Note: New York City: Pharmaceutical tests authorized - FDA approved clinical treatment protocols for HIV operated by medical center with prior review by Human Subjects Research Review Board. Inmates participate on the same basis as others in the same study.

Note: New York City: Pharmaceutical tests involved fewer than 10 inmates.

Note: Texas: Approximately 300 inmates involved in medical experiments, exact numbers not available at this time.
