

Testimony for the House Judiciary Committee of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

Pursuant to House Resolution 110

**Modernizing PACS, TITLE 45:
Augmenting Dissemination of Notice, Enhancing Local Autonomy,
and Reducing Fiscal Liability Through Legitimate Competition**

We respect the fact that Public Notices are essential to the representative democracy of our Commonwealth. They preserve the public's right to know, encourage the participation of responsible citizens and are vital to the administration of laws. Given their importance, we submit that they should be delivered to the largest audience possible, and at a price which reflects competitive market forces. Since this is not the current state of affairs, we propose to modernize the legal construct of "Newspaper" (PACS, Title 45) without undermining the legitimacy of the printed word, dated by edition, published and distributed at regular intervals to the community at large.

We are community papers of mass dissemination. We provide up to 100% distribution to the communities we serve, and are currently used by local government above and beyond their legal mandate to officially publish. We have a demonstrably active readership, and offer lower costs per thousand to advertise. Our papers represent nearly 2.3 million, 100% audited weekly copies distributed in Pennsylvania. (*see Exhibits H and I*) Given the intent to bring notice to the public at large, we embody the construct of Newspaper as a channel of dissemination.

Instead, however, we are denied the legal right to do for the Commonwealth what we effectively do for her citizens and businesses: Publish their information for the populace. We are restricted by language that requires a fixed price per copy of our papers and the eligibility for Second Class Mail status, but does not provide for audits, household counts, or in any way address the percentage of the population to be targeted for Public Notice.

Our industry seeks the right to “officially publish” legal advertising (PACS, Title 45). To this end, we urge this committee to endorse House Bill 2330, which: creates a separate definition under Title 45, Legal Notices, Chapter 1, which describes our free community papers. This language maintains the current description of Newspaper and omits all references to “free,” “must be paid,” and “Second Class Mail”. Additional provisions for audits and household penetration are also made. Use of our papers is described in Chapter 3 as a *discretionary alternative* to newspapers for official publication. (*see Exhibit A*)

To support our request for the modernizing of Title 45, we will examine the following issues:

- The Case of Maria Richard: Small Business Incorporates
- Market Coverage Comparisons: Community Papers v. Newspapers in sample communities
- Current Use of Community Papers by Local Government
- Readership: Modern Standards of Analysis
- Publications as Vendors: Accountability and Cost

I. Maria Richard Incorporates

Maria Richard owns and operates a small business in Sellersville, Pennsylvania. When she decided to incorporate her business within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, she investigated the process, services available and associated costs. She concluded that she would proceed on her own, using a computer instead of a lawyer. She downloaded the requisite forms and instructions from paopen4business.state.pa.us, and began to process them accordingly. (When she needed additional clarification, she contacted her local State Representative’s office, and received by fax the appropriate information.) Once incorporated, she followed the instructions relating to advertisement (*see Exhibit B*) obtained from the Commonwealth’s web site, and mailed her Legal Notice to our weekly publication, Penny Power. With the Legal Notice now on my desk, it became my civic duty to attempt to explain the logic and realities of Title 45, as I understand them, to the proprietor of a small

business earnestly attempting to comply with the words "shall advertise." I called Ms. Richard to inform her that although we would be willing to publish her ad, doing so would not fulfill her legal obligation. Her response was, "...you're kidding! You are joking, aren't you? You're serious....but everybody reads Penny Power....who reads the other papers?....The form says 'shall advertise,' and that's what I'm attempting to do...." I expressed my sincere empathy and explained that there was no official website I could direct her to where she could see Title 45 for herself. I then informed her that she could legally advertise in one of two regional dailies--one printing enough copies for 25% of the homes in her town, the other only 10%--or in an unaudited weekly of unknown circulation: The best option being the least expensive, since there is no mention of expected market coverage in the statute.

II. Market Coverage Comparisons

In the communities we serve, community papers of mass dissemination are the most accessible form of communication available: Virtually every home receives a copy. Our state-wide distribution, whether by US Mail or by carrier, is verifiable: Every Mid-Atlantic Community Papers Association member in Pennsylvania is independently audited by the Circulation Verification Council, (in addition to the United States Postal Service and other agencies). Furthermore, our distribution expands in direct proportion with local population.

In contrast, most newspapers in the communities we serve reach less than 50% of the households, including copies sold at stores and free-standing metal boxes. In many instances, the penetration factor is less than 25%. In fact, the overall circulation of paid newspapers has been on a steady decline for years, even as local population has increased. This trend is so dramatic that the oldest and most respected independent auditor of paid dailies, the Audit Bureau of Circulations, passed an historic measure at their annual board meeting last November: In an unprecedented measure termed "redefining print," media buyers and paid papers agreed to a new standard that defines newspapers sold at as little as 25% of their cover price as "paid circulation."

Newspapers leave their communities increasingly unnotified. We submit that this should not impede the flow of public notice to the citizens of the Commonwealth.

Attached are market coverage comparisons from sample communities that demonstrate the tremendous disparities in distribution (*see Exhibits C, D and E*).

III. Use by Local Government

Pennsylvania government, on all levels, currently uses community papers of mass dissemination to give notice to the public. From the Office of the Attorney General and the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources on the State level, to the Departments of Aging, Libraries, and the Counties themselves, and to the Boroughs and Townships, agencies of the Commonwealth use our papers to communicate information to our readers. The range of this vital information is too voluminous to cite here. Yet in many instances, the information we are asked to disseminate is official public notice: These government agencies have

already paid for publication in a newspaper, but subsequently pay our papers to ensure the notice reaches the mass populace. Government agencies in these instances are acting beyond the letter of the law in their earnest attempt to uphold the intent of the law. They are exercising their autonomy to fulfill the purpose behind their legal mandate to officially publish: to *inform* the public. Inherent in the act of a government body paying more than is legally necessary for statutory compliance is the recognition that newspapers do not reach the masses, and that our papers do.

We submit that local government knows its communities better than the state does, and therefore, as autonomous agents, should have the right to give better notice people most directly impacted by it. Government should have the legal right to use our papers to fulfill mandates requiring dissemination of information to the masses.

We provide examples of current use of our papers by government (*see Exhibit F*).

IV. Readership

It is often taken for granted that if there is a price printed on the cover of a publication, it is more likely to be read than a similar publication bearing no such price. We can find no credible empirical evidence to support this assumption, but Title 45 makes this assumption law. In doing so, it hinders the autonomy of local government, impedes the flow of notice due the public, and restricts the legitimate trade of the free paper industry.

We submit that there is a more critical, verifiable model to predict the likelihood that a publication will be read. We call it “usership,” the dynamic usage by the readers as evidenced in their measurable submissions. These submissions, which are requests for publication both *gratis* and paid, fill our pages: They are sent by citizens, community organizations and local businesses, and they include articles lost or found, fire company breakfasts, readings at the library, church services, articles for sale, articles sought for purchase and free kittens, as well as commercial advertising. They demonstrate an interaction between reader and the publication that is read. Their volume describes a community reliance, and their nature attests to a dynamic relationship with our papers (*see Exhibit G*). We are community bulletin boards, by the people, for the people. We assert, therefore, that people are very likely to read a publication they actively seek, and where they actively submit their announcements.

In contrast, the act of paying for a newspaper is most likely to occur in the form of subscription, since the majority of paid papers are distributed to subscribers than are purchased in stores and boxes. The process whereby most newspapers are purchased can be as active as mailing a check at the end of a six month billing cycle, or as passive as agreeing to the solicitation of an aggressive telemarketer offering special savings, days of the week free of charge, or calendar months of delivery at no additional cost. We contend that the act of buying a newspaper in this way is not a reliable indicator that it is more likely to be read than a paper distributed gratuitously, since a periodic financial transaction offers no evidence of intent to read a particular edition on a particular day of the week.

We conclude that there is no compelling argument to exclude community papers of mass dissemination from legally publishing legal advertising on the basis that we make our papers available gratuitously to every member of the communities we serve.

V. Publications as Vendors

Most laws, when adopted, hope to anticipate change. They attempt to use language that does not restrict them to the transient realities of the time and place in which they were adopted. Title 45 places preeminence on the historically-proven vehicle of the printed word, which carries the time-tested traditions of Johann Gutenberg and Benjamin Franklin, but would, at the same time, hold Martin Luther in contempt because his 95 Theses were posted and distributed gratuitously.

Title 45 recognizes the powerful role of the most prominent printed publications in bicentennial American Pennsylvania, but fails to embrace the potential for change in the publishing industry.

Rather than allow for the emergence of free community papers of mass dissemination, or the decline in the circulation of paid newspapers, Title 45 systematically negates all potential for the former while reinforcing in perpetuity the latter, with the deliberate use of “free” and “must be paid.”

With the criteria restrictively defined, and exclusive vendor status granted to paid papers, the Commonwealth and its citizens deserve the treatment of basic expectations of the vendor: a description of the actual service paid for. Given that paid papers are exclusively entrusted to publish information for the government, to the public at large, for a price, a contractor should expect reasonable knowledge of the following: An audited account of copies distributed, an expectation of the percentage of the population to be reached, and an idea of the cost incurred as it relates to either the number of copies distributed or as it relates to costs incurred by members of the economy at large. In the case of the Commonwealth’s relationship with papers with a printed cover price under Title 45, the monopoly created fails to provide for even this marginal accountability.

A simple analogy could be made by substituting “paper clips” for “officially publish”:

Pennsylvania mandates the purchasing of paper clips by all levels of government, and by certain citizens and businesses, under prevailing circumstances. The Commonwealth further mandates that the paper clips only be purchased from a store that has a special brass knob on its front door. Once inside the store, the obliged consumer finds boxes imprinted with the words “paper clips,” and in the place where the consumer would expect to read the quantity contained, the following word shall suffice: “Enough.” Satisfied with the legitimacy of the product, the obliged consumer looks for the price and finds a tag that reads: “See the clerk with the special hat behind the cash register.”

We submit that our twenty-first century Commonwealth should find these circumstances objectionable, and find immediate remedy in her existing publishing community.

Summary: It's all about communication.

The Commonwealth wants to communicate with her citizens to keep them informed and to invite them to participate in democracy. However, she finds herself communicating less and paying more for this process. It is time for her to look at her homegrown publishing industry and to hear the voices of her communities that rely on this industry. It is time for her to place her words legally where her citizens look for, and have the most access to, her information:

Community papers of mass dissemination.

AN ACT

1 Amending Title 45 (Legal Notices) of the Pennsylvania
2 Consolidated Statutes, adding a definition of "community
3 paper of mass dissemination"; and further providing for legal
4 advertising.
5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6 hereby enacts as follows:
7 Section 1. Section 101(a) of Title 45 of the Pennsylvania
8 Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a definition to read:
9 § 101. Definitions.
10 (a) Definitions applicable to printing or newspaper
11 advertising laws.--Subject to additional definitions contained
12 in subsequent provisions of this title which are applicable to
13 specific provisions of this title, the following words and
14 phrases when used in:
15 (1) this title; or
16 (2) any other law relating to printing or newspaper
17 advertising;
18 shall have, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise, the

3 "Community paper of mass dissemination."

4 (1) A printed paper or publication, bearing a title or
5 name, and conveying reading or pictorial intelligence of
6 passing events, local or general happenings, printing
7 regularly or irregularly editorial comment, announcements,
8 miscellaneous reading matter, commercial advertising,
9 classified advertising, legal advertising and other notices,
10 and which has been issued in numbers of four or more pages at
11 short intervals, either daily, twice or oftener each week, or
12 weekly, continuously during a period of at least six months,
13 or as the successor of such a printed paper or publication
14 issued during an immediate prior period of at least six
15 months, and which has been circulated and distributed from an
16 established place of business to the community at large.

17 (2) For purposes of this definition, continuous
18 publication shall not be deemed interrupted by any
19 involuntary suspension of publication resulting from loss,
20 destruction, failure or unavailability of operating
21 facilities, equipment or personnel from whatever cause, and
22 any community paper of mass distribution so affected shall
23 not be disqualified to publish official and legal advertising
24 in the event that publication is resumed within one week
25 after it again becomes possible.

3 Section 2. Title 45 is amended by adding a section to read:

- A. One original of this form is required. The form shall be completed in black or blue-black ink in order to permit reproduction. The filing fee for this form is \$100 made payable to the Department of State. PLEASE NOTE: A separate check is required for each form submitted.
- B. Under 15 Pa.C.S. § 135(c) (relating to addresses) an actual street or rural route box number must be used as an address, and the Department of State is required to refuse to receive or file any document that sets forth only a post office box address.
- C. The following, in addition to the filing fee, shall accompany this form:
- (1) Three copies of a completed form DSCB:15-134A (Docketing Statement).
 - (2) Any necessary copies of form DSCB:17.2 (Consent to Appropriation of Name) or form DSCB:17.3 (Consent to Use of Similar Name).
 - (3) Any necessary governmental approvals.
- D. For general instructions relating to the incorporation of business corporations see 19 Pa. Code Ch. 23 (relating to business corporations generally). These instructions relate to such matters as corporate name, stated purposes, term of existence, nonstock status, authorized share structure and related authority of the board of directors, inclusion of names of first directors in the Articles of Incorporation, optional provisions on cumulative voting for election of directors, etc.
- E. For required provisions in the Articles of a management corporation, see 15 Pa.C.S. '2703 (relating to additional contents of articles of management corporations).
- F. For restrictions on the stated purposes of professional corporations, see 15 Pa.C.S. '2903 (relating to formation of professional corporations).
- G. Articles for a nonprofit cooperative corporation should be filed on Form DSCB:15-7102B (Articles of Incorporation Nonprofit Cooperative Corporation).
- H. One or more corporations or natural persons of full age may incorporate a business corporation.
- I. 15 Pa.C.S. § 1307 (relating to advertisement) requires that the incorporators shall advertise their intention to file or the corporation shall advertise the filing of articles of incorporation. Proofs of publication of such advertising should not be submitted to, and will not be received by or filed in, the Department, but should be filed with the minutes of the corporation.

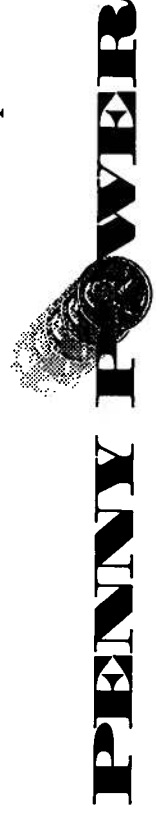

Applying for necessary dog license made easier

According to state law, all owners of dogs 3 months or older are required to get a new license each year by January 1st.

Recently it has become possible in this area to apply at locations in the county other than through the mail or at the county treasurer's office.

One obvious benefit to having a canine properly identified is the ability to quickly find a wandering Rover and return him to his rightful owner. Another is to avoid a stiff fine, as much as \$300 in some areas.

Dog license fees range from \$4 to \$8 depending on whether the dog has been spayed/neutered and also on the age of the owner - citizens 65 and over - get a price break.

The Franklin County Commissioners celebrate Earth Awareness Month with the announcement of new program and recognition of local recycling efforts.

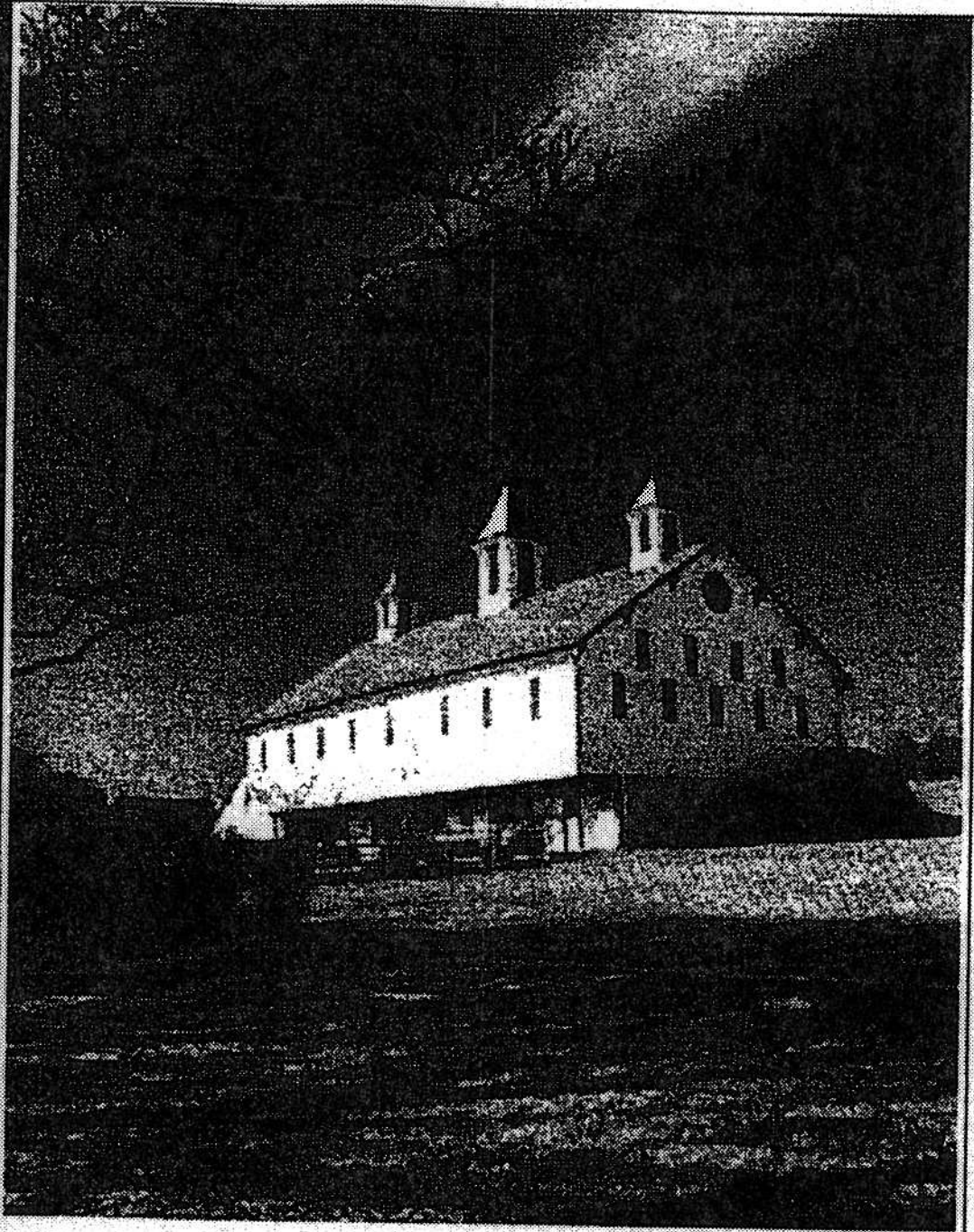

The Circulation Verification Council provides circulation audits and readership/market studies for over 1,700 paid & free community papers across the country. CVC recently completed an audit for member papers of Mid Atlantic Community Papers Association. MACPA represents free community papers throughout the Mid-Atlantic region with 58 member editions in Pennsylvania.

During the audit period July 1, 2001 through December 31, 2001 the average weekly Pennsylvania circulation was 2,272,628. Over 85% of the papers were delivered directly to reader's households via private carrier or US Mail.

During the audit process CVC interviewed 15,483 households in Pennsylvania to verify delivery of the papers. 15,062 households, or 97.3%, reported regular, consistent delivery of their community paper.

75.3% of households who received the paper, or 11,339 of 15,062, reported that they read the community paper on a regular basis.

81.5% of readers, or 9,244 of 11,339, report that they regularly purchase products and services from the ads they see in the paper.

Comparing the income, education, and age demographics of the free paper readers with those of the entire market shows that in all three categories free paper reader demographics virtually mirror the markets that they serve.

It is our opinion that the results compiled from the Pennsylvania circulation audit show that free papers have reliable distribution systems, are well read, and have significant influence with residents in the communities they serve.
