Reported by: Emily R. Clark, RPR CHAIRMAN DERMODY: At this time I would like to reconvene the April 22, 1994, meeting of the Subcommittee on Courts. The purpose of today's meeting is to have the Subcommittee recommend to the full Judiciary Committee the final report of the Subcommittee's investigation into the conduct of Supreme Court Justice Rolf Larsen.

Before we do, I would just like to take a moment once again to thank special counsel for the work, again, that they put into this investigation and this final report. As you can see, the final report is comprehensive. I'm sure you all have it.

We have Special Counsel David Moffitt here;
Clayton Undercofler and John Moses are not. And Charlie Gehy,
a professor at Widener, who has also been a help for us, is
present here today and has been intimately involved in
preparing this report. This has been an incredible amount of
work for them, an incredible amount of work for the
subcommittee, and we can't thank them enough for the hard work
and the dedication they've shown in preparing this report.

Representative Clark?

REPRESENTATIVE CLARK: Yes. I, too, would like to thank our special counsel as well as all the Judiciary counsel. This is a process and procedure which hasn't occurred in Pennsylvania since 1811, and there was a lot of hard work that went into setting up a procedure, a lot of

research that went into it, a lot of discussions surrounding 1 various decisions which we had to make, and it's been a very 2 3 meaningful and pleasurable experience for me to deal with such 4 good, honest, hard-working people such as Representative 5 Dermody and the special counsel who is appointed to help both 6 caucuses, as well as the rest of the members of this 7 subcommittee, and the staffs, both Republican and Democrats, 8 of the Judiciary Committee. 9 As I indicated here a few minutes ago, you know, 10 this is like we've all been thrown in 16 feet of water and we 11 don't know how to swim, and we need a lot of help. 12 need to help each other a lot to outline this and bring it to I certainly appreciate everyone's help and 13 consultation in getting us to this point. 14 15 CHAIRMAN DERMODY: Thank you, Representative Clark. 16 17 Is there a motion to recommend the final report to the full Judiciary Committee? 18 So moved. 19 REPRESENTATIVE CALTAGIRONE: 20 REPRESENTATIVE CLARK: Seconded, Mr. Chairman. 21 CHAIRMAN DERMODY: Are there any negative votes? 22 (No audible response.) CHAIRMAN DERMODY: Hearing none, the record will 23 reflect that the Subcommittee on Courts has unanimously voted 24 to recommend the final report of the Subcommittee's 25

investigation into the conduct of Justice of the Supreme Court Rolf Larsen to the full Judiciary Committee. I think this is a very significant step for the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania, a significant step to restore the integrity and the people's belief in our Supreme Court and our judicial system. Thank you very much. REPRESENTATIVE PICCOLA: Move we adjourn. CHAIRMAN DERMODY: The meeting is adjourned. (Whereupon, the hearing was concluded at 1:19 p.m.)
