RE: Distribution of State Ethics Commission Rulings

On June 26, 1989, the revised Public Official and Employee Ethics Law was enacted which re-authorized the State Ethics Commission. The State Ethics Commission is responsible for issuing various types of rulings on matters within its mandated jurisdiction. Pursuant to the law, the Commission is mandated to forward, quarterly, a copy of every Opinion, Advice of Counsel, and Order issued to one law library in each county, one public library in each county, the State Library, the State Senate Library, each authority appointing a Commission member, the Pennsylvania Association of County Commissioners, the Pennsylvania Association of Boroughs, the Pennsylvania State Association of Township Supervisors, the Pennsylvania State Association of Township Commissioners, the Pennsylvania State School Boards Association, and the Pennsylvania League of Cities. Your agency is either specifically identified in the above requirement or has been selected as a library to which this mailing will be made pursuant to the above authority. As such, enclosed please find decisions of the State Ethics Commission from April 1, 2023, to June 30, 2023. Due to budgetary restraints, a CD containing said rulings will replace paper copies that were previously sent.

For your information, the Commission generally issues these types of decisions as follows:

<u>Commission Opinions</u> - Opinions are advisory rulings issued by the State Ethics Commission regarding the duties and responsibilities of public officials and employees under the Public Official and Employee Ethics Law. Opinions are catalogued by year of issuance followed by the sequential number of the opinion during that year. As such, opinions relating to 2023 will begin with the number 23-001 and proceed there from as decisions are rendered.

Advice of Counsel - The Commission's Chief Counsel is authorized to issue similar advisory letters. Such letters are issued generally when there is prior precedent for counsel to rely upon in issuing a decision or when the provisions of the State Ethics Act directly provide the answer to the question posed. Advice of Counsel letters are numbered with the year and a 500 series number that progresses in order therefrom as rulings are issued. If more than 100 such letters are issued, a 600 series number will then be used.

Orders - Commission orders are issued at the end of an investigation and are determinations as to whether or not there has been a violation of the State Ethics Act. Commission orders are categorized numerically from the date of the first order in 1979. That is, the first Order issued was Order No. 1. All orders proceed there from.

It is recommended that Opinions, Advices of Counsel and Orders be maintained separately (in numerical order) so as to afford better retrievability.

The enclosed items are being forwarded for retention, cataloging and for the purpose of being publicly available for review by citizens of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania who may have an interest therein. Additional mailings will be made on a quarterly basis henceforth. The PRESIDENT. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Allegheny, Senator Costa.

Senator COSTA. Mr. President, thank you for the opportunity to provide some short remarks with regard to what you just acknowledged, and that is the signing of House Bill No. 611. Today, we have taken a very important step towards providing a General Appropriation budget for the people of Pennsylvania, for every Pennsylvanian, and we are very pleased to be able to be implementing a plan that is going to allow for the payment of various programs across this Commonwealth. Folks--related to violence prevention programs, making certain we keep our courts running, human service providers; PHEAA grants to our students, our public school students, being able to receive the base funding that is so important, not only the basic ed funding, but the special education funding; public safety programs; and programs helping our senior citizens are all very important programs that because of today's action, and subsequent action later today by the Governor signing the budget, will allow that to take place. But we must recognize very clearly that we have a lot more work to do to be able to complete the budget. It has been referenced that this budget, the GA bill, House Bill No. 611, recognizes only 75 percent of the work that needs to be done, and we must have a path to complete the other 25 remaining percent to be able to do everything we--was intended with regard to this particular budget. There has been a lot of correspondence and a lot of rhetoric about what can be funded and what cannot be funded without a Fiscal Code. And my hope is that we can come together very quickly in an expeditious way to be able to bring all parties together, the four Caucuses and the administration, to be able to deliver for the people of Pennsylvania a Fiscal Code that implements many of the new things that are contained in this particular GA bill that we want to make sure get across the finish line and we can begin to implement across the Commonwealth.

That being said, there is some disagreement that we believe exists with regard to the nature of some of the things referenced in that 25 percent through those correspondences that I mentioned. Two jump out at me very clearly, and one is the Whole-Home Repairs Program, and another one is the Level Up funding program. We believe that those are two programs that, despite the contention, that they are part of that 25 percent that need a Fiscal Code. We do not believe that to be the case, and we believe that we should take every opportunity to ensure that we can take steps to be able to provide resources for those schools in that 100 category and those families that are looking to be able to get that support, and similarly the work that is being done in the Whole-Home Repairs space. As we speak today, homes are being repaired across this Commonwealth. We should not take any steps that are going to delay that continuation of the program, and therefore, we think it can be done without a Fiscal Code. But that

being said, those are the documents that we need to move forward. We stand ready to work with our colleagues on the other side of the aisle, the other side of the building, and the administration to be able to implement a Fiscal Code that is going to meet the needs of the budget. But also more importantly, implement the programs, those new programs, that are part of who we are and what we want Pennsylvania to look like.

Senator PITTMAN. Mr. President, I request the following memorandum be submitted and spread upon the record.

As you know, HB 611 is awaiting administrative action in the Senate before it can be delivered to the Governor's desk for enactment. The Office of the Budget stands ready to implement the provisions within HB 611 upon its ratification to ensure no further impacts to services or flow of expected funds are experienced. We recognize there are bipartisan priorities awaiting further legislative language, which our Administration fully expects the House and Senate to deliver to the Governor. Absent that legislative language, I will not release funding for certain programs including those listed below:

- Covid-Relief ARPA School Mental Health Grants
- Criminal Indigent Defense
- Emergency Medical Services Rate Increase
- Hospital and Health System Emergency Relief
- Level Up Supplement
- Teacher Stipends
- Whole Home Repair

In addition, there are other budget framework initiatives that require enabling language to implement in Fiscal Year 2023-2024. Examples of those include:

- Environmental School Facilities
- Any Increase in the Educational Improvement Tax Credit
- Rainy Day Transfer Amount

The PRESIDENT. The Chair recognizes, for a second time, the gentleman from Indiana, Senator Pittman.

Senator PITTMAN. Mr. President, the memorandum that I have just submitted for the record, to be clear, is unambiguous. The memorandum that I have submitted for the record indicates that House Bill No. 611, which now has been constitutionally assigned [sic] by the Presiding Officer of this Chamber as our Constitution indicates that it must be, continues on its voyage to the Governor for his signature. Now, we have all read what the

Governor says he intends to do relative to House Bill No. 611 and one particular provision known as the Pennsylvania Award for Student Success. I would be remiss if I did not implore one final time for the Governor to allow that line item to remain intact to allow funding to be secured and allocated for parents to be empowered to make decisions for their children. But, nevertheless, as the case may be when the voyage of House Bill No. 611 concludes at the Governor's desk, he will make his decision, and he will exercise his prerogative.

But the budget memo that I have put in front of this body from the budget secretary with the consent of the Governor, and also with the agreement and consent of our State treasurer, outlines specifically, unambiguously, and clearly those initiatives that have funding in House Bill No. 611 but will be sequestered until and if a Fiscal Code is implemented. At least \$430 million of proposed spending in House Bill No. 611 will not occur, and that is in black and white, and that is very clear.

I think it is important for the taxpayers of Pennsylvania to know that this is a good day for the taxpayers of Pennsylvania because the budget that is being sent to the Governor, even though it already was \$300 million below his proposal in February [sic], it was already well below the taxpayer bill of rights inflationary index, and when it already had presumed \$500 million of Rainy Day allocations, that those dollars actually now, the spending will be less. And without a Fiscal Code being implemented by September 30, the investment in the Rainy Day Fund will be more because our current statute clearly indicates that 10 percent of the end-of-year fund balance shall be allocated to the Rainy Day Fund on September 30 absent adjustments made in a Fiscal Code.

So, we have an opportunity, Mr. President, to further strengthen the fiscal stability of this Commonwealth as a result of the action today by sending House Bill No. 611 to the Governor, as well as his written commitment that these dollars will be sequestered. And I would be remiss, Mr. President, if I did not acknowledge how important this memorandum is in terms of legislative authority whenever it comes to spending taxpayer dollars. This memorandum makes it crystal clear that the legislature must act, that the legislature holds the power of the purse whenever it comes to determining how taxpayer dollars are spent. And as my friend from Allegheny County indicated, this is a significant step in providing a budget to the people of this Commonwealth. But there is the rest of the story, and the rest of the story is that this is a step, this is not a final completed product, this is not a final and complete process, and there is more work to do. And so, I think that this memorandum that is now part of our record is a significant moment in the history of the General Assembly, and in particular, in the history of the Senate of Pennsylvania.
