Re: Annual Report for the Employment First Act

Act 36 of 2018, the Employment First Act, requires the Office of the Governor to submit an initial three-year plan to the General Assembly, outlining specific policies and strategies Commonwealth state agencies will adopt to implement the Employment First Act and ensure individuals with disabilities have the opportunity to achieve economic independence through competitive integrated employment.

The Office of the Governor, in collaboration with the Governor's Cabinet for People with Disabilities, developed this initial three-year plan, which outlines the Commonwealth's policy recommendations to implement the Employment First Act and identifies the lead state entity charged with implementing each recommendation. In most cases, the recommendations in this initial plan will be implemented through inter-agency partnerships and in collaboration with Employment First stakeholders.

Act 36 of 2018 also requires the Office of the Governor to submit an annual report to the General Assembly every year by January 30. The first annual report, due January 2020, will build on this initial three-year plan to include specific, measurable performance indicators and the implementation status of each policy recommendation. These indicators will be informed by the feedback and priorities of the Em-

ployment First Oversight Commission, and the measurable goals and objectives the commission will publish in its first annual report by Oct. 1, 2019.

The Wolf Administration looks forward to engaging the Employment First Oversight Commission and other stakeholders to further develop this comprehensive plan to advance Employment First across the Commonwealth and improve employment outcomes for Pennsylvanians with disabilities.

In accordance with the provisions of Act 34 of 2013, the Department of Labor and Industry is providing an accounting of the Service and Infrastructure Improvement Fund (SIIF), including contributions, expenditures, and the use of funds, for the prior year.

In response to significant declines in federal funding for Pennsylvania's unemployment compensation program, the General Assembly approved Act 34 of 2013 to provide additional revenue and enable the department to maintain reasonable levels of services for claimants and employers. Specifically, Act 34 added section 301.9 to the Unemployment Compensation Law to establish the SIIF as a restricted account within the State Treasury. It amended section 301.4(e)(2) of the act to provide for deposits from existing employee contributions.

Act 60 of 2017 substantially amended these sections of the act to extend funding through 2021 as well as establishing the General Assembly's intent to reduce the department's reliance on SIIF. Under this act, SIIF revenue must be expended to maintain and modernize the operations of the unemployment compensation system during the implementation and initial deployment of technological upgrades to the delivery system for unemployment compensation payments. Separate transfers are required for the purposes of expenses related to personnel and operations and of expenses related to technology upgrades.

Specifically, moneys in the SIIF are appropriated on a continuing basis, upon approval of the Governor, to the department for the following purposes:

- To improve the quality, efficiency and timeliness of services provided by the service center system to individuals claiming compensation under this act, including claim filing, claim administration, adjudication services, and staffing and training of system employees.
- Expenditures for information management technology, communications technology, and other infrastructure components that the secretary determines are likely to result in significant and lasting improvements to the unemployment compensation system.

- To pay the costs of collecting the contributions deposited into the SIIF pursuant to section 301.4(e)(2).
- To pay for any costs related to the preparation of the unemployment compensation system to end its reliance on transfers to the SIIF.

On June 26, 1989, the revised Public Official and Employee Ethics Law was enacted which re-authorized the State Ethics Commission. The State Ethics Commission is responsible for issuing various types of rulings on matters within its mandated jurisdiction. Pursuant to the law, the Commission is mandated to forward, quarterly, a copy of every Opinion, Advice of Counsel, and Order issued to one law library in each county, one public library in each county, the State Library, the State

Senate Library, each authority appointing a Commission member, the Pennsylvania Association of County Commissioners, the Pennsylvania Association of Boroughs, the Pennsylvania State Association of Township Supervisors, the Pennsylvania State Association of Township Commissioners, the Pennsylvania State School Boards Association, and the Pennsylvania League of Cities. Your agency is either specifically identified in the above requirement or has been selected as a library to which this mailing will be made pursuant to the above authority. As such, enclosed please find decisions of the State Ethics Commission from April 1, 2019, to June 30, 2019. Due to budgetary restraints, a CD containing said rulings will replace paper copies that were previously sent.

For your information, the Commission generally issues these types of decisions as follows:

Commission Opinions - Opinions are advisory rulings issued by the State Ethics Commission regarding the duties and responsibilities of public officials and employees under the Public Official and Employee Ethics Law. Opinions are catalogued by year of issuance followed by the sequential number of the opinion during that year. As such, opinions relating to 2019 will begin with the number 19-001 and proceed there from as decisions are rendered.

Advice of Counsel - The Commission's Chief Counsel is authorized to issue similar advisory letters. Such letters are issued generally when there is prior precedent for counsel to rely upon in issuing a decision or when the provisions of the State Ethics Act directly provide the answer to the question posed. Advice of Counsel letters are numbered with the year and a 500 series number that progresses in order therefrom as rulings are issued. If more than 100 such letters are issued, a 600 series number will then be used.

Orders - Commission orders are issued at the end of an investigation and are determinations as to whether or not there has been a violation of the State Ethics Act. Commission orders are categorized numerically from the date of the first order in 1979. That is, the first Order issued was Order No. 1. All orders proceed there from.

It is recommended that Opinions, Advices of Counsel and Orders be maintained separately (in numerical order) so as to afford better retrievability.

The enclosed items are being forwarded for retention, cataloging and for the purpose of being publicly available for review by citizens of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania who may have an interest therein. Additional mailings will be made on a quarterly basis henceforth. Pennsylvanians continue to be committed to clean and renewable energy that benefits our economy and the environment. Across this Commonwealth, clean and readily abundant forms of energy are powering more homes and more businesses than ever before. The clean and renewable energy sector is a growing part of Pennsylvania's economy, growing at a current rate of 6 percent annually, and has been a key driver of economic growth in Pennsylvania in recent years. In addition, Mr. President, the number of jobs in the clean and renewable energy sector in this Commonwealth is now more than 90,000 individuals. The production costs of clean and renewable energy are now the lowest in United States history, averaging \$45 per megawatt hour, and are steadily declining as clean and renewable technologies continue to improve. These trends, emerging through a broad base of project developers and investors, are making clean and renewable energy projects more accessible than ever before to Pennsylvania farms, communities, and local governments.

On recently introduced legislation, so-called community solar act, Pennsylvania ratepayers can join together to reduce their utility bills, increase their use of clean and renewable energy, and benefit from the streamlining of regulations and cutting of red tape when building community solar projects.

I simply rise to say that it is important that the public understands this is simply a step, it is not going to stop those robocalls from coming in. You can sign up for the list, but someone calling you from Nigeria or from the Caribbean or from Mexico or

wherever else does not care whether you are on a list or you are not on a list, all right, and that we are going to have to be much more sophisticated in approach.

I know that the Committee on Consumer Affairs will be having some hearings, I believe, about the improvements and, so, on one hand, yeah, this is a step, but do not be fooled, this is not going to solve the problem, only sophisticated technology will, and you are going to have to keep changing that technology because the people who want to get you on that phone, and 45 per cent of those calls are scams anyway, they are going to try to keep putting new stuff in. So we are going to have to deal with the problem. This is a step, but this is not the answer.

Specifically, my bill will allow students to apply their practical financial knowledge toward their school district's graduation requirements. In order to help young people acquire the everyday critical knowledge necessary to make wise financial choices as adults, I believe high school courses in personal finance should be encouraged.

My legislation would direct public schools to allow students in grades 9 through 12 to apply one financial credit towards satisfying their social studies, family and consumer science, mathematics, or business education credit requirements for graduation. While the measure would require the awarding of credit for financial knowledge, Mr. President, it does give the schools the discretion to decide how this graduation credit would be applied. It is not, and should not, be considered a blank check. This will ensure that the credit is applied in an appropriate area of graduation requirement and not for some aspect that has nothing to do with financial knowledge the student has attained. I ask for an affirmative vote. Thank you.

Senator BROWNE. Mr. President, I rise today to ask the Members for unanimous support for this resolution, which designates September 23 through 29 as "Safe2Say Something Week" in Pennsylvania. This week acknowledges a relatively new Pennsylvania program called Safe2Say, which was established under Act 44 of 2018. It is an anonymous tip line for students, teachers, and community members to report behavior perceived to be threatening to individuals or schools. The program was modeled after the Safe2Tell program that was created in Colorado in 1999 after the Columbine tragedy. A provision of the act required the Office of Attorney General to implement the Safe2Say program. They partnered with Sandy Hook Promise to administer the program and also to provide training to recognize the warning signs of who may be a threat and how to report those concerns through the Safe2Say platform.

On January 14, 2019, the Safe2Say Something program began accepting reports and continues to accept reports 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year. In January 2019 through the end of the 2018-19 school year, approximately 864,000 students were trained on the program. The first annual report was released by the Office of Attorney General on August 1 of this year and stated that 23,490 reports had been submitted in the first year. While the original intent was to provide students with a safe outlet to report potential threats to schools, the annual report also highlighted that mental health issues for our students are a top concern. Specifically, bullying, self-harm, suicidal intentions, depression, and anxiety are the top event types that were reported.

I am pleased that the Safe2Say Something program, introduced as legislation by Senator Hughes, Senator Martin, and myself, is considered a national model in its first year, given the implementation by the Attorney General's Office and the number of trainings that have been done for students and the participation by students in the program to protect students, teachers, school employees, and our communities. I ask the Members to cast an

affirmative vote for this resolution designating the week of September 23 through 29, 2019, as Safe2Say Something Week in Pennsylvania.

Senator HUGHES. Mr. President, I also rise today to ask for unanimous support for a resolution designating September 23 through 29, 2019, as Safe2Say Something Week in Pennsylvania. My colleague and fellow chairman of the Committee on Appropriations, Senator Browne, has already addressed the history of the Safe2Say Something program, so I would like to take this time to talk about how this program is saving lives. I want to underscore that, Mr. President, the program Safe2Say Something is saving lives. We have been successful in creating a program that gives schools and communities training to recognize people who may be a risk to hurt others, creating a direct outlet to save lives, and hopefully removing the fears of families sending their children to school every day. The Safe2Say Something program has also saved the lives of those who may hurt themselves and who may be experiencing bullying, engaging in self-harm, or suffering from depression, anxiety, suicidal thoughts, and other issues that require more care than we typically have provided.

We can continue to save lives through this program by taking the data collected and supporting services that help deal with the issues that children are facing. Pennsylvania's Safe2Say Something program has quickly become a national model. I will say that again, Mr. President, Pennsylvania's Safe2Say Something has quickly become a national model for protecting our schools and communities, and I am pleased that the legislation I introduced, along with Senator Browne and Senator Martin, is having such an immediate impact. I ask that you cast an affirmative vote, Mr. President, on this resolution designating the week of September 23 through 29, 2019, as Safe2Say Something Week in Pennsylvania.

I flew up in the air and crushed my spine at T12, popped up and crushed it again at L1, and like that, my life changed dramatically. There are more than 300,000 Americans living with spinal cord injuries, including 40,000 military veterans and thousands of Pennsylvanians. Every 48 minutes, another American becomes paralyzed from a spinal cord injury, meaning that there will be close to 12,000 new spinal cord injury patients in the United States this year.

This month gives us the opportunity to learn about spinal cord injuries, recognizes the daily challenges encountered by injured people, and acknowledges the achievements of those Americans living with spinal cord injuries. With this resolution, I hope to raise awareness for this issue, and to improve access to treatments for individuals with spinal cord injuries. Therefore, I ask that you please join me in recognizing September as "National Spinal Cord Injury Awareness Month" in the Commonwealth.

Senator TARTAGLIONE. Mr. President, I rise today to speak about a devastating problem that impacts every segment of society here in Pennsylvania. Throughout the nation and around the world, suicide has become more than a problem. It is an epidemic, and it is all too often a silent killer. It is the tenth-leading cause of death in the United States, more prevalent than liver disease, high blood pressure, or murder. Almost 47,000 Americans took their own lives in 2017. About 2,000 of those deaths occurred in Pennsylvania. Data for 2018 is not yet available, but the recent trends are very troubling. Those figures do not account for more than 1 million suicide attempts that occur each year, nor do they reveal the immeasurable harm endured by countless survivors, the relatives, friends, coworkers, and classmates of those who died by suicide.

Suicide impacts all walks of life, regardless of age, gender, race, religion, education, income, or sexuality, and the annual death toll continues to rise at an alarming pace. Since 1999, the national rate has grown by 30 percent; in Pennsylvania it is closer to 35 percent. Yet, we do not discuss suicide nearly enough. How often in our daily lives do we approach the subject of suicide on a truly personal level? Mr. President, as I just spoke

about the spinal cord injury that occurred 16 years ago, there were many times when I first received my spinal cord injury that I thought about suicide. It is by the grace of God that I am here. My hope is that "World Suicide Prevention Day" will inspire more public dialogue and more private, personal conversations about suicide. I hope that we will become more educated about risk factors and warning signs. I hope that our families, friends, coworkers, and classmates will learn to recognize when a loved one is in danger. I hope that the many troubled souls who are contemplating suicide will know where to find help and will feel empowered to seek it.

Please join me in recognizing World Suicide Prevention Day in the Commonwealth, and please remember, help is only a phone call away. If you or someone you know may be facing a crisis, call the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline at 1-800-273-TALK, that is 1-800-273-8255.

But here we are again, another September has come and I can tell you that cancer is still the leading cause of death from disease for those under the age of 15. Thousands of Pennsylvania children will go to the hospital this year because of cancer. These are the children of our neighbors, our friends, our children. But we are here again because we refuse to give up. We light the Capitol in gold to honor these children and their families. We introduce resolutions like this to keep the conversation alive so these children do not fall by the wayside.

Thanks to Act 73 of 2018, we now collect donations for pediatric cancer research when folks renew their driver's license or vehicle registration online. Over the last 2 years, Senate employ-

ees have collected nearly 30,000 soda can tabs and roughly 1,750 pounds of magazines to be donated to the Ronald McDonald House. On Wednesday, the Senate Committee on Finance and policy committees will hold a hearing on pediatric cancer research. I have also learned that on Wednesday the Pennsylvania Health Care Cost Containment Council will release a report on cancer hospitalizations for Pennsylvania children. We are making strides, but we have a long way to go, and there is more that we can do. I ask everyone in this room, this building, and everyone at home to join me and these children's families in fighting for these children so they do not have to fight for their lives alone. I truly look forward to the day when there is no longer a need for me to stand up here and offer this resolution.

A Resolution recognizing the month of September 2019 as "Prostate Cancer Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania and acknowledging the importance of raising public awareness of the threat and causes of prostate cancer.

On the question,
Will the Senate adopt the resolution?

The PRESIDENT. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Chester, Senator Dinniman.

Senator DINNIMAN. Mr. President, we have to realize that prostate cancer accounted for the largest percentage of all cancers diagnosed in men in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. We also need to realize that prostate cancer is the second-leading cause of cancer deaths of American men. In fact, a man dies in this nation from prostate cancer every 20 minutes, and we also have to understand that men whose fathers or brothers have prostate cancer are twice as likely to develop the disease, and that African American men are 60 percent more likely than Caucasian men to be diagnosed with prostate cancer and twice as likely to die from it. What I am trying to say, Mr. President, is that this is a very serious matter.

While it basically affects men over 50, though there are some younger men who are affected as well, we need to be aware of the signs of prostate cancer. I, myself, am a survivor of prostate cancer, and one of the ways that I was alerted was when my brother had prostate cancer and he called me and shared with me the statistic that fathers or brothers who have prostate cancer are twice as likely to develop the disease. Also, what we need to do is make clear what the symptoms can include. They can be difficult, frequent, or painful urination. They can be blood in the urine or semen, and pain in the back, hips, or pelvis that does not go away. Indeed, it is important for men to take care of their own

health. It is important for those in their family to urge them to do so. Just as it is important for women to be aware of breast cancer, ovarian cancer, and for men to be conscious of this and to help those women whom they love and care about, so women need to be as conscious of prostate cancer and to give equal care to the men and the sons and the relatives whom they care about, and together as a family, both men and women and children in this Commonwealth, can help each other. We can deal with the increase of cancer in terms of men and women and, as Senator Martin in his resolution said, the increase of cancer in children in this Commonwealth as well.

Hopefully, we will live to see the day when cancer will be no more. We have made great strides, but until that time, it is education and being alert to what symptoms are. Until that time, it is understanding the new technology and supporting the new efforts at research. Until that time, quite frankly, we have to help one another. We have to urge one another to be aware of symptoms and to also take care of ourselves. So, Mr. President, I hope we will adopt this resolution as part of the education that is necessary, and remember, it is the leading cause of death of men in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania today.

The PRESIDENT. The Chair recognizes the gentlewoman from Allegheny, Senator Iovino.

Senator IOVINO. Mr. President, "Teal Talk Day" recognizes those who have survived ovarian cancer, those currently living with and being treated for ovarian cancer, those who have lost their lives, and their caregivers. On this day it is important to set aside a moment and think about how ovarian cancer has impacted our lives and the lives of those around us. The statistics are startling, such as, according to the American Cancer Society, there is a 1 in 78 chance that at some point in her lifetime a woman will have ovarian cancer, and ovarian cancer ranks fifth in cancer deaths among American women, accounting for more deaths than any other cancer of the female reproductive system. There is also good news, though, and that is that early detection drastically improves survival rates for those with ovarian cancer.

Since 1975, the 5-year survival rate for those diagnosed has increased 16 percent, and the rate at which women are diagnosed with and dying from ovarian cancer, slowly, has been falling

over the last 20 years. Catching ovarian cancer in its earliest stages saves lives. Progress has been made, but there is still work to be done. That is why we wear teal today. By wearing teal we are encouraging people across Pennsylvania to talk openly with their healthcare providers, with their family members and friends about what puts them at risk for ovarian cancer and how to best stop this potentially fatal disease in its tracks. By creating dialogue about women's healthcare and the risk they face, we can create an environment that encourages women to take charge of their health and address problems before it is too late. I thank my colleagues for their support of September 23 as Teal Talk Day in Pennsylvania. Thank you.

PETITIONS AND REMONSTRANCES

The PRESIDENT. The Chair recognizes the gentlewoman from Philadelphia, Senator Tartaglione.

Senator TARTAGLIONE. Mr. President, as the Senate returns from its summer recess, I am confident that my colleagues are just as eager as I am to start working on solutions to the many problems that face our Commonwealth. Unfortunately, we have one very old and very important piece of business to address. It has now been 4,824 days since the Pennsylvania legislature last raised the minimum wage. That is more than 13 years, and it is far too long. A lot has happened around the State since we have gathered here. In my home city of Philadelphia, two major employers, Hahnemann University Hospital and the PES Refinery, closed their doors and left more than 4,000 of the region's workers without income, without severance, and without health insurance as they scramble to find new jobs.

Conversely, corporate leaders and investors stand to reap windfalls in both cases. At the refinery, senior executives pocketed \$4.5 million in bonuses as they ushered workers out the door and plotted a bankruptcy filing. At Hahnemann, they structured the hospital's asset so that they could hold on to valuable downtown real estate, even while liquidating everything inside the venerable building and leaving an entire community without a healthcare safety net. Granted, most of those who lost their jobs were earning well above \$12 an hour that my legislation, Senate Bill No. 12, would guarantee as a new minimum wage this year, or the \$15 an hour it would guarantee by 2025, but these instances highlight the vulnerabilities that confront Pennsylvania workers every day, even unionized workers.

In today's climate, with the economy still booming, with executive salaries and bonuses soaring, with worker wages stagnating despite historically low unemployment, and with the American middle class disappearing, we simply cannot rely on corporate benevolence to reverse rampant poverty. We cannot leave it up to companies to pay fair, family-sustaining wages. The current minimum wage, at just \$7.25 an hour, is not family sustaining,

and it is not a fair wage. I urge Senators on both sides of the aisle, as well as our counterparts in the House of Representatives, to address this bipartisan problem now, and insure that Pennsylvania's workers share in the economic prosperity that they create.

COMMUNICATION FROM THE GOVERNOR

SENATE BILL RETURNED WITHOUT APPROVAL

The PRESIDENT laid before the Senate the following veto communication in writing from His Excellency, the Governor of the Commonwealth, advising that the following Senate Bill had been returned without approval:

SB 48, entitled:

An Act amending the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), know as the Pennsylvania Election Code, in ballots, further providing for form of official election ballot and for number of ballots to be printed and specimen ballots; in voting machines, further providing for requirements of voting machines and for form of ballot labels on voting machines; in electronic voting systems, further providing for requirements of electronic voting systems, for forms and for election day procedures and the process of voting; providing for voting systems and for voting systems bonds; establishing the County Voting System Reimbursement Account; in preparation for and conduct of primaries and elections, further providing for instructions of voters and manner of voting in districts in which voting machines are used, for count and return of votes in districts in which ballots are used and for what ballots shall be counted, manner of counting and defective ballots; and, in voting by qualified absentee electors, further providing for date of application for absentee ballot, for approval of application for absentee ballot, for voting by absentee electors, for canvassing of official absentee ballots and for public records.

The Clerk read the veto message as follows:

TO THE HONORABLE SENATE OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA:

Pursuant to Article IV, Section 15 of the Pennsylvania Constitution, I am returning herewith, without my approval, Senate Bill 48, Printer's Number 1080.

Voting is what powers and sustains our democracy. I firmly believe that both I and the General Assembly have an obligation to strive to make voting more secure and more accessible to the citizens of this Commonwealth. Unfortunately, this legislation does not seek to increase voter participation in Pennsylvania. This failure is a missed opportunity to enact meaningful voting reforms.

This legislation, while purporting to secure elections, binds the hands of future administrations through a decertification procedure which weakens the ability of the Commonwealth and counties to quickly respond to flaws that would require the decertification of large numbers of machines fewer than 180 days before an election. This is not acceptable as a legislative measure.

Finally, this bill eliminates straight party ballot voting. This policy choice removes a convenient voting option which is used by voters of any party affiliation. To implement such a change, particularly as new machines are being used for the first time, could lead to voter confusion and longer lines at the polls. These factors may lead to decreased voter participation, which, again, is in conflict with an inclusive approach to our system of elections. I sought amendatory language at various points to include voter-friendly reforms in this legislation, but those changes were not accepted.

For the reasons set forth above, I must withhold my signature from Senate Bill 48, Printer's Number 1080.
