Re: House Bill 2369, P.N. 3435-Child Labor

Representative Steil:

There are inconsistencies between Federal and State law concerning placement of student learners in career and technical occupations and the time allowed to work. The Pennsylvania Cooperative Education Association (PCEA) believes that students that have the proper training and supervision should be allowed to be placed into the seventeen (17) Hazardous occupations safely.

Besides the training and supervision these student learners possess, we also include employer agreements which limit liability for our program. These precautions protect the student, the employer and the program while we train a much needed workforce in these seventeen (17) hazardous occupations.

The PCEA respectfully requests that the House Bill mentioned above includes language that 1. exempts student learners, including summer months, that are under the supervision of a Certificated Cooperative Education Instructor and have participated in the appropriate Career and Technical program, 2. maintains an eight (8) hour workday and forty-four (44) hour workweek.

Including this language would clean up the conflicts between federal and state law. It would make it easier for our employers to understand and therefore encourage more participation in

our successful program. I work with employers such as Bosch-Rexroth, Lehigh Heavy Forge Corp, B. Braun Medical, and West Side Hammer Electric. Losing these companies from our

program would make less qualified employees available for them and could lead to Pennsylvania losing these companies.

If you make this part of the referenced bill, it will make it easier to place trained students with employers in our program, which has been very successful at training our future workforce.
