## PENNSYLVANIA FILM TAX CREDIT

## Hello,

My name is Mary Jones and I am the Academic Dean for DuBois Business College. The College has three campuses, all in Pennsylvania: DuBois, Huntingdon, and Oil City.

I am here today to strongly support the Pennsylvania Film Tax Initiative. It acts as "seed money" by rewarding those companies and organizations who are willing to operate in Pennsylvania and therefore willing to pay taxes to increase the funds available for the state budget. The money in the budget is there to ensure that any applications for a tax rebate can be financially covered.

In addition, I would like to remind everyone that eliminating the film tax credit is not like, "in tough times, people need to stay home and save money by not going to the movies." Rather, the film industry provides employment for a wide variety and vast number of people: from caterers who provide meals to the crew, to the rental car companies, dry cleaners, etc.

DuBois Business College will celebrate its 125<sup>th</sup> anniversary next year. We have long been known for providing quality education that prepares students for success in a variety of careers. We now offer the John Russo Movie Making program which was recently approved by the Secretary of Education for the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to award an Associate in Specialized Business degree. Students have worked on films for entertainment and on many films that are used for edutainment as many organizations are now standardizing their training through films.
