In addition, there is another possibility. We are trying to explore all of the possibilities for these two commissions. There is another possibility that was not considered in the drafting of HR 222, and that would be to add the phrase “or another department,” and by adding that phrase, we can open the possibility that we had with the LCB (Liquor Control Board) and the State Police. So by adding that phrase, we add another possibility that could be another department rather than just DCNR (Department of Conservation and Natural Resources).

And finally, we change the date to March 31, 2004. It is possible that the study will be done before that, but we just want to make sure that we can comply with the resolution.

With regard to HR 222, I would like to submit some comments for the record.

The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

Mr. STABACK submitted the following remarks for the Legislative Journal:

While keeping both commissions separate and independent of each other, HR 222 will direct the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee to study the feasibility of merging the law enforcement responsibilities only of the PA Game Commission, the Fish and Boat Commission, along with park rangers and forest rangers under a new Bureau of Law Enforcement within the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources or some other State department.

Inasmuch as WCO's (wildlife conservation officers) for Fish and Game and rangers under DCNR all have overlapping authority to enforce each other's laws, it would make sense to at least study the possibility of merging all four under a new single arm of law enforcement, charged with enforcing all of our conservation laws in the Commonwealth, Mr. Speaker, keeping in mind this is a nonbinding resolution that simply requests a study.

I would ask for an affirmative vote.
