House Insurance Committee March 18, 2010 Public Hearing House Bill 1865 (Burns) – Oncology Parity

Good morning and welcome to the House Insurance Committee's public hearing on House Bill 1865 – legislation sponsored by Representative Frank Burns. The legislation will help cancer patients by eliminating one of the issues facing them in selecting the treatment regimen that best fits their needs. Specifically the bill requires equalizing the patient's share of insurance costs no matter what form the treatment takes - whether it be intravenous or through pills.
