-percent increase in basic education funding.

Mr. ROEBUCK. So, Mr. Speaker, then even the most affluent district will get the same percentage as the poorest district.

Mr. SAMUELSON. Yes, Mr. Speaker, the 2.85 percent. Rather than what the Governor had proposed to us, which was 1 percent for 500 school districts and 11.7 percent for one particular school district, this would say, let us treat all 501 school districts the same and make that 2.85 percent for every school district in Pennsylvania and treat all students across Pennsylvania with the same increase in funding this year.

Mr. ROEBUCK. If I might speak on the amendment.

THE SPEAKER PRO TEMPORE (PATRICIA H. VANCE) PRESIDING

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The gentleman may proceed.

Mr. ROEBUCK. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

What this amendment proposes to do is offer a remedy that in no way really addresses the problem that we in individual school districts face. What this does is take a pot of money and divide it evenly in a way that does not help kids who need it the most. Now, if you are going to do this kind of remedy, why not address the needs of those who have the greatest need, when in fact what this proposes to do is to give money to everyone. It sounds good, but it means that those who have already will get more and those who have less will not get enough. In reality, if you want to address the problems of schools, broaden the pot of

money. Yes, and there are school districts that need special help. Certainly

I would vote to help a school district that was in distress, as my school district is. There is nothing wrong with helping a district in special need.

Let us get away from the nonsense that somehow labels a district or labels giving more money to one district in need as wrong. It is not wrong, Madam Speaker, if the bottom line is to help children and to improve education.

I would argue that this remedy in reality does nothing to address the problems of unequal education funding nor to address the problems of those districts that are in deepest distress and deepest need across this Commonwealth. This solution does nothing to address what should be the concern of this legislature, and that is to provide quality education to every young person in this State.

I would urge that we defeat this amendment.

Thank you, Madam Speaker.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair thanks the gentleman and recognizes the gentleman from Lawrence County, Mr. Sainato.

Mr. SAINATO. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

I rise to support this amendment.

There has been no issue that I think has been more hotly debated than the \$75-million appropriation the Governor wanted to give the Philadelphia School District, and I understand where people are coming from here today, but I think the point we have to understand is, there are 501 school districts. Under this amendment, the gentleman is only asking fairness, equity for all districts, so each district goes from 1 percent to almost 3 percent. That is what he is asking, equity and fairness. Philadelphia will still get an increase in their budget as well as Monroe County, Lawrence County, every county in the State where we have school districts.

This is fairness in this amendment, so we must support this. I have never heard more of an outcry over a Governor's budget in 7 years than the day that the Governor proposed giving \$75 million to Philadelphia and a paltry \$39 million for the other 501 school districts in the State, Madam Speaker.

So this amendment just brings fairness back into the system. We have a tough budget this year. We understand that. But if we cannot do our share and if all the money goes into one school district, all the rest of us are going to have property taxes that are going to go up, the senior citizens are going to have to pay more, the working people will have to pay more, and we will have let them down, Madam Speaker.

My job as a legislator, as well as the other 202, is to do what is right for the people of Pennsylvania. We may not be able to give as much to our school districts as we have given in the past, but we at least need to be fair about the money that we do have to distribute. Under this amendment, it will do it, Madam Speaker. It will go from 1 percent to almost 3 percent. My school districts will be happy to get that 3 percent, and everyone will be there in the end.

If we do not pass this amendment and we just give the \$75 million to Philadelphia, it is not going to solve their problems; it is just going to create problems for the other 500 school districts, because they will not have the money, they will have to raise property taxes, they will have to cut school programs, and as the previous speaker said, every child is important. The children in New Castle and Neshannock and Union and every other place in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, each kid is important, so they

should all be treated equally.

If this amendment gives equal money everywhere, so be it, Madam Speaker. I support this amendment. I urge my colleagues to do the same. Thank you.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair thanks the gentleman and recognizes the gentleman from Lancaster County, Mr. Sturla, on the amendment.

Mr. STURLA. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

Madam Speaker, I rise in support of the Samuelson amendment.

This is not a perfect amendment. We all know that there are huge inequities in school funding in the State of Pennsylvania, and this amendment in some cases does not address some of those inequities, but the fact of the matter is that the proposal that we previously had before us provided what was, I believe, a reasonable amount to one school district and a deathly inadequate amount to 500 other school districts. What the Samuelson amendment attempts to do is to at least keep all school districts from falling below their cost of inflation and their increasing costs.

And so while I believe that beyond the Samuelson amendment we will need to go back in and look at funding schools that are distressed, schools that are empowerment districts, schools that are not in empowerment districts but have the same situations as those schools in empowerment districts, but we need to find another \$100 million somewhere to do that. I believe there are places where we can find those dollars and that we should work, when this finally gets to a conference committee, to find those dollars for those schools that have that need, but that does not mean that in the process we should leave behind all other school districts in the State of Pennsylvania.

And just with regard to need, one thing that I have pointed out on this floor many times and I will again, because this deals with whether Philadelphia gets the money or whether the other 500 school districts get some also, when you look at the local effort in terms of taxing, Philadelphia is in the bottom half of school districts in terms of their local tax effort, and there are school districts like mine that are in the top half of that taxing effort, and we struggle just as mightily as all other districts, and under the Samuelson proposal, we, as well as many other school districts, will get some funding. It will not solve our problems, by any stretch of the imagination, but it will not put us further into the hole.

So I support the Samuelson amendment and would encourage other members to do so also.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair thanks the gentleman and recognizes the gentleman from Blair County, Mr. Stern.

Mr. STERN. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

Could I interrogate the maker of the amendment?

The SPEAKER pro tempore. Which gentleman would you like to interrogate?

Mr. STERN. Mr. Samuelson.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The gentleman agrees. You may proceed.

Mr. STERN. Madam Speaker, the amount of money that you are using to distribute throughout the rest of the 500 school districts in Pennsylvania comes from the \$75-million line item that is appropriated currently for the School District of Philadelphia. Is that correct?

The \$75 million that you are pulling for your amendment for the other 500 school districts in Pennsylvania comes from the \$75-million line item for the School District of Philadelphia. Is that correct?

Mr. SAMUELSON. That is correct.

Mr. STERN. And your appropriation, according to your amendment, you are still offering them \$20 million, according to your amendment. Is that correct?

Mr. SAMUELSON. It would be the same 2.85 percent, and on the printout it would be \$19,938,000, using that same statewide percentage.

Mr. STERN. Right. I rounded that off to \$20 million.

So the difference, you are giving them \$20 million as it is, according to your amendment; you are taking \$55 million additional moneys and distributing that to the other 500 school districts. Is that correct?

Mr. SAMUELSON. Well, actually, under the Governor's original proposal, the Philadelphia School District was in line for \$81.99 million. They were getting the special \$75-million line item, but they were also getting the 1-percent increase that the Governor included for all school districts. So before the amendment, there is actually \$81,995,000 in the budget, and with this amendment, with the 2.85 percent, it would be \$19,938,000—same percentage as every other district.

Mr. STERN. So you are giving all the other school districts roughly 61 million additional dollars. Correct?

Mr. SAMUELSON. Yes; that is correct.

Mr. STERN. And with the Governor's 1 percent that all the school districts are currently getting, this puts all school districts then at 2.85. Is that correct?

Mr. SAMUELSON. Yes, it is.

Mr. STERN. Madam Speaker, on the amendment?

The SPEAKER pro tempore. You may proceed.

Mr. STERN. I would like to applaud the maker of the amendment and the rationale, how he came up with this amendment. It still gives every school district in Pennsylvania an equal amount of money, and we all know with the basic ed funding formula, with funding formulas, some school districts benefit and some school districts do not benefit, depending on how the formula is written.

I would like to applaud the maker of the amendment and ask for an affirmative vote on the Samuelson amendment. Thank you.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair thanks the gentleman and recognizes the gentleman from Lycoming County, Mr. Cappelli.

Mr. CAPPELLI. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

I, too, rise in support of amendment 1319, the Samuelson-Lewis amendment.

Madam Speaker, the whole debate about school funding is really about fairness and equity. We have been debating it all year with tax reform measures, and here we are this evening deciding whether or not to set aside \$75 million for one of our Commonwealth's 501 school districts. I cannot remember this General Assembly ever appropriating in a special fashion a single extra penny to the Williamsport Area School District or the South Williamsport Area School District.

With all due respect to my colleagues from southeastern Pennsylvania and Philadelphia County, I truly believe it is high time that the city of Philadelphia and the Philadelphia City School District assume the same important and inescapable obligation that each and every one of the other 500 school boards and districts do each year—fiscal accountability and responsibility for the costs and students of their district.

This would be irresponsible for us to set aside \$75 million for one district that, in my opinion, has brought about its own financial

quagmire and problems. Let us do what is right and what is fair. Let us treat each district with some level of equity and support the Samuelson-Lewis amendment.

Thank you, Madam Speaker.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair thanks the gentleman and recognizes the gentleman from Delaware County, Mr. Vitali. Mr. VITALI. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

I rise in opposition to the Samuelson amendment, Samuelson-Lewis amendment.

I do agree that the State ought to be driving more moneys into all school districts, but unless we are prepared to do something courageous like raise our State income tax by about 2 percent, that is really not going to happen. So I think what we are dealing with is a finite pie.

And I think the reality is, and I think the reality is, Madam Speaker, that all school districts are not in equal shape. I am a suburban legislator who sits on the border of Philadelphia. I hear from teachers who live in my district and work in Philadelphia, and I hear about the substandard conditions in Philadelphia schools. I am aware of their low graduation rates compared to suburban school districts. I hear anecdotal evidence about teachers having to buy their own school supplies so their kids have adequate supplies for school. The reality is that it is really deplorable that the kids in the Philadelphia School District are not getting the quality education that other kids are, and I think that this \$75 million is appropriate, even though it is at the expense of my school district and others, so therefore, I would oppose this amendment. Thank you.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair thanks the gentleman and recognizes the gentleman from Westmoreland, Mr. Stairs.

Mr. STAIRS. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

I certainly support this amendment and do it for these reasons.

This past month or so, the School Boards Association has been holding meetings with legislators across the Commonwealth and pointing out to us their many concerns, and there are three things that really stick out that they have concerns about. One we addressed just recently with regard to the percentage of the pension, and of course, that was certainly good news to our local school districts when we resolved that last week. And also, a second issue that had not been resolved is special education, which I hope we can address through getting more money from the State or the Federal government. But a third issue is increased subsidies money. I realize that it is difficult to do this and be equitable, and certainly this is not completely equitable, because the poorer districts would share with the richer districts, but nevertheless, I think this is a good start to address the financial needs of our districts, and I would hope that we could all support this very important amendment and raise that subsidy amount from 1 percent to almost 3 percent, which was stated earlier.

So I urge my colleagues to give our school districts and our taxpayers a really nice gift and pass this amendment.

Thank you, Madam Speaker.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair thanks the gentleman and recognizes the gentleman from Northumberland, Mr. Belfanti.

Mr. BELFANTI. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

Madam Speaker, I also rise to support the Samuelson amendment. I do not want to recant all of the other reasons made by the speakers before me. I am certainly not a Philadelphia basher. I love the people from the City of Brotherly Love. But what the Governor has tried to do here is just untenable for the other 500 districts. It is unfair to us. And to make matters worse,

any of those of you who watched ABC News on, I believe it was Thursday evening, there was a special segment which contained an interview with the CEO (chief executive officer) of the Edison Corporation, the company that is going to run the Philadelphia School District for profit, and in instance after instance, in State after State, where they promised to reduce illiteracy and raise test scores, the report indicated that the opposite held true. The CEO said, "Well, I know we promised to raise test scores, but that isn't the only criteria we should be judged on."

Madam Speaker, this is a for-profit company that stands to make many, many of these millions of dollars if we do not do something to block this \$75-million entitlement. If it were a school board that would be responsible and responsive to the next Governor, to the General Assembly, that would be one thing, but we have a board in place who is not going to have to be responsive to anyone for the next 4 or 5 years, and we have a for-profit entity that is going to skim the cream off the top of this \$75-million windfall.

So I strongly support the Samuelson amendment. Let us bring fairness to all the school districts of the State. Let us undo what we did with the privatization and the takeover of Philadelphia, and let us attack this Philadelphia School District problem in a different way that we can all support.

Thank you, Madam Speaker.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

Mr. STURLA. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, this amendment proposes to give a 4-percent increase to the funding for special education by reducing the Department of Corrections' appropriation by \$115 million, which this line item had received a 12-percent increase.

It would also eliminate funding for the Department of Education's appropriation for performance incentives that were \$25 million and apply that to special education and also allocates an additional \$119 million for basic education funding and an additional \$21 million for special education.

The SPEAKER. Mr. Argall.

Mr. ARGALL. Mr. Speaker, these are very worthy goals. However, according to the information provided to me by the Appropriations Committee staff, this amendment has the potential to create a very serious security risk within our corrections system. Based on a cut of this magnitude to the State correctional institutions, 2,857 positions could be cut, which would result in 11,430 inmates left without direct supervision. I do not think that is a good idea.

The SPEAKER. On the question of the adoption of the amendment, Mr. Sturla.

Mr. STURLA. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, that assumes that the Department of Corrections, faced with not getting a 12-percent increase, would cut positions that it would otherwise have created instead of cutting other things within the Department of Corrections, and we all know that there are some things that can be cut within the Department of Corrections without it affecting security.

And once again, I think what we have to do is start setting our priorities in this State. We consistently provide large increases for the Department of Corrections. In this particular budget, there is a proposed 12-percent increase for the Department of Corrections, and in this proposed budget, there was a 1-percent increase for education. Now, at some point in time if we want to spend \$30,000 per inmate, locking people up, and 1 percent on children, we are going to continue to keep locking more people up because they will not get their education.

I think that we need to start investing in the future, investing in public education in Pennsylvania, and stop paying for it at the end

of the situation. If we can prevent those people from entering prison in the first place because they have a decent education, we can go a long way in this State, and I think it is about time we set our priorities in this State.

Mr. Speaker, this amendment, known as the Save A Life amendment, appropriates \$1.5 million from the Department of Labor and Industry's general government operations to the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency to establish and fund a new program to teach public school children lifesaving first-aid skills and CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation) as well as the development of an emergency/disaster preparedness plan for public schools. This new program would provide training to fire and police, nurses, and emergency medical personnel with EMS credentials, the skills necessary to teach Pennsylvania public school children from K through 12 grades lifesaving skills.

Similar programs have been established in other States. For example, the State of Illinois currently funds a program which teaches over 300,000 children in lifesaving skills and also disaster preparedness training. These types of programs have shown a 97-percent retention rate with a 58-percent increase in willingness to aid in an emergency with standardized testing.

Also, due to families' economic challenges, more students begin their college work at the community college level to take advantage of lower tuition and being able to live at home.

The community colleges are the only sector of higher education in Pennsylvania that is funded by the State through a reimbursement formula based on full-time equivalent students. The current State appropriation for the colleges has a shortfall of close to \$7 million. All of the community colleges are straining their

resources to serve the many students who have come to them this year.

Our amendment provides funding for this shortfall, and it will be taken from integrated management systems, the Opportunity Grant Program, State correctional institutions, and I would urge the adoption of this amendment. Thank you.
